**Background:**

The Wave of Peace (WAVE) is a volunteer-led charitable organisation dedicated to advancing and promoting human rights. Founded in 2016 by Shaimaa Mohamed Hassan, WAVE was officially registered as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO) in 2018. The charity's purpose is to advance human rights and promote peace, social justice, and human dignity through education, advocacy, and community engagement.

The charity is governed by a Board of Trustees, all of whom serve on a voluntary basis and receive no remuneration or financial benefit from the organisation. The trustees confirm that the Annual Report and Financial Statements for the year ending 1 April 2025 have been prepared in accordance with the CIO's governing document and the Statement of Recommended Practice and comply fully with Charity Commission requirements.

#### Arabic–English Language and Cultural Exchange

Weekly Arabic–English Language and Cultural Exchange sessions continued to take place every Wednesday in an inclusive, safe, and welcoming environment. These sessions brought together individuals from diverse backgrounds, fostering meaningful dialogue, promoting cultural understanding, and strengthening community cohesion while ensuring that all participants felt valued and respected.

#### International Human Rights Awareness Activities

Throughout the year, WAVE organised a range of events and activities to mark key international human rights dates, including International Human Rights Day, International Women's Day, and the International Day for the Elimination of Racial Discrimination. These initiatives aimed not only to

commemorate these important occasions but also to empower individuals and communities to challenge discrimination, promote equality, and engage with human rights issues at both local and global levels.

#### Promoting Equality Through Local Engagement

Wave of Peace (WAVE) promotes equality and human rights through active engagement with local communities and community-led networks. A key example of this work is WAVE's representation on the Equality and Human Rights Panel (EHRP), alongside other Voluntary and Community Sector organisations in the London Borough of Southwark.

Through its participation on the Panel, WAVE contributes to discussions, reviews, and the provision of constructive feedback and recommendations on community-relevant equality initiatives and frameworks, including the Southwark Equality Framework (SEF) and the Southwark Stands Together (SST) programme. Throughout the year, WAVE trustees and volunteers remained dedicated to fulfilling the charity's objectives and addressing the needs of its beneficiaries. Their efforts were focused on raising awareness of human rights issues, promoting public support for human rights, and supporting communities affected by conflict, displacement, and human rights violations.

Some of the events and activities delivered include:

The WAVE team organised an event at the University of East London (UEL) in May 2023 to raise awareness about the conflict in Afghanistan, with a particular focus on violence against women and girls, as well as the broader human rights challenges faced by Afghan refugees. The event featured an engaging and thought-provoking program that combined participants discussions and creative expressions to shed light on the struggles and resilience of the Afghan people. A key highlight was a powerful collection of poetry and short stories that captured the lived experiences of Afghans from the post-2001 era to the present day. These literary pieces offered a deeply moving and personal perspective on conflict, displacement, and the quest for justice, amplifying the voices of those who are often unheard.

By bringing together academics, activists, students, and members of the Afghan community, the event fostered meaningful dialogue, encouraged solidarity, and reinforced the urgent need for continued advocacy and support for Afghan refugees and human rights defenders. Through this initiative, WAVE reaffirmed its commitment to raising awareness, educating the public, and inspiring action in support of those affected by conflict and human rights violations.

WAVE is represented on the Equality and Human Rights Panel (EHRP), which includes members from various Voluntary and Community Sector Organisations operating in the borough of Southwark. The panel plays a crucial role in reviewing and providing constructive feedback on Equality Analysis documents prepared by the council. It also offers insights and recommendations to support the

council in meeting its obligations under the Public Sector Equality Duty, ensuring more inclusive and equitable decision-making.

The Arabic-English Language and Cultural Exchange weekly sessions continued to take place every Wednesday in an inclusive and welcoming environment, ensuring that everyone feels valued and respected. These sessions bring together individuals from diverse backgrounds, fostering meaningful dialogue, promoting cultural understanding, and strengthening community cohesion.

Throughout the year, the WAVE team organised a series of impactful activities to celebrate significant international human rights events, including International Human Rights Day, International Women's Day, and the International Day for the Elimination of Racial Discrimination. 

Despite the challenges faced by the charity due to Covid-19 pandemic and the lockdowns WAVE trustees and volunteers continued to work to meet the charity's objectives and the need of beneficiaries. Trustees Followed the good practice guidance to run the charity effectively and comply with the legal duties.

WAVE team and volunteers adapted working practices to address new circumstances including delivering more services remotely, delivering online sessions and workshops, collaborating more with other local charities and community groups.

Unfortunately, due to coronavirus lockdowns and restrictions we had to postpone our face-to-face activities including Arabic English Language and Cultural Exchange weekly sessions. However, we responded by making greater use of technology and changed the way of the operations by delivering our sessions online.

WAVE team worked to support women and young people from BAME community who have experienced anti-Muslim hate, racism and discrimination, and collaborated with Tell Mama and other similarly focused organisations.

On August 2020, WAVE team organised Eid Picnic event to celebrate cultural diversity, and to promote mutual respect and understanding. WAVE volunteers worked in collaboration with community groups in Bankside and around Southwark. Covid-19 safety measures were in place. The event brought together people of different faiths and beliefs, and provided the opportunity to people who were not travel to celebrate Eid with their families.

WAVE team and volunteers organised a number of online events, and activities to educate the public and raise awareness of human rights issues including online sessions on COVID-19 and Human Rights.
