Also due to the passing away in 2021 of the then Operational Liaison trustee and this year another trustee contracting a stroke. This has limited the ability of the remaining trustees to meet or run the core programmes of the charity. In addition, fundraising objectives continued to be suspended with the charity becoming semi-dormant throughout this financial year.

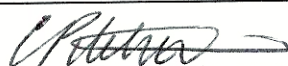

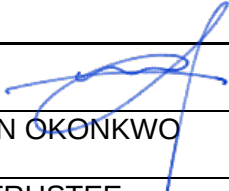
