Para 1.20	The charity's finances were boosted by an extremely generous donation from Mrs Ann Wyn Sherman (£50,000), enabling us to establish the Ann Wyn Sherman Research Award. We made a grant of £15,000 to Liverpool University. This enabled them to investigate causes of connective tissue disease in children and young people in understudied groups such as those with undifferentiated/overlap or scleroderma and to compare their findings to children who have definite lupus. The hope was that this increased understanding of what is causing and driving disease may allow earlier diagnosis and facilitate a targeted approach to treatment, improving outcomes for children and young people.

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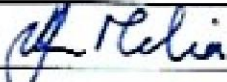

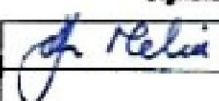
