It is confirmed that the trustees have had regard to the Charity Commission's public benefit guidance when exercising any powers or duties to which the guidance is relevant.

The accounts show an increased level of income and expenditure in the 2022/23 year with the return of the Chesterfield Festival of Cricket, following the release of COVID restrictions. This in turn has meant that we were able to attract some new members and membership subscriptions have stayed relatively stable compared to the previous year.

We were very pleased to contribute towards a new irrigation system for Queen's Park at a cost of £2,500.

We were also able to, once again, produce our yearly publication which gives details of cricket news, past performances at Queen's Park, interviews as well as reports on the charity's activities for the year. We are very grateful to the advertisers who loyally continue to support the publication which means we are able to cover the costs of production making this cost neutral. We will continue to produce the Annual as it is an important strand of our heritage work.

Our bank balance at the end of April 2023 was healthy and the trustees have already identified projects to advance the charity objects over the year ahead.
