The Charity is constituted as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation by its constitution dated 31 May 2018. The financial statements comply with statutory requirements and the Charity's governing documents.

### Trustee Induction and Training

The above mentioned Trustees were appointed according to the procedures laid down in the Constitution. Future Trustees shall be appointed by a resolution passed at a properly convened meeting of the Charity Trustees. New Trustees are briefed on their legal obligations under charity law, the content of the Constitution, decision making processes and the recent performance of the Charity.

In selecting persons to be appointed as Trustees, the Charity Trustees shall take into account the benefits of appointing a person who is able by virtue of his personal and / or professional qualifications to make a contribution to the pursuit of the objects or the management of the Charity.

New Trustees must be appointed by a resolution passed at a properly convened meeting of the Charity Trustees.

The Trustees present their report and the financial statements for the year ended 31 August 2024. The Trustees confirm that the Annual report and financial statements of the Charity comply with the current statutory requirements, the requirements of the charity's governing document and the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice Applicable to Charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the financial reporting standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland 'The FRS 102 Charities SORP' published on October 2019.

**Objectives**

The Trustees shall hold the reserves and income upon trust to apply them for the following objects:

To reduce the number of young people entering the criminal justice system, with particular emphasis on reducing the likelihood of young people being involved in gangs, gun crimes or knife crimes in London, through the provision of:

- Education workshops;
- mentoring services;
- counselling services;
- well-being services;
- opportunities to play team sports;
- training in employability and job-seeking; and
- any other means that meets the overall charitable objects.

**Principal Activity**

The principal activity during the period was the provision of facilities and services to reduce the number of young people entering the criminal justice system.

The Trustees confirm that when planning activities they have considered the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit, including the guidance 'Public Benefit: running a Charity (PB2)'.

**Restrictions imposed by the Charity's governing document:**

- i) In raising funds the Trustees shall not undertake any substantial permanent trading activity and shall conform to any relevant statutory regulations.
- ii) All cheques and orders for the payment of money from the Charity bank account shall be approved by at least one Trustee and the Operations Manager.

**Organisational Structure**

The charity is governed by the Board of Trustees who are responsible for the governance and the strategic direction of the organisation.

**Review of activities, achievements and performance**

This report accompanies the Financial Statements for 2024 and includes an overview of the key activities of the Charity during the period under review. The achievements and performance of the Charity for the year are highlighted below. With reasonable notice, the files of the Charity are open to inspection to any person.

**Reserves Policy**

In determining the level of the reserves policy of the Charity the Trustees have considered the level of the operating expense required. The total reserves at the year end of (£42,439) includes restricted funds carried forward of £8,224, consisting mostly My Ends' grant to be spent on after school activities, mentoring & employability programs. The balance of (£50,663) entirely comprises of general unrestricted funds which are available for the Charity's general purposes including its general running costs and projects. In 2023, the reserves balance of £88,678 included £84,450 unrestricted reserves.

The level of free reserves has decreased since the previous year, and is sufficient to cover the anticipated running costs for the next few months with corporate sponsorship and grants already secured for the next financial year. The Trustees anticipate the Charity can continue to operate self-sufficiently.

**Results for the Period**

During the period, the Charity received income of £536,451 (2023: £673,064). The income of the Charity has increased significantly following successful fundraising events like The Great Gatsby Boxing 2024.

The Charity made a (deficit)/surplus of (£131,117) (2023: (£10,423)).

At the year end £34,404 (2023: 129,116) cash was held in the Charity's bank account.

The Trustees provided their services to the charity free of charge in the year and these services have not been quantified or reflected in the accounts.

The Wickers Charity continues to create a strong foundation for future growth and the building of this foundation will be integral to the Charity achieving its mission in the future. Some key achievements of the Charity include:

**The provision of a schedule of activities** for the young people in Hackney. The Charity continues to provide a schedule of activities for young people in the area, offering guidance and mentoring, educational workshops, leisure activities and a social hub for youths. This year, the Charity has also started to offer more employability workshops as the Charity seeks to keep young people off of the streets by giving them learning and earning opportunities. The Charity has continued to increase its outreach in the local community and further afield. The Charity now works closely with other parties, such as local schools, the Metropolitan Police Force and other Local Authorities to address the issues of knife crime and gang violence.

