Help Street Cats and Dogs is dedicated to reducing the population of street cats and dogs through targeted spay and neuter programmes, addressing the root cause of overpopulation and preventing future generations of animals being born into suffering.

We aim to improve the quality of life for vulnerable street animals by supporting neglected, abandoned, and abused cats and dogs through partnerships with trusted volunteers on the ground. Our activities include providing food, medical treatment, fostering and boarding support, and finding loving forever homes in the UK, USA, Canada, and Europe for animals that cannot survive on the streets.

We deliver our objectives through the following key activities:

Volunteer Support and Feeding Programmes

We support volunteers on the ground by providing funding and resources that enable them to feed, water, treat, and protect animals within their communities. Where possible, we purchase pet food directly and arrange delivery to volunteers caring for animals displaced into remote mountain and forest areas, where access to food is otherwise extremely limited.

Spay and Neuter Programmes

We actively organise, fund, and promote spay and neuter initiatives to reduce street animal populations humanely. Alongside practical intervention, we educate communities on the benefits of spaying and neutering and work closely with local veterinarians to support volunteers carrying out this vital work.

Veterinary Treatment and Welfare

We fund life-saving veterinary treatment for injured and ill cats and dogs. Animals taken into our care are tested for common diseases, vaccinated, wormed, and spayed or neutered where appropriate, ensuring both their welfare and the wider public health benefit.

Rescue and Rehoming

We rescue cats and dogs from neglect, abuse, cruelty, and abandonment, giving them a second chance at life through responsible rehoming. For animals unable to survive on the streets, particularly those with disabilities or chronic health conditions, we facilitate adoption through international rescue partnerships.

Public Benefit Statement

The Trustees have given careful consideration to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit and confirm that they have complied with its requirements.

Treating injured and sick street cats and dogs, reducing suffering and helping control the spread of disease through appropriate veterinary care and vaccination, benefiting both animal and human health.

Facilitating international adoptions, saving lives while raising awareness of the challenges faced by street animals and encouraging compassionate, responsible adoption.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

Objectives and Activities

The charity's primary objective is to improve the welfare of vulnerable street cats and dogs in Türkiye through feeding, veterinary care, spay and neuter programmes, shelter provision, and rehoming for animals unable to survive on the streets.

During the year, trustees continued to prioritise spaying and neutering as the only sustainable, long-term solution to reducing the number of unwanted animals being born into hardship. Alongside this preventative work, we focused on feeding programmes, medical treatment for injured and ill animals, and rescue and rehoming of those most at risk.

Activities and Achievements

Feeding and Daily Care

Throughout the year, we fed over 100 dogs across the province, covering a vast geographical area, as well as countless street cats. Pet food is purchased centrally and delivered directly to volunteers, ensuring consistent and reliable feeding. This remains one of the charity's core activities.

Shelter and Environmental Protection

We continued to build outdoor shelters to protect animals from extreme weather conditions and carried out maintenance and improvements on existing shelters to improve durability and safety.

Rescue and Rehoming

During the year, we took over 15 animals into our direct care for rehoming purposes. Two adoptions were particularly challenging:

A paralysed, doubly incontinent dog who required months of care before a suitable home was found.

Several cats with severe disabilities, including blindness and limb loss, who could not survive on the streets.

We continue to prioritise animals with disabilities or chronic health conditions for international rehoming. Through our partnership with a rescue organisation in San Francisco, these animals are rehabilitated and rehomed safely on our behalf.

Resources and Operational Challenges

Our rescue vehicle is ageing and now requires frequent maintenance. Given the extensive mileage covered to feed animals across remote areas, trustees recognise that replacing or upgrading this vehicle will become essential to ensure operational continuity.

Financial Review

Income

Approximately 60% of donations were received from supporters in the United Kingdom, with additional support coming from the United States and Canada. Public generosity remains vital to sustaining the charity's work.

Expenditure

The largest expenditure areas were veterinary costs, followed by transport and feeding, reflecting the charity's direct, hands-on approach to animal welfare.

Plans for the Future

Trustees intend to:

Continue prioritising spay and neuter programmes.

Maintain and expand feeding coverage in remote areas.

Improve and replace critical infrastructure, including the rescue vehicle.

Strengthen international rehoming partnerships.

Respond adaptively to evolving legal and welfare challenges in Türkiye.

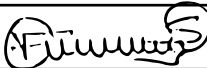

We are dedicated to reducing the street cat and dog population through our spay and neuter programmes to prevent unwanted cats and dogs of tomorrow.

We aim to transform the quality of life for street cats and dogs by helping neglected, abandoned and abused street cats and dogs via partnerships with on the ground volunteers providing food, medical treatment, fostering, boarding and finding loving forever homes in the UK, USA, Canada and Europe.

We achieve our mission by:

Volunteers - Support volunteers on the ground by making donations enabling them to provide food, water, treat and protect animals in their communities.

