Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

A monthly carpet bowling event for people with memory loss and their carers has been undertaken at Corfe Mullen at a modest profit and we now support a second carpet bowling group in Corfe Castle. Both of these have stopped during this period in view of the pandemic

Weekly drop in sessions have been held at several local libraries and other public spaces with support groups for carers held regularly though this has stopped in view of the pandemic. We operate a telephone helpline for vulnerable people in the local community

We have overseen a poetry / reading group in Broadstone and a monthly tea dance. Both of these have stopped during this period in view of the pandemic

Moving forward it is anticipated that further good works will be mirrored within other communities in the Dorset area whenever it is safe to do so. We are renting some allotments for gardening groups which are

We ran an event at Poole Lighthouse where members of Bournemouth Symphony Orchestra played.

We have now absorbed dementia friendly groups in Broadstone, Corfe Castle, Blandford Forum, Ferndown and Wimborne. The Wimborne group continues to operate a separate bank account at HSBC but this is overseen by our Treasurer who receives the bank statements.

We have included the capital balances from all groups including the Wimborne group as income for the purposes of this return.

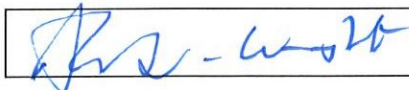