**Corporate sponsorship and funding**

In last year's report we highlighted the Charity to be entirely self-funded. Through the team's hard work and dedication in securing sponsorships, grants and donations, the Charity continue to be operating self-sufficiently.

The Charity secured £223,471 of grant funding during the year including £139,276 of My End Funding set aside to help after school activities, mentoring and employability.

**Partnerships with like-minded organisations**

The Charity is continuing to increase its outreach through partnerships with other like-minded organisations. For example, the Charity is paired with two CICs. One offers boxing with the focus of getting young people off the streets. The other offers football with a similar aim but also focussing on the mental behaviour and development of young people through the provision of sports services. We have also expanded the number of after school activities and these are being held in strategic places, where we can attract the 'hard to reach' children & young people.

The charity has also been a delivery partner for a consortium funded by the London Mayors Office to reduce violence in a specific ward in Hackney. This has also helped us to expand our reach and also build relationships with other organisations within the community.

**Areas of development**

There are three main areas of development the Charity needs to continue to work on in order to support its purpose:

1. Delivering activities that keep young people off of the streets and build their life skills;
2. Providing positive role models that give hope for a better life and prepare the young people for a positive future; and
3. Give access to opportunities for employment.

**Improvement areas for the next year**

1. Increase staffing to expand on service delivery.
2. Partner with more schools in the local boroughs to increase outreach.
3. Target more corporates, for fundraising and employment opportunities.

## **Notes to the Financial Statements**

### **For the year ended 31st August 2024**

#### **1. Accounting Policies**

##### **Basis of preparation of financial statements**

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102), published on October 2019. The Charity is a public benefit entity for the purposes of FRS 102 and therefore also prepared its financial statements in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (The FRS 102 Charities SORP) and the Charities Act 2011.

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the company. Monetary amounts in these financial statements are rounded to the nearest pound.

##### **Going Concern Basis**

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis.

Having carried out a review of the Charity's resources and the current economic challenges facing both the Charity and its members the Trustees are satisfied that the Charity has sufficient cash flows to meet its liabilities as they fall due for at least one year from the date of approval of the financial statements.

##### **Critical accounting estimates and areas of judgement.**

In the view of the Trustees in applying the accounting policies adopted, no judgements were required that have a significant effect on the amounts recognised in the financial statements, nor do any estimates or assumptions made carry a significant risk of material adjustment in the next financial period.

##### **Fund accounting**

General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for use at the discretion of the board of Trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charitable company and which have not been designated for other purposes.

Restricted funds are funds that are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by the donors or which have been raised by the charity for particular purposes. The cost of raising and administering such funds is charged against that specific fund. The aim and use of each restricted fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements.

**1 Accounting Policies (continued)**

**Income**

Income from charitable activities is included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SOFA) when the Charity has entitlement over the income, the receipt is probably and income can be measured reliably.

Income from donations and grants is included when received. Donations or grants for particular purposes are included as restricted funds.

**Donated goods, facilities and services**

Donated goods in the form of consumables are recognised in the period of receipt at cost to the vendor in both income and expenditure in the SOFA.

**Expenditure**

Expenditure is included in the SOFA on an accruals basis.

Costs of raising funds comprise the costs of all fundraising activities and increasing the profile of the charity. Charitable activities comprise costs of activities in furtherance of the charity's objectives. It includes direct costs of activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support those activities, allocated between expenditure categories on an appropriate basis.

**Foreign currency translation**

Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded at the rate ruling at the date of the transaction. All differences are taken to the SOFA.

**Cash at bank and in hand**

Cash includes cash in hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts.

**Basic Financial Instruments**

The Charity only holds basic financial instruments as defined by FRS 102. Financial instruments receivable or payable within one year of the reporting date are carried at their at transaction price and subsequently at amortised cost.

## **Objectives**

The Trustees shall hold the reserves and income upon trust to apply them for the following objects:

To reduce the number of young people entering the criminal justice system, with particular emphasis on reducing the likelihood of young people being involved in gangs, gun crimes or knife crimes in London, through the provision of:

- Education workshops;
- mentoring services;
- counselling services;
- well-being services;
- opportunities to play team sports;
- training in employability and job-seeking; and
- any other means that meets the overall charitable objects.

## **Principal Activity**

The principal activity during the period was the provision of facilities and services to reduce the number of young people entering the criminal justice system.

The Trustees confirm that when planning activities they have considered the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit, including the guidance 'Public Benefit: running a Charity (PB2)'.