We also buy pet food online to be delivered directly to volunteers to feed animals dumped in the mountains and remote areas where animals are left to die of starvation.

Spay/Neuter - Actively promoting and organising spay and neuter to help reduce street animal population.

We educate and promote the benefits of spay and neuter to deal with the root cause of street animal population. We support and enable on the ground volunteers in their spay and neuter efforts by partnering with local veterinarians.

Treatment - Funding life saving treatment for the sick or injured cats and dogs. All animals that come into our care are tested for a variety of illnesses, vaccinated, wormed and spayed or neutered.

Adoptions - We rescue cats and dogs from neglect, abuse, cruelty, and abandonment, giving them a second chance at life by finding them loving homes.

The Trustees have given careful consideration to and complied with the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit.

We provide public benefit through:

Treating injured and sick street cats and dogs: This helps control the incidence and spread of disease and suffering through appropriate treatment and vaccination, benefiting both human and animal health.

Offering volunteering opportunities: We provide opportunities for those who wish to support our work, including people who feed cats and dogs on the ground, foster and adopt animals, organise spay and neuter programmes or organise transportation.

Supplying cat and dog food: We provide pet food supplies to those who wish to feed animals in their communities.

Promoting benefits of spaying and neutering in Turkey: We actively promote the benefits of spaying and neutering to help reduce street animal numbers in Turkey. We actively spay and neuter as many as we are able to.

International Adoptions: We actively encourage the adoption of street animals, not only to save lives but also to raise awareness about the

challenges faced by street cats and dogs. Our goal is to inspire prospective adopters to join our cause by connecting with one of the animals we've rescued.

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

In July 2024, a change in Turkish law removed legal protections for healthy street animals and the volunteers who care for them. This new legislation paved the way for government shelters to round up street animals. If not adopted within 30 days, these animals face euthanasia. Consequently, dogs in urban and residential areas have been captured, with their fate remaining uncertain. Dogs in remote areas, far from human populations, have largely avoided capture but now face the dire threat of starvation in isolated locations.

To address this crisis, we have been working to support these animals. We deliver food and make their environments more liveable by establishing feeding stations and water dispensers, ensuring consistent access to nourishment. Additionally, we have built shelters to shield them from extreme weather conditions.

Currently, we provide food and support to over 200 dogs and countless cats across the region. This requires our volunteers to travel significant distances regularly, ensuring these animals receive the care they need.

Our spay/neuter programme remains a cornerstone of our efforts to control the street animal population. We also provide veterinary care for injured and ill animals, alongside routine treatments such as deworming and parasite prevention.

Our rehoming initiatives focus on cats and dogs that cannot survive on the streets due to disabilities or special needs. We partner with a foster-based rescue in San Francisco to rehome cats with conditions such as blindness, neurological issues, or missing limbs. This year, we

successfully rehomed two blind cats and one with neurological challenges. In the UK, we have rehomed several dogs, including a tripod and another that underwent major hip replacement surgery. Due to the high costs of international adoption, we prioritise it for animals incapable of surviving on the streets. Instead, we focus our resources on sustainable solutions such as spay/neuter programmes, feeding hubs, outdoor shelters, and veterinary care. Rising costs in pet food, veterinary care, and transportation have posed significant challenges, compelling us to innovate and maximise the impact of our resources. Our volunteers perform much of the labour, including building shelters using reclaimed materials like metal and timber. This year, our three largest expenses were: Pet transportation – 32% of our spending, driven by the transport of three special-needs dogs from Turkey to the UK by road. Veterinary care – 26%. Pet food – 19%. The majority of our donations come from the UK and USA, with additional contributions from Canada. This year, we were also fortunate to receive a grant for special projects. We are incredibly grateful for the unwavering support of our donors, volunteers, fosters, and adopters. Without their support, none of our work would be possible. We remain committed to providing relief to street animals in need, making a tangible difference, and inspiring others to join us in this vital mission.

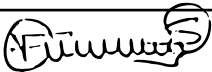

Section D

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

The province we cover was struck by a major earthquake in February 2023, where it claimed thousands of lives, both humans and animals. This has impacted our efforts to care for and protect the animals, as our operations were hampered by the loss of life in the area. We joined the earthquake relief efforts, delivering pet food using our own rescue vehicle to towns and villages where no relief was reaching due to heavy snow or unsafe roads. We've rescued countless cats and dogs stuck or abandoned in unsafe buildings, bringing them to safe locations and providing outdoor shelters and installed feeding stations. We still care for those earthquake victims.

Animals had a tough time finding food following the earthquake, especially in town or city centres. There were no bins or any leftover food from restaurants or shops. Veterinary clinics collapsed, resulting in closures - we lost experienced vets and specialist clinic equipment in the area. It took about a few months before we were able to normalise our operations.

