As a response to the growing robustness of cinema attendance, we programmed a more extensive festival than in 2022. Audience attendance was very high, partly owing to increased attention on Palestine because of events in the region.</p> <p>Evaluation forms completed by members of the audience show a high degree of satisfaction with both the content (films, music events as well as Q&As following screenings) as well as the venues.</p>