## **Review of activities, achievements and performance**

This report accompanies the Financial Statements for 2023 and includes an overview of the key activities of the Charity during the period under review. The achievements and performance of the Charity for the year are highlighted below. With reasonable notice, the files of the Charity are open to inspection to any person.

## **Reserves Policy**

In determining the level of the reserves policy of the Charity the Trustees have considered the level of the operating expense required. The total reserves at the year end of £88,678 includes restricted funds carried forward of £4,228, consisting mostly My Ends' grant to be spent on after school activities, mentoring & employability programs. The balance of £84,450 entirely comprises of general unrestricted funds which are available for the Charity's general purposes including its general running costs and projects. In 2022, the reserves balance of £99,101 included £95,438 unrestricted reserves.

The level of free reserves has decreased since the previous year, and is sufficient to cover the anticipated running costs for the next few months with corporate sponsorship and grants already secured for the next financial year. The Trustees anticipate the Charity can continue to operate self-sufficiently.

## **Results for the Period**

During the period, the Charity received income of £673,064 (2022: £508,385). The income of the Charity has increased significantly following successful fundraising events like The Great Gatsby Boxing 2023.

The Charity made a (deficit)/surplus of (£10,423) (2022: £32,309).

At the year end £129,116 (2022: £83,732) cash was held in the Charity's bank account.

The Trustees provided their services to the charity free of charge in the year and these services have not been quantified or reflected in the accounts.

The Wickers Charity continues to create a strong foundation for future growth and the building of this foundation will be integral to the Charity achieving its mission in the future. Some key achievements of the Charity include:

**The provision of a schedule of activities** for the young people in Hackney. The Charity continues to provide a schedule of activities for young people in the area, offering guidance and mentoring, educational workshops, leisure activities and a social hub for youths. This year, the Charity has also started to offer more employability workshops as the Charity seeks to keep young people off of the streets by giving them learning and earning opportunities. The Charity has continued to increase its outreach in the local community and further afield. The Charity now works closely with other parties, such as local schools, the Metropolitan Police Force and other Local Authorities to address the issues of knife crime and gang violence.

**Corporate sponsorship and funding**

In last year's report we highlighted the Charity to be entirely self-funded. Through the team's hard work and dedication in securing sponsorships, grants and donations, the Charity continue to be operating self-sufficiently.

The Charity secured £223,471 of grant funding during the year including £139,276 of My End Funding set aside to help after school activities, mentoring and employability.

**Partnerships with like-minded organisations**

The Charity is continuing to increase its outreach through partnerships with other like-minded organisations. For example, the Charity is paired with two CICs. One offers boxing with the focus of getting young people off of the streets. The other offers football with a similar aim but also focussing on the mental behaviour and development of young people through the provision of sports services. We have also expanded the number of after school activities and these are being held in strategic places, where we can attract the 'hard to reach' children & young people.

The charity has also been a delivery partner for a consortium funded by the London Mayors Office to reduce violence in a specific ward in Hackney. This has also helped us to expand our reach and also build relationships with other organisations within the community.

**Areas of development**

There are three main areas of development the Charity needs to continue to work on in order to support its purpose:

1. Delivering activities that keep young people off of the streets and build their life skills;
2. Providing positive role models that give hope for a better life and prepare the young people for a positive future; and
3. Give access to opportunities for employment.

**Improvement areas for the next year**

1. Increase staffing to expand on service delivery.
2. Partner with more schools in the local boroughs to increase outreach.
3. Target more corporates, for fundraising and employment opportunities.

### **For the year ended 31st August 2023**

#### **1. Accounting Policies**

##### **Basis of preparation of financial statements**

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102), published on 16 July 2014. The Charity is a public benefit entity for the purposes of FRS 102 and therefore also prepared its financial statements in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (The FRS 102 Charities SORP) and the Charities Act 2011.

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the company. Monetary amounts in these financial statements are rounded to the nearest pound.

##### **Going Concern Basis**

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis.

Having carried out a review of the Charity's resources and the current economic challenges facing both the Charity and its members the Trustees are satisfied that the Charity has sufficient cash flows to meet its liabilities as they fall due for at least one year from the date of approval of the financial statements.

##### **Critical accounting estimates and areas of judgement.**

In the view of the Trustees in applying the accounting policies adopted, no judgements were required that have a significant effect on the amounts recognised in the financial statements, nor do any estimates or assumptions made carry a significant risk of material adjustment in the next financial period.

