TRUSTEES' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 AUGUST 2025

The Trustees present their report and financial statements as a charitable incorporated organisation (CIO) for the year ended 31 August 2025.

Five Year 13 pupils (2025 cohort) completed the TTT programme with tuition delivered by “Enjoy Education”. All five qualify for Free School Meals. Their A Level results and University destinations are listed below. Some of these results are not quite as positive as in previous years.

In the case of Pupils 4 and 5 there is some context to this in that there were serious challenges at home.

The next cohort of five pupils (2026 cohort) commenced the programme in March 2025 and made a promising start to Year 13 (their A Level exam year) this academic year (2025/2026). Their Year 12 exam results sat in June 2025 are listed below. They will be supported with their university applications by TTT/EE and several are applying for Oxbridge.

The programme worked the same as in previous years with each pupil receiving one hour tuition per subject per week including during the holidays. In addition, pupils receive online mentoring to support their university applications. This includes support with personal statements and ‘mock interviews’. TTT provides interview support to a further five COLA-S pupils outside the tuition programme.

Pupils continue to be very positive about the benefits of the programme particularly the opportunity to study subjects in depth and beyond the confines of the syllabus. COLA-S and TTT receive regular reports from the tutors on each pupil and outline how positively the pupils are engaging with the tutoring.

All this could not be possible without the generous and consistent grants from the Emmott Foundation and The Horlock Education Trust for which COLA-S, EE and TTT are very grateful.

The programme will be repeated in the 2026/2027 academic year with the selection of five Year 12 pupils in March 2026 (2027 cohort) as the necessary finance has been raised.

TRUSTEES' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 AUGUST 2024

The Trustees present their report and financial statements as a charitable incorporated organisation (CIO) for the year ended 31 August 2024.

We were delighted to see our students' exceptional A-level results in August. This year's outcomes are our best yet, with many students securing top grades and places at highly regarded universities. We are proud of their achievements and look forward to their continued success.

Our Year 13 students maintained their academic momentum over the summer with fortnightly tuition sessions. Now that the new term has begun, they are benefitting from weekly support. We are currently working with 5 COLA-S pupils and have launched a new mentoring scheme in partnership with Enjoy Education. This scheme offers valuable guidance on university applications and other important aspects of their academic journey.

This term has presented significant challenges in communicating with students. Many have not responded to emails from both us and their tutors. Despite discussions with the school, there has been limited improvement. This has hindered our ability to support students, particularly with crucial university applications. However, we have been able to effectively assist those who have maintained communication.

Additionally, attendance issues have persisted. We are actively working with the school to reinforce the importance of full attendance, a fundamental requirement of the scholarship. In past years, we have held meetings to address attendance concerns, but the current communication difficulties have made this approach impractical.

Summary

There are some good grades achieved, but overall there is room for improvement for all students. D has shown significant improvement in biology and chemistry since the end of Year 12. While the school is working with all students to promote positive progress, E's performance is a primary concern.

It has come to our attention that some students did not attend all tuition sessions during their recent exams. This is a significant concern, as regular attendance is crucial for academic success.

To ensure optimal preparation for the upcoming mock exams, we advised students to attend all scheduled tuition sessions. These sessions provide valuable opportunities to practice exam techniques, and consolidate knowledge. By fully utilising these resources, students can effectively address any gaps in their revision and significantly improve their performance.

Over the summer, our students actively sought out opportunities to enhance their university applications. They secured internships at renowned companies such as PwC and KPMG, gaining valuable industry experience. We continued to support them throughout the process, providing guidance on personal statements and assisting with searching for further opportunities.

Looking Forward

With many of our Year 13 students now focused on completing their UCAS applications, we are turning our attention to preparing them for their crucial summer exams. In parallel, we are actively recruiting our next cohort of talented Year 12 students. Interviews for these positions will take place in early January, and we look forward to welcoming a new group of motivated pupils.







