The trustees present their report and the unaudited Accounts of the charity for the year ended 30 June 2021.

REFERENCE AND ADMINISTRATIVE DETAILS

Reference and administrative details are shown in the schedule of charity information on page 1 of the accounts.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

The Charity is a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (foundation model) and is governed by the constitution adopted on 23 March 2015.

Every trustee must be appointed for a term of three years by a resolution passed at a properly convened meeting of the charity trustees. In selecting individuals for appointment as charity trustees, the charity trustees must have regard to the skills, knowledge and experience needed for the effective administration of the CIO.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The objects of the club are such purposes as are exclusively charitable in England & Wales, including in particular:

The advancement of citizenship by:

- (a) Promoting the principles of good citizenship.
- (b) Encouraging members to take an active interest in the civic, cultural, social and moral welfare of the community.
- (c) Providing a forum for the open discussion of all matters of public interest, provided that partisan politics and sectarian religion shall not be debated by members.
- (d) Encouraging service-minded people to serve their community without personal reward and encouraging the promotion of high ethical standards in commerce, industry, professions, public works and private endeavours.
- (e) Supporting youth to develop their skills, capacities and capabilities to enable them to participate in society as mature and responsible individuals.
- (f) Promoting the voluntary sector for the public benefit by associating with local authorities in a common effort to advance education and provide facilities in the interest of social welfare for recreation or other leisure time occupation to improve the conditions of life of people in local, national and international communities.
- (g) Promoting volunteering.
- (h) The relief of poverty and the relief of those in need in particular by providing humanitarian aid and disaster relief.
- (i) The advancement of health or the saving of lives by preventing avoidable blindness, assisting disabled people to lead independent lives or helping to prevent or manage health issues.
- (j) Promoting for the benefit of the public the conversation protection and improvement of the physical and natural environment; and/or
- (k) Promoting community participation in healthy recreation.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

The financial year started with continuing pandemic restrictions in place which put paid to a number of face to face activities taking place eg:-

- October's Inter-pub Quiz
- December's Santa's sleigh
- South Milford Santa Dash

Club meetings were held via Zoom but our inability to raise charitable funds limited our opportunities to support causes which we normally help.

We took the opportunity to run the Easter Egg Raffle online and were able to raise approx. £500 to share across the chosen charities.

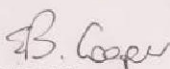

FINANCIAL REVIEW

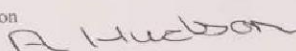
This year saw us husbanding our resources, taking into account the much lower level of charity income during the pandemic restrictions.

As the charity's trustees of Elmet Lions Club you are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the requirements of the Charities Act 2011 ('the Act').

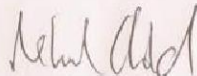