##### **Fund accounting**

General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for use at the discretion of the board of Trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charitable company and which have not been designated for other purposes.

Restricted funds are funds that are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by the donors or which have been raised by the charity for particular purposes. The cost of raising and administering such funds is charged against that specific fund. The aim and use of each restricted fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements.

**1 Accounting Policies (continued)**

**Income**

Income from charitable activities is included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SOFA) when the Charity has entitlement over the income, the receipt is probably and income can be measured reliably.

Income from donations and grants is included when received. Donations or grants for particular purposes are included as restricted funds.

**Donated goods, facilities and services**

Donated goods in the form of consumables are recognised in the period of receipt at cost to the vendor in both income and expenditure in the SOFA.

**Expenditure**

Expenditure is included in the SOFA on an accruals basis.

Costs of raising funds comprise the costs of all fundraising activities and increasing the profile of the charity. Charitable activities comprise costs of activities in furtherance of the charity's objectives. It includes direct costs of activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support those activities, allocated between expenditure categories on an appropriate basis.

**Foreign currency translation**

Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded at the rate ruling at the date of the transaction. All differences are taken to the SOFA.

**Cash at bank and in hand**

Cash includes cash in hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts.

**Basic Financial Instruments**

The Charity only holds basic financial instruments as defined by FRS 102. Financial instruments receivable or payable within one year of the reporting date are carried at their at transaction price and subsequently at amortised cost.

## **Objectives**

The Trustees shall hold the reserves and income upon trust to apply them for the following objects:

To reduce the number of young people entering the criminal justice system, with particular emphasis on reducing the likelihood of young people being involved in gangs, gun crimes or knife crimes in London, through the provision of:

- Education workshops;
- mentoring services;
- counselling services;
- well-being services;
- opportunities to play team sports;
- training in employability and job-seeking; and
- any other means that meets the overall charitable objects.

## **Principal Activity**

The principal activity during the period was the provision of facilities and services to reduce the number of young people entering the criminal justice system.

The Trustees confirm that when planning activities they have considered the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit, including the guidance 'Public Benefit: running a Charity (PB2)'.

## **Restrictions imposed by the Charity's governing document:**

- i) In raising funds the Trustees shall not undertake any substantial permanent trading activity and shall conform to any relevant statutory regulations.
- ii) All cheques and orders for the payment of money from the Charity bank account shall be approved by at least one Trustee and the Operations Manager.

## **Organisational Structure**

The charity is governed by the Board of Trustees who are responsible for the governance and the strategic direction of the organisation.

## **Review of activities, achievements and performance**

This report accompanies the Financial Statements for 2022 and includes an overview of the key activities of the Charity during the period under review. The achievements and performance of the Charity for the year are highlighted below. With reasonable notice, the files of the Charity are open to inspection to any person.

## **Reserves Policy**

In determining the level of the reserves policy of the Charity the Trustees have considered the level of the operating expense required. The total reserves at the year end of £99,101 includes restricted funds carried forward of £3,663, consisting mostly My Ends' grant to be spent on after school activities, mentoring & employability programs. The balance of £95,438 entirely comprises of general unrestricted funds which are available for the Charity's general purposes including its general running costs and projects. In 2021, the reserves balance of £66,791 included £62,108 unrestricted reserves.

The level of free reserves has increased since the previous year, and is sufficient to cover the anticipated running costs for the next few months with corporate sponsorship and grants already secured for the next financial year. The Trustees anticipate the Charity can continue to operate self-sufficiently.

## **Results for the Period**

During the period, the Charity received income of £508,385 (2021: £313,049). The income of the Charity has increased significantly following successful fund raising events like The Great Gatsby Boxing 2022.

The Charity made a surplus of £32,310 (2021: £38,957).

At the year end £83,732 (2021: £46,791) cash was held in the Charity's bank account.

The Trustees provided their services to the charity free of charge in the year and these services have not been quantified or reflected in the accounts.