The Trustees present their report and financial statements as a charitable incorporated organisation (CIO) for the year ended 31 August 2022.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Aims & Objectives

TTT (Tutoring to Thrive) is a relatively new charity, formed in 2018. Our objective is to level the playing field for students from deprived areas who haven't had access to the support afforded to those in private education.

Our charitable programme ensures that bright students are given the opportunities and tools that they need to achieve brilliant A Level results, and to gain admission to the UK's "Golden Triangle Universities", as well as to provide them with the skills that enable them to succeed once there.

Main activities for achieving objectives

The Trust carries out these objects by:

- Offering intensive small group tuition to pupils in years 10-13 designated by Ark schools as having 'high pre-assessed ability' to achieve outstanding GCSE and A Level results, with a view to gaining admission to elite and prestigious Universities in the United Kingdom and United States;
- Awarding to such person's scholarships, maintenance allowances or grants tenable at any University, College or Institution of Higher or Further Education

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

We have established proof of concept over the past four years, providing high quality private tuition in situ to the most able sixth form pupils in Inner-City London schools. Four cohorts drawn from two schools - Ark Globe Academy and City of London Academy, Southwark (COLA-S), with 60% and 48% of pupils on the free school meals scheme, respectively - have participated in our programme to date.

From the three cohorts that have graduated from the programme so far, an overwhelming majority gained admission to Russell Group universities, of which 19% have gone on to study at Oxford or Cambridge, and 26% have taken up offers from LSE, Imperial, UCL and KCL, with a high proportion reading STEM subjects across the board.

The ways in which we support our students to fulfil their potential and exceed expectations led to a 76% attainment of A* and A grades in final examinations last year, and we have no doubt that our current and future cohorts will continue this trend.

Programme Details and Partnerships

The programme has a 'built in' partnership with other likeminded organisations to make sure that we give our students everything that they need to excel. Through Enjoy Education, an award-winning tuition company, our Delivery Officer, Sarah Peters-Harrison - a first class Cambridge Graduate herself - ensures that our students receive tuition in all their subjects on a weekly basis.

Tuition not only ensures that students are able to perform at the highest academic level, but that they are supported in exploring their subjects beyond the bounds of the syllabus. Indeed, to ensure that our students shine through in the highly competitive admissions process for the UK's top universities, our tutors hold Personal Statement workshops, and support students to complete an Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) or Personal Research Project (PRP).

EPQs and PRPs encourage students to delve into topics that really interest them, whilst learning key research methods and extended writing techniques. For those applying to Oxbridge, these projects also provide the perfect basis for conversations at interview, and we further support students by providing mock interviews at the Silk Street offices of Linklaters each year, conducted by Oxbridge specialists.

In addition, the pupils attend residential conferences at Canford School in Dorset, where they are given further advice on preparing for university, exposure to emerging careers, and the opportunity to spend time with pupils from a variety of different schools. Students are also given the opportunity to draw on funds from TTT in order to attend similar events held at universities over the summer break, and to travel to work experience placements.

TTT Trustees are delighted that, as of summer 2022, Dr. Margaret Coombe, a Fellow of Lady Margaret Hall, Oxford University, and former Director of the Oxford University Skills Centre, has joined TTT as an advisor. Dr. Coombe provides tailored guidance to our students, and information on what is really involved in applying to and studying at a top university.

In these ways, pupils are encouraged in and supported to meet their aspirations but are not removed from their Inner-City surroundings. The schools therefore retain their most able pupils, who serve both as role models and provide academic support to younger pupils and peers.

