At subsequent annual meetings one third of the trustees shall retire from office. An AGM was held on 7th February 2025 at which Ms A Hurst retired from office. Ms Hurst indicated that she wished to stand again and she was unanimously re-elected.

Objectives and activities

The charity's objectives are to provide social and leisure opportunities for the benefit of people living in the Black Country and Birmingham, in particular but not exclusively: people with a learning disability; those experiencing social exclusion; or other difficult circumstances, with the object of increasing their social networks, promoting independence and increasing community inclusion.

It does this through delivering a programme of regular and one-off social and leisure activities that our members request.

Achievements and performance

We are pleased to advise that we were able to increase the number of events which we held this year. Activities included day trips to the seaside and other attractions, regular walks, cinema and theatre visits, meals out, craft activities, gardening, live music and sports. Further details are available on our website. The Charity has also provided advocacy support and other assistance to individual members with learning disabilities.

Jigsaw Events CIO

In September 2024 we moved to a new base at Langley Park Lodge. We believe that this move has benefitted the Charity as it is more convenient for our members and it has provided us with additional facilities which we can use for their benefit. We have also taken steps to increase our contacts with other charitable organisations within Sandwell and the surrounding area with a view to increasing the number of people we support and promoting mutual assistance.

Financial review

The Charity obtains its funds from grant income, together with some fundraising and smaller donations. The previous grant which we obtained from the National Lottery under the Reaching Communities provisions, has now been spent. A further grant was obtained in the year for the period up to 31st December 2024 from the Inclusive Communities fund.

Shortly before the year end, we received further funding from the National Lottery under the Awards for All provisions. This award relates to the year ended 31st March 2026. We believe these funds, together with other smaller donations and grants, should enable the Charity to operate successfully until at least 31st March 2026. The Charity is exploring additional funding for future years.



The Charity obtains its funds from grant income, together with some fundraising and smaller donations. The main grant in the year was from the National Lottery under the Reaching Communities provisions. This was part of a funding agreement covering a four-year period from April 2020. In practice, the funds from the National Lottery were not fully spent in that period, largely because of restrictions due to the Covid pandemic. Therefore, we now believe these funds, together with other smaller donations and grants, should enable the Charity to operate successfully until at least 31st March 2025. The Charity has applied for additional funding for future years.





Structure, governance and management

Jigsaw Events CIO is a registered charity in England and Wales under reference 1178363.

The first trustees were appointed on the formation of the Charity. Additional trustees may be appointed by the members or the trustees. During the year ended 31st March 2021, an additional trustee Mr W Moore was appointed by the trustees. At the first annual meeting of the members of the Charity, all the trustees retired from office in accordance with the constitution and were unanimously re-elected. At subsequent annual meetings one third of the trustees shall retire from office.

Objectives and activities

The charity's objectives are to provide social and leisure opportunities for the benefit of people living in the Black Country and Birmingham, in particular but not exclusively people with a learning disability, those experiencing financial hardship or other difficult circumstances, with the object of increasing their social networks, promoting independence and increasing community inclusion.

It does this through delivering a programme of regular and one-off social and leisure activities that our members request.

Unfortunately, a number of the events which we had planned to hold in the year had to be cancelled or postponed due to the Covid-19 pandemic. As far as possible, however, these were replaced by online activities and by sending activity packs to members. The Charity has also provided support to members affected by the pandemic.

Financial review

The Charity obtains its funds from grant income together with some fundraising and smaller donations. The main grant in the year was from the National Lottery under the Reaching Communities provisions. This is part of a funding agreement covering a four-year period from April 2020, and so should enable the Charity to operate successfully for at least the next three years. The previous agreement with the People's Health Trust ended on 31st December 2020. In March 2021, specific funding was granted by Sandwell Council for a six-month period to September 2021. This related to the provision of Covid-19 vaccination literature and other services related to the pandemic, specifically adapted for people with learning disabilities.