The Wickers Charity continues to create a strong foundation for future growth and the building of this foundation will be integral to the Charity achieving its mission in the future. Some key achievements of the Charity include:

**The provision of a schedule of activities** for the young people in Hackney. The Charity continues to provide a schedule of activities for young people in the area, offering guidance and mentoring, educational workshops, leisure activities and a social hub for youths. This year, the Charity has also started to offer more employability workshops as the Charity seeks to keep young people off of the streets by giving them learning and earning opportunities. The Charity has continued to increase its outreach in the local community and further afield. The Charity now works closely with other parties, such as local schools, the Metropolitan Police Force and other Local Authorities to address the issues of knife crime and gang violence.

**Corporate sponsorship and funding**

In last year's report we highlighted the Charity to be entirely self-funded. Through the team's hard work and dedication in securing sponsorships, grants and donations, the Charity continue to be operating self-sufficiently.

This year we retained one recurring corporate sponsorships of £25,000 and a new sponsorship of £20,000. We aim to target further corporate sponsors in the next financial year as this has been highlighted as an area for improvement, offering not just funding opportunities but also employability opportunities for young people within these corporates.

The Charity secured £128,444 of grant funding during the year including £51,453 of My End Funding set aside to help after school activities, mentoring and employability.

**Partnerships with like-minded organisations**

The Charity is continuing to increase its outreach through partnerships with other like-minded organisations. For example, the Charity is paired with two CICs. One offers boxing with the focus of getting young people off of the streets. The other offers football with a similar aim but also focussing on the mental behaviour and development of young people through the provision of sports services. We have also expanded the number of after school activities and these are being held in strategic places, where we can attract the 'hard to reach' children & young people.

The charity has also been a delivery partner for a consortium funded by the London Mayors Office to reduce violence in a specific ward in Hackney. This has also helped us to expand our reach and also build relationships with other organisations within the community.

**Areas of development**

There are three main areas of development the Charity needs to continue to work on in order to support its purpose:

1. Delivering activities that keep young people off of the streets and build their life skills;
2. Providing positive role models that give hope for a better life and prepare the young people for a positive future; and
3. Give access to opportunities for employment.

**Improvement areas for the next year**

1. Increase staffing to expand on service delivery.
2. Partner with more schools in the local boroughs to increase outreach.
3. Target more corporates, for fundraising and employment opportunities.

### **For the year ended 31st August 2022**

#### **1. Accounting Policies**

##### **Basis of preparation of financial statements**

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102), published on 16 July 2014. The Charity is a public benefit entity for the purposes of FRS 102 and therefore also prepared its financial statements in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (The FRS 102 Charities SORP) and the Charities Act 2011.

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the company. Monetary amounts in these financial statements are rounded to the nearest pound.

##### **Going Concern Basis**

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis.

Having carried out a review of the Charity's resources and the current economic challenges facing both the Charity and its members the Trustees are satisfied that the Charity has sufficient cash flows to meet its liabilities as they fall due for at least one year from the date of approval of the financial statements.

##### **Critical accounting estimates and areas of judgement.**

In the view of the Trustees in applying the accounting policies adopted, no judgements were required that have a significant effect on the amounts recognised in the financial statements, nor do any estimates or assumptions made carry a significant risk of material adjustment in the next financial period.

##### **Fund accounting**

General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for use at the discretion of the board of Trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charitable company and which have not been designated for other purposes.

Restricted funds are funds that are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by the donors or which have been raised by the charity for particular purposes. The cost of raising and administering such funds is charged against that specific fund. The aim and use of each restricted fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements.

**1 Accounting Policies (continued)**

**Income**

Income from charitable activities is included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SOFA) when the Charity has entitlement over the income, the receipt is probable and income can be measured reliably.

Income from donations and grants is included when received. Donations or grants for particular purposes are included as restricted funds.

**Donated goods, facilities and services**

Donated goods in the form of consumables are recognised in the period of receipt at cost to the vendor in both income and expenditure in the SOFA.

**Expenditure**

Expenditure is included in the SOFA on an accruals basis.

Costs of raising funds comprise the costs of all fundraising activities and increasing the profile of the charity. Charitable activities comprise costs of activities in furtherance of the charity's objectives. It includes direct costs of activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support those activities, allocated between expenditure categories on an appropriate basis.

**Foreign currency translation**

Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded at the rate ruling at the date of the transaction. All differences are taken to the SOFA.

**Cash at bank and in hand**

Cash includes cash in hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts.

**Basic Financial Instruments**

The Charity only holds basic financial instruments as defined by FRS 102. Financial instruments receivable or payable within one year of the reporting date are carried at their at transaction price and subsequently at amortised cost.