Inspiring Feedback

We have had wonderful feedback on the programme from the schools, parents, tutors, and, most importantly, the students themselves, including:

"It is exciting to be part of a totally new experience where I am being encouraged to delve deeper into topics that I am passionate about. The one-to-one support I have received from inspiring tutors has been amazing." - Mayowa

I was provided with tutors for each of my subjects who were able to support me with any queries or issues I had when learning throughout such a disruptive time. As a result, I could also explore topics outside of the syllabus which enabled me to gain a more in depth understanding of my subjects. Furthermore, the mock interviews provided also helped to build my exposure to the atmosphere of a real university interview and made me feel much more comfortable with the whole process. Through these opportunities, I have been able to develop a rapport with my tutors and push myself academically." - Di'Mario

The cost of the programme is £5,500 per pupil, including five terms of intensive tuition, all mentoring and workshops, and travel costs for conferences, work experience and university visits.

To date, £192,250 has been raised or committed to fund the 27 students who have graduated from the programme, and the ten pupils due to graduate in 2023.

The trustees take no expenses and pay for all administration, bank charges, and accounting fees for Charity Commission filing.

Thus, most unusually, the whole of our donors' contributions goes toward supporting TTT's students, and this will continue.

TRUSTEES' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 AUGUST 2021

The Trustees present their report and financial statements as a charitable incorporated organisation (CIO) for the year ended 31 August 2021.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Aims & Objectives

The objects of the Charity are, for the public benefit, to advance the education of pupils under the age of 19 enrolled in Academy schools run by the Ark Multi Academy Trust in such ways as the Charity Trustees think fit.

Main activities for achieving objectives

The Trust carries out these objects by:

- Offering intensive small group tuition to pupils in years 10-13 designated by Ark schools as having 'high pre-assessed ability' to achieve outstanding GCSE and A Level results, with a view to gaining admission to elite and prestigious Universities in the United Kingdom and United States;
- Awarding to such person's scholarships, maintenance allowances or grants tenable at any University, College or Institution of Higher or Further Education

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

The 2020/2021 year was adversely affected by the Pandemic.

Tuition was interrupted and virtual learning was difficult given the accommodation of the pupils. Furthermore, the pupils have been disadvantaged by not sitting GCSE Public Examinations.

However, the charity raised enough money in October and November to expand the programme to 14 pupils with 5 attending ARK Globe and 9 City of London Academy (Southwark)-COLA-S- based in Bermondsey.

Tuition via teachers employed by 'Enjoy Education' commenced in January 2021 at COLA-S and March 2021 at ARK Globe and has operated fairly smoothly despite the lockdowns.

No physical residential exchanges could take place at Canford but a virtual one-day conference was held in June 2021 advising on preparing UCAS applications, interview technique and "emerging careers". This was attended by all 14 TTT pupils and was adjudged both helpful and very successful.

Despite all the interruptions morale is high and tutors are hopeful that the A Levels will be successful when sat in June 2022

FINANCIAL REVIEW AND GOING CONCERN

The results for the year were in line with the Trustees expectations.

In particular they have had regard to information from forecasts for income, expenditure and cash-flow, including the availability of unrestricted funds and reserves.

PLANS FOR THE FUTURE


The Charity plans to continue its activities for the foreseeable future.



NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 AUGUST 2021

1. Accounting policies

1.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention with items recognised at cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant note(s) to these accounts.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) issued on the 16 July 2014 and with the Charities Act 2011.

1.2 Accounting policies

The accounts present a true and fair view and the accounting policies adopted are those outlined in note (1.1).

1.3 Fund accounting

General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for use at the discretion of the Trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity and which have not been designated for other purposes.

1.4 Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Gifts in kind donated for distribution are included at valuation and recognised as income when they are distributed to the projects. Gifts donated for resale are included as income when they are sold. Donated facilities are included at the value to the charity where this can be quantified and a third party is bearing the cost. No amounts are included in the financial statements for services donated by volunteers.

Income Tax recoverable in relation to donations received under Gift Aid or Deeds of Covenant is recognised at the time of the donation.

1.5 Resources expended

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been included under expense categories that aggregate all costs for allocation to activities. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular activities they have been allocated on a basis consistent with the use of the resources.
