Lions Clubs International is the largest service organisation in the world, and as such, Bridlington Lions Club are a part of it. Whilst much of the work we do is cantered around local needs, we also contribute to the Worldwide disaster appeals sent out by Lions Clubs International, this usually consists of £2000 allocated to the area of greatest need. We also support other disasters when asked.

Our work in the local community is enabled by a good fund-raising team who supply funds to help local individuals and groups with their needs. We have a Grants Appeal on our website which allows local people and groups to apply for help, both financially and other help,

For a number of years we have run a bookshop, but trade wasn't going too good and the time we were having to put in to keep the shop open did not support keeping it open however, we started a new venture by opening a Craft Emporium, we charge a rent for shelf, or wall space, a percentage from sales goes to the Lions club. Whilst supporting several local entrepreneurs, it offers a meeting place and acts as a service opportunity. The income is not great. But it is self-supporting. We continue with our annual fund raisers which include a Race the waves on the beach, our Annual Carnival, which includes car parking and Giant car boot. We also Have Eater eggs in 35 local pubs raising around £2000.

We made a few donations during the year supporting local causes, some of them were, supplying funds for winter feed for Riding for the disabled. We helped to raise funds for a Hospice which was match funded by Lions Clubs International, this raised £20,000, which was match funded to £40,000. We held a Dementia Awareness Day in the local shopping centre, which included promoting sight checks. We support many local youth organisations, including schools and colleges.

Whilst encouraging new members, like many other service organisations, the world is changing, volunteers are hard to come by, however we have a dedicated group of members who work hard to continue serving the public and hopefully bring some happiness to many.

Throughout the year the Club has maintained its commitment to the motto of Lions Clubs International of 'We Serve' by fundraising within the local community and distributing these funds mainly to local individuals, clubs and other organisations, and to fulfil its wider obligations. During the year, the club held its annual Carnival as well as continuing other money raising activities such as the Soft Toy tombola, Car boot sales, Santa dash, Christmas activities and its Charity bookshop. During the year, the club also claimed Gift Aid on donations successfully achieving more money for distribution.

Service efforts for the community included beach cleans, delivering food parcels to needy households, contributing to Humberside Police Lifestyle, collecting children's books for Sri Lanka and several other local needs which included planting tree saplings. One main event was holding a Diabetes awareness day in the local shopping centre and this was supported by local health groups and opticians.

We continued to support both national and international projects which all Lions Clubs are involved with covering disasters around the world as well as sending special donations to national appeals. We sent donations to help the people of Ukraine to help fund generators and wood burning stoves. We also sent a donation to support extensions at Martin House children's hospice which was match funded by our local District.

However, much of our fundraising helps us to respond to local appeals through our grant application procedures. We have contributed to the provision of hay for the local Riding for the Disabled ponies, funding for transport costs for a local young squash player to attend training sessions at national centres, improved facilities at Raywell, the local scout and guide centre, a large donation to Yorkshire Air Ambulance in support of a bereaved club colleague, equipment for East Coast majorettes, support for local rural transport and several other clubs and local organisations. Twice a month, regular club meetings were held and the decisions taken on making grants were based on a close scrutiny of applications and discussion. Each meeting has had a quorum of trustees present.

As a voluntary organisation, we strive to gain new members and make every effort to attract suitable people. We advertise regularly on our Facebook page and on our website and leaflets are available in the bookshop. We have gained two new members during the year with several others showing interest. We currently have a group of active members in the club who are dedicated to continuing our charitable work into the coming year.

During the year, the club also started claiming Gift Aid on donations successfully achieving back money over several years.

Our service efforts for the community included beach cleans, delivering food parcels to needy households, contributing to Humberside Police Lifestyle, collecting children's books for Sri Lanka and several other local needs. We planted bulbs linked in with local college students, provided fish and chip suppers for members of Doncaster Mencap and responded to requests from the public via our website and Facebook pages. 

As the effects of the Covid pandemic subsided, the club held its annual Carnival as well as resuming other money raising activities such as the Soft Toy tombola, car boot sales, Christmas activities and its charity bookshop. Our service to the community included beach cleans, funding a community garden, tree and bulb planting linked in with students from the local college and responding to requests from the public via our website and Facebook pages.

We continued to support both national and international projects which all Lions Clubs are involved with covering disasters around the world as well as sending donations to Water Aid, Sight Savers, World Child Cancer and Ukraine, together with more local needs such as Humberside Police Lifestyle,

The majority of our work is to respond to local appeals through our grant application procedures. Areas which have been covered are numerous but include the following: 10th Priory Guides, transport to Cliff House nursery, local air cadets and hay for the local Riding for the Disabled ponies.

Bi-monthly meetings have been held on a regular basis and the decisions taken were based on close scrutiny of applications and discussion. Each meeting has had a quorum of trustees present.

Trustees Annual Report 2020-2021

Throughout the year, the Club maintained its commitment to the motto of Lions Clubs International of 'We Serve', by fundraising within the local community and distributing these funds mainly to local individuals, clubs and other organisations. However, like many other Charities, this fundraising was severely curtailed by the restrictions and lockdowns caused by the Covid virus. The Club failed to hold its Carnival, its principal money raising project, and a number of other regular events had to be cancelled. It was not until the early part of 2021 that plans could be made to boost our finances. The club did benefit from two grants issued by the East Riding of Yorkshire Council on behalf of the Government to cover losses due to the lockdown. These Local Restriction Support Grants came as a result of the enforced closure of our charity bookshop over a number of months.

We continued to support both national and international projects which all Lions Clubs are involved with covering disasters around the world and also Water Aid, Sight Savers and World Child Cancer. But the majority of our work is to respond to local appeals through our grant application procedures. But because of Covid restrictions, very few applications were received which possibly was of some benefit in view of our lack of fundraising ability. Whenever lockdown was in operation, we held zoom meetings on a regular basis and decisions that were taken were based on close scrutiny of applications and discussion. Each meeting has had a quorum of trustees present.

As a voluntary organisation, we continue to find it difficult to recruit new members but we continue to make every effort to attract suitable people. Our numbers have been stable over the year. We currently have a group of members in the club who are dedicated to continue our charitable work over the coming year.
