A thorough review of what the Bishop Wilton Show was all about steered the Committee towards focusing this year's show on the community's agricultural roots. However, mindful that we provided good entertainment for all the family, especially children. With the giant Claas combine dominating the skyline, the glorious weather and the promise of a full day of family entertainment, the community came up to High Callis on Saturday 20th July in record numbers. Every section of the show had a positive and vibrant buzz about it from very early on in the day.

A coordinated and targeted social media campaign, early publication of the class schedules, posters, beer mats, the traditional roadside signage and a very professional colour programme got the message out. All will no doubt have contributed significantly to the success of the show.

A now entirely off-road Bishop Wilton Beast started the non-stop action in the Main Ring at 09:30. The new route, despite the unforgiving terrain, producing some seriously impressive times, and stories!

A huge turnout for the Horse classes created non-stop action on the far side of the field. Show Jumping having grown considerably since its reintroduction last year. Like the Beast, we are hopefully becoming a 'must do' event in the local sporting calendar.

Dogs are always popular at the Bishop Wilton Show; this year with dog agility, terrier racing, the dog zone and the Hunsley Beagles in the Main Ring. Such is the popularity of dog related attractions, that we will review how we schedule the most popular activities for 2025.

There were over one hundred sheep entered into the show, and that was just online before the show began. An attraction growing in popularity every year. The Young Handlers class particularly popular and important for the future.

After the unfortunate passing of the voice of Bishop Wilson Show for 40 years, Bob Sefton, first-time commentator Sharon Cawood, did a fantastic job in keeping everyone updated on what was going on around the Show Ground. Her informative and unflustered commentary was a fitting tribute.

The fine weather brought out a record number of classic cars, followed into the Main Ring by the vintage machinery. The 'farming through the ages' demonstration shared some serious horsepower with the Percheron horses, back by very popular demand.

These agricultural demonstrations were extremely cost-effective and had a big impact on their audience watching. This formula looks to have been a great success, with plenty of ideas to build on. It is an intention to have variations on a theme going forward. Involving the local farming ancillary industries is potentially also a rich source of opportunity for sponsorship too.

All the trade stands, food outlets and the bar were delighted with the footfall. The wonderful people at the Gait Inn even produced our own glasses especially for the Show! The fabulous weather created another vintage year for ice cream sales too!

Reflecting on this year's event, many veteran show stalwarts describing it

as one of the best Shows ever. There are a great many factors on the day that dictate its success, but this year a revised approach to organising the event paid off, themed agendas for each meeting, the online worksheet, the use of subcommittees to focus on key issues and importantly very little outlay for the headline entertainment. The last-minute due diligence concerns from 2023 did not manifest themselves this year with our insurers. However, we will be reviewing both Health & Safety, especially around vehicle/pedestrian movements, and safeguarding in time for the 2025 show.

The trustees and show committee believe that all the above objects of the constitution have been met for this year.

Each year the show is reliant on the work done by so many volunteers. This is not just the committee members but, a much wider scope of people who want to support the show in their own way.

This is mainly done in the week running up to the show where, every evening volunteers gather at the show ground to help set up the show for the weekend. Then on the Sunday they return to help dismantle the show and clear the ground of all rubbish and leave it in a fit state for the farmer to use.

Without them the show could not take place and a heartfelt thank you must go to each and every one of them.

The charity does not hold any fundraising events during the year. The committee hold regular monthly meetings to organise the one day annual show and discuss what events should take place on the day.

In February 2023 the show received a substantial donation. This has now been invested with the United Trust Bank into two accounts. The first account is a 180 day investment which is on a variable interest rate currently 5%. The second account is a 2 year deposit account on a fixed interest rate of 4.8%. These investments should return enough money to help maintain the sustainability of the show for many years to come.



The public and their children are encouraged to enter competitive classes in a vast variety of sections which include cooking, art work, horticulture, vegetables, photography and sports. There are sections for traders and crafters to show and sell their produce.



Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

The 125th Bishop Wilton Show had to be something different, and it certainly delivered. The catchy weather not enough to dampen the spirits. Some dramatic skies and enough rainfall to please the gardeners, only mildly interrupted the proceedings. Certainly not enough to stop the Starlings Aerobatics team with their exciting display. The rain cleared perfectly on queue at 3pm for the headline act.