Spaying and neutering efforts are always our top priority. However, this was also slowed by experienced vets leaving the area after the earthquake. Despite the challenges, we've managed to spay and neuter over 30 female dogs and 10 cats.

We are always looking for sustainable ways to provide care and protect the animals. As it's common for animals to be dumped in desolate places such as roadsides, fields or mountains, we locate these animals and

build feeding stations and water dispensers, distributing food on a regular basis. We provide veterinary care for those who need it.

We continue to strategically reduce international adoptions due to a lack of foster homes and the cost of preparing an animal for adoption abroad. Instead, we aim to use funds for spaying and neutering to help reduce the population and improve the animals' lives locally. However, we prioritise special needs animals for international adoption, such as blind, tripod or other conditions meaning they won't survive for long on the street. We adopted 5 animals, 4 to the USA and 1 in the UK, all of whom were special needs.

The rising cost of veterinary care, pet food, transportation, and boarding facilities means we are getting less for our money. Prices almost quadrupled in the last year. Sometimes, we have to ration the amount of food we distribute or supplement with appropriate leftover food from restaurants and shops.

We were able to secure two grants to provide emergency relief, treatment, medical supplies and food support for animals.

It has been a challenging year, and animals need support more than ever before. We continue to provide vital veterinary care, supply food, and help reduce the street animal population through our dedicated volunteers on the ground, who are making a huge difference and inspiring others to be compassionate towards animals.

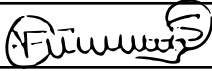

Although we spent more than our income during this financial period, the charity's overall financial position remains healthy, and our bank balance is positive. We continue to prioritise feeding hungry street animals, followed by providing urgent treatment to those injured or sick. Spaying of female cats and dogs is prioritised for effective population control.

We have strategically reduced adoptions abroad in favour of helping animals locally and supporting local volunteers in their efforts to create better living environments for the animals in their communities. We have successfully adopted over 5 cats in the USA and assisted our sister rescues in finding homes for cats in the UK. The ban on importing dogs to the USA and Canada remains in place, which has made it difficult to find homes for dogs.

Our rescue vehicle has been a tremendous help in reaching animals in remote places and distributing food. It has improved our ability to distribute food effectively and transport animals to and from veterinarians.

The cost of veterinary care and the rise in pet food prices continue to limit our ability to purchase more. At times, we have to ration the amount of food animals receive, but we supplement pet food with leftover collections from local restaurants and businesses.

Our shelters have proven to be very popular among dogs, providing protection from the elements and creating a hub for the animals. We have implemented a reliable water dispensing solution and feeders that ensure food is available at any time of the day. These feeders were built to minimise food wastage.

Overall, we continue to achieve our mission of helping street cats and dogs in Turkey, thanks to the support of our dedicated volunteers on the ground who are making a difference.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

We managed to just break even in the last financial period. Donations from the members of the public continued to decrease. This means having to prioritise how we use the funds in an effective and efficient way. In order of priority, food comes first as it's difficult to see hungry cat and dogs on the street, treating injured and sick ones to alleviate suffering and spay and neuter to help reduce street animal population.

In this period, we have homed 14 cats and 10 dogs in the UK, Europe, Canada and the USA. We give priority to those animals who would not survive in the streets for long, for example blind, missing limbs, deafness or those who have suffered horrendous cruelty or abuse and we want to give them a chance.

We have continued to focus on spay and neutering working with the local veterinarians. One of the highlights of the year was receiving a grant for £5,000 to purchase a vehicle to enable transportation of more dogs from and to vets. Having the vehicle also meant that we can reach areas no other charities go to - villages need the most help in terms of TNR and educating people about the benefits of spay and neutering. With that in mind we've targeted improvised communities mainly villages for our spay and neutering efforts. We've spayed and neutered - 21 females and 4 males cats, 30 female and 10 male dogs.

We prioritise female cats and dogs for effectiveness and cost efficiencies.

We've also fundraised to build more shelters for the dogs before the winter. We've purchased timber and ironmongery to build modular ourselves to save money on labour. These shelters can house up to 50 dogs especially when the whole region is hit with heavy snow and -10 degrees temperatures.

We also built feeding stations with covers on to prevent food getting wet or ruined as well as water tanks to supply water rather than having to transport on a regular basis.

The price rises for pet food, transportation and veterinary care costs in Turkey meant that we were getting less for our money. We are having to shop around more and asking restaurants and shops to donate their leftover food to feed the cats and dogs on the streets and those dumped in the mountains or roadside.

Despite the challenges, we are making a huge direct impact helping to alleviate suffering of street cats and dogs, spaying and neutering as many as we can to reduce population as well as educate people about the benefits of spay and neuter. The only long term solution is to prevent multiplication of animals in the first place.

We are incredibly lucky to have dedicated volunteers who go above and beyond helping us make difference to the lives of street cats and dogs.

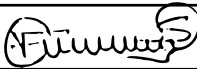
