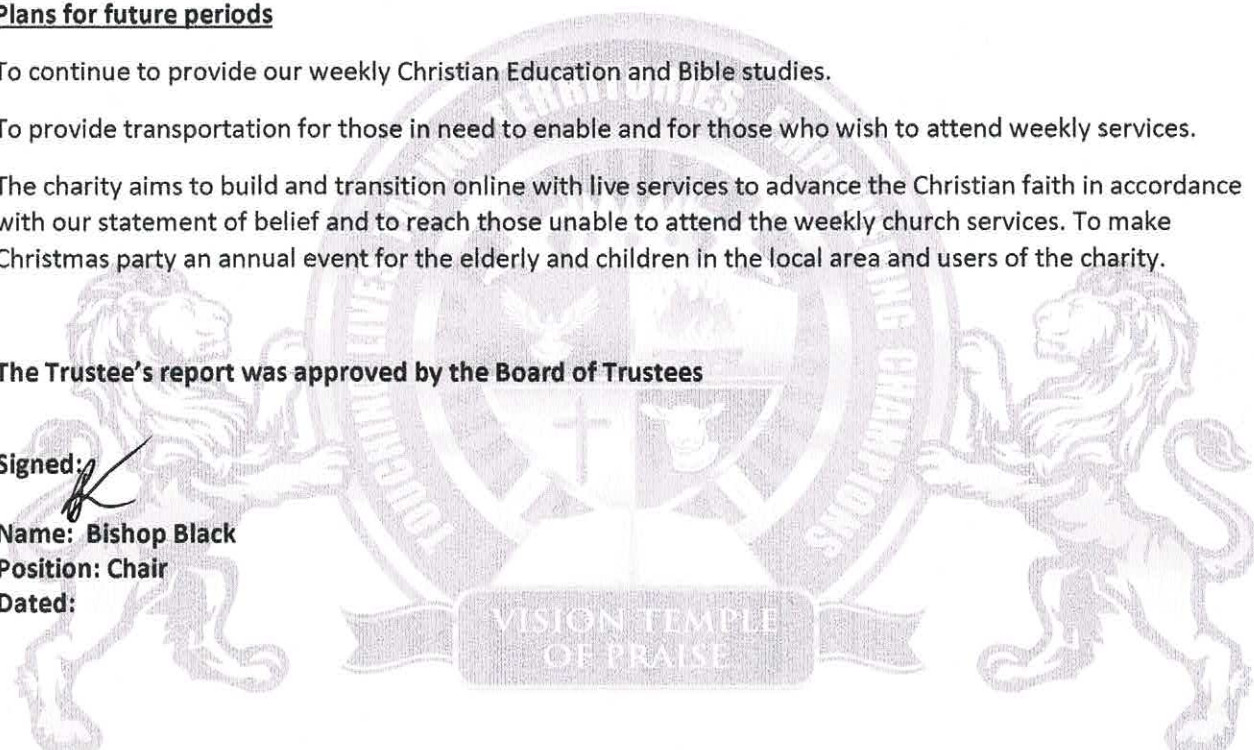

The organisation, management, objectives, and operations of the Church are governed by the memorandum and articles of association (hereafter referred to as Mems & Arts) produced when the charity was first set up in May 2018.

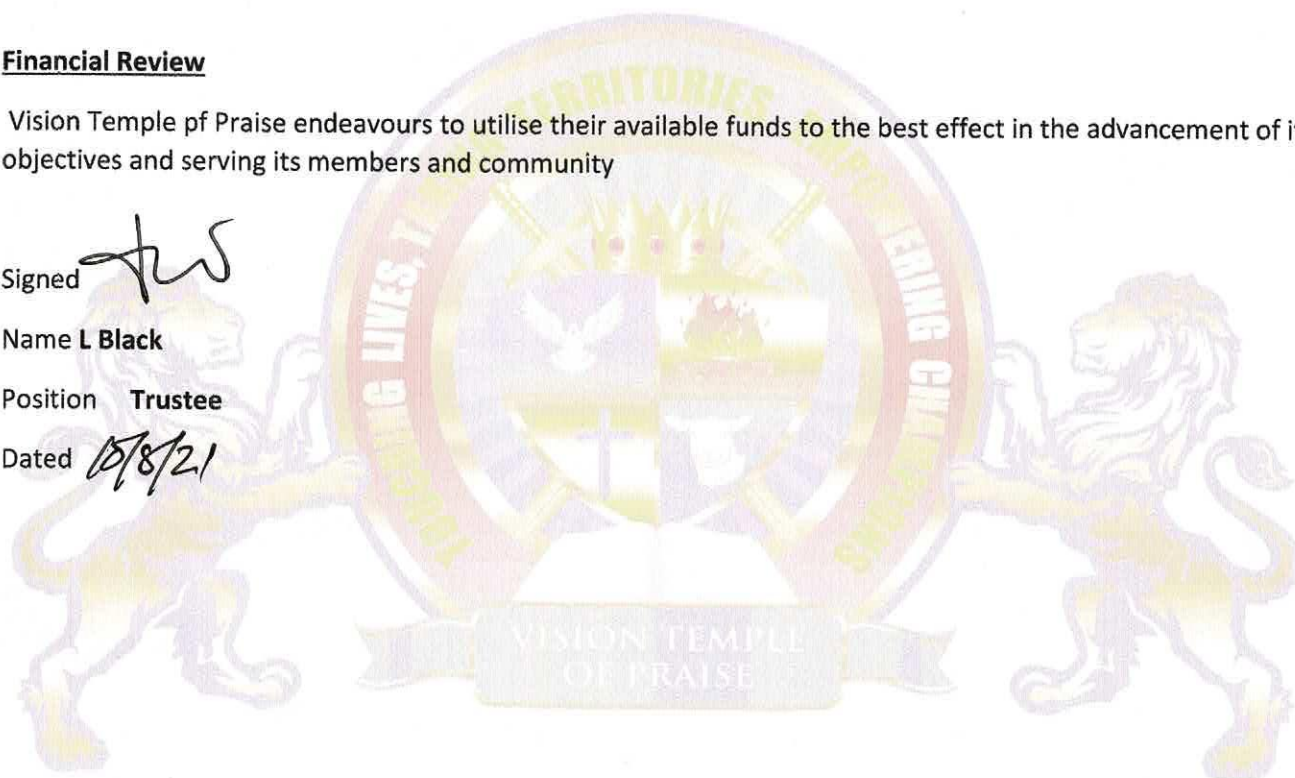

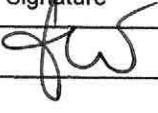
