### **Summary of Main Activities**

The Charity is organised into branches based on geographical areas in England which has national reach and draws membership from the branches along the protected characteristics of anyone (or combination) of gender, age, and vocation. For the year under review, the main activity of the charity was severely curtailed by COVID-19 as this happened just as we were setting up the Charity.

### **Public benefit**

The trustees of Assemblies of Pentecostal Methodists confirm that they have had due regard to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit at all relevant times.

### **ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE**

Like much of society and the voluntary sector in particular, the Charity's normal ways of conducting its activities were severely curtailed by the COVID-19 pandemic. The Charity was not able to switch rapidly from in person services to virtual services utilising the digital platforms. This was against a backdrop of most of our members having a first-time experience at this and, therefore, the situation presented early challenges to adapt to.
