Arcobaleno Cancer Trust Grants –

£5,000 was donated to Royal United Hospitals Bath, supporting their pioneering robotic-assisted surgery initiative with the Da Vinci Xi Robot

£5,000 was donated to ICR, further supporting innovative thyroid cancer research led by Dr Malin Pedersen. Her work with ex-vivo "mini-tumours" aims to refine drug sensitivity testing and treatment strategies, potentially transforming the approach to aggressive thyroid cancers. This project promises to improve patient outcomes and guide future clinical trial designs.

Siobhan's Superstar Legacy

During the financial period part of the SSL fund was used for the following grants leaving ACT with just over £115,000

£5,000 was donated to Action Medical Research, supporting a project led by Dr Antonis Poulipoulos to develop a gene therapy for children with diffuse midline glioma, a lethal brain tumor with no current treatment. Using ultrasound-guided nanoparticles for targeted drug delivery, this research aims to overcome the blood-brain barrier, offering hope for personalised and non-invasive treatment options.

£5,000 was donated to the extremely brave and beautiful Florentina Burton, who is fighting an ongoing battle with Neuroblastoma. It helped pay for her to receive innovative CAR-T therapy in Rome

£5,000 was received from the Bradley Lowery Foundation on behalf of Eden Eyre

The 2nd instalment of £28000 was donated to ICR for Dr Sally George's Neuroblastoma project. Next year the final £30000 will be paid

Arcobaleno Cancer Trust Easter Raffle

Due to the pandemic, this year's flagship event Race Night was cancelled so an online raffle was carried out raising **£6444**

Arcobaleno Cancer Trust Grants –

In June 2021 ACT donated **£29,500** to the Royal Marsden payable in two instalments. Half in 2021 and the other half in 2022. The money is for three projects. £10500 goes towards a Scalp Cooler Machine, a machine that helps to reduce hair loss during chemotherapy. £9000 is going towards a Medical Precision Tattoo Set, a new-to-market medical precision tattoo set which uses non-permanent tattoos to create 'tattoo dots' to ensure that the radiotherapy is targeted in the right place. £10,000 is going towards a Halo plus 3 software for AI pathology which is an imaging analysis package, that is used to identify cells and to count different types of cells within a patient's tumour.

In April 2021 ACT awarded **£5,000** to Spencer McCall, a young footballer who was diagnosed with Ewing's Sarcoma, a rare bone cancer. The money was granted to him to support him with alternative treatment costs due to the cancer having spread also to the lungs and chemotherapy no longer working. Sadly he passed away in July 2021.



Rainbow Challenges are physical endurance challenges for donors to participate in to raise money for the charity.



We also awarded **£3,000** to Leukemia and Myeloma Research UK for a project developing a free stem cell storage service to families at risk of cancer. The goal is to offer vulnerable families the opportunity to store their baby's cord blood for 25 years in case the other child, or any other family member, may require it for treatment in future.

In July 2020, **£4,744** was awarded to Dr. Annels' team at the University of Surrey to support research investigating immunotherapies for bladder cancer.

Completed our second woodland remembrance walk in Highgate woods raising awareness for Arcobaleno Cancer Trust and the work we are doing. We raised **£900.00**


