Arcobaleno Cancer Trust Race Night

Race Night is a charity gala night in support of The Royal Marsden Cancer Charity, and multiple ACT grants. The format is people betting on pre-recorded horse races and give a portion of the winnings to The Royal Marsden Cancer Charity. Aside from horse racing, we've introduced mushroom hunts, rainbow raffles, racing simulators, and more.

Arcobaleno Cancer Trust Grants

ACT grants are available to support groups and individuals affected by or working with cancer. Examples of funding could be for cancer treatment, relief of living expenses due to cancer, wish fulfilment or education. Individuals can apply for an ACT grant if they are receiving treatment for cancer or or are still seriously affected by their illness or treatment

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

Arcobaleno Cancer Trust Race Night 2022

Raised £ 43,500.39 for the charity where proceeds went to the Royal Marsden Charity to support the AI imaging and Pathology project. Trustees decided to increase the donation to £50,000 by using funds from Siobhan's Superstar Legacy. The funds would be invested into the Halo project conducting cutting-edge immunotherapy research. A plaque has been awarded to ACT at the Royal Marsden in Sutton in recognition of our support to this project

Arcobaleno Cancer Trust 10k Harrow

Over 100 participants took part completing the 10k course and raising over £7000

Arcobaleno Cancer Trust Rainbow Challenges

James Morgan ran the Brighton Marathon and raised over £1000
John & Danielle Murphy raised £705 taking part in London to Brighton bike ride in memory of Siobhan Mather

Poker Night

Our first face to face poker tournament which was attended by over 50 people and raising £2470

Arcobaleno Cancer Trust Grants –

In April 2022 ACT donated £5000 to the Royal Surrey County Hospital and University of Surrey to their bladder cancer research project

In July 2022 ACT donated £4646 to Wellbeing of Women for a 3-year project (June 2020-June 2023) to develop a risk prediction model for endometrial (womb) cancer

In August 2022 ACT donated £50,000 to the Royal Marsden. These were the proceeds from our headline Race Night event and the money went towards the AI Imaging and Pathology Laboratory

In October 2022 ACT donated £5000 to Professor Harrington at the Institute of Cancer Research to identify treatment strategies for thyroid cancer

Other donations and one-off fundraising events:

- Funeral donations: £1287.00

Siobhan's Superstar Legacy

In 2019 ACT awarded the Bradley Lowery Foundation to help further the chances of full recovery of two year old Siobhan Mather to travel to get a vaccine which was only available in America. Sadly in July 2019 Siobhan passed away. The relationship between ACT and the Mather family continued to grow and in 2021 Siobhan's Superstar Legacy was formed with ACT, with the aim of putting the money that was raised for Siobhan's treatment to good use, supporting other families dealing with childhood cancer and to support further cancer research particularly those cancers affecting children. In October 2021, the Bradley Lowery Foundation who the family previously raised the money with transferred £203,957.82 to ACT for this purpose. Of this amount £6500 has been used to date during this reporting year




