
We had seventeen of our riders compete in the RDA virtual championships .





Over the past year, Haworth RDA group has reached many people in the community, whilst offering respite care to the families and carers of our riders. This was achieved with the help of the Big Lottery Fund providing wages, and with our many volunteers and staff delivering fundraising activities each month, whilst still providing therapeutic lessons. The group has maintained a high-level profile in the local community enabling them to deliver their services, whilst reaching 28 community groups.

Since the COVID-19 pandemic, we have had to adjust the way the riding lessons were taking place and we have had some riders not return fully to their activities yet. This has caused a drop in rider numbers, but we are slowly increasing and are now making many of our lessons group lessons instead of individual lessons. 



The group has maintained a high-level profile in the local community enabling them to delivery their service, whilst reaching over 33 community groups each year.

During the Covid 19 pandemic income from therapy sessions was reduced due to the vulnerable nature of our participants. This had a negative impact on our total income. Due to intensive fundraising and the generosity of beneficiaries we did survive the pandemic and are now back to maximum capacity.