This 'Dunkirk Spirit' came to typify the show. Few disappeared when the rain came, but instead repeatedly sought shelter in various tents. This did wonders for trade, especially for The Gait Inn from Millington, the Members tent the shelter of choice for many. It certainly worked, with many people still there when the show closed and the last bus left at 6.30pm. The Craft and show tents benefitting similarly. After two shows of climatic extremes, consideration for either event needs to be built in to planning for future shows. How can we assure potential show goers that there's still plenty to do if the weather is extreme?

With the revised show field layout, the focus as ever was on the Main Ring activities, and outside the unscheduled rain interruptions was end to end action. The classic cars and vintage tractors, were followed by the fabulous Owl Adventures; delayed from earlier in the afternoon. These were followed by the unanimous crowd pleaser; the Percheron heavy horses.

Like the Show Jumping, back on the Schedule after a few years away. A wider range of horse classes, certainly brought in more participants, and it was good to see non-stop activity on that side of the show field all day too.

The sheep classes this year were really well supported, especially in the young handlers class. It was good to see many entrants that hadn't been before, who will hopefully be back in future years.

The fabulous new run, the Bishop Wilton Beast was sold out before race started, with the new route very positively received. Even though it had been made principally into an off road event, with only a few road crossings, this is potentially an issue going forward. East Yorkshire County Council are still concerned with the interaction with road traffic. Unless it can be taken completely off road, its future viability is in question. We will need to look at revising route again for 2024.

This increased level of due diligence was felt throughout the build up to the show. Our insurers, the NFU requesting a greater level of detail than before in order to accept our premium. There are lessons to be learned, which we are acting on. Getting as much organised as possible, as early as possible, and where necessary asking for Risk Assessments and proof of sufficient Public Liability cover. Strangely it wasn't the highest profile entertainment that attracted the most interest from the insurers.

The high winds and heavy rain made it a challenging year for trade stands. Moving the tents to the West of the show site shielded the trade stands from the driving rain, but some still left early. Admissions were down, but anecdotally it felt like people were on the show site for longer coming right from the start and staying until the end.

Increasing footfall is the age old conundrum. How do we keep it a 'local community' event, but attract a wider audience? Similarly, how do we create value, whilst covering our costs. This year's show was an exception, with free children's entertainment and the aerobatics display, but income and expenditure need to be thoroughly reviewed before next year's event. With so much going on around us over the summer, there's some marketing to be done.

There are many to thank for making it a very memorable day. The call to arms for volunteers to help set up the show this year was amazing. The Show Committee and all the supporters who help to organise and build the event, our sponsors, the Vice Presidents, the President, the Stringer family and the many that attended and participated in everything that goes on at the show.





What a great first ‘full’ show after a three-year hiatus!

Given what’s gone on in the world, the appetite for such events was unknown, but we were neither disappointed by the weather or the attendance. The glorious weather certainly proved fruitful for ice cream sales. This year proving particularly lucrative!

As ever the Wolds Half Marathon was well supported and well organised by Andrew and Stuart, and next year adopts a new off-road format. This will no doubt prove to be a success and will attract a different set of runners and their followers. The necessity to change the format is further evidence of the increasing accountability and challenges we are facing in organising such events with the need to close roads making it wholly unviable on the scale that we operate. I’d like to take this opportunity to thank Andrew Farnsworth for all his efforts and devotion to the cause over the last few years.

We were also incredibly fortunate that many of our usual service providers stood by the prices they quoted for the 2020 and 2021 shows. Phil Warry and I attended the Yorkshire Federation AGM and heard some horrific tales of doubling prices and opportunistic inflation; on marquees especially. On that note, particular thanks must go to Nationwide Marquees who has maintained the same pricing structure for many years.

We have been fortunate to have received similar favourable terms from Mark and Lisa Megginson in hiring their toilet blocks over the years, but sadly they’re closing this side of their business at the end of this year.

The livestock classes across the show are helped considerably by a die-hard group of enthusiasts, and this year was no different. Sadly, with the Yorkshire Show now running into a fourth day, livestock numbers were down with farmers and stockmen show weary, but again its encouraging to see a few young handlers keeping up the tradition. Dogs and horses as ever were an essential part of the show and despite the heat, there were many in attendance at the various agility and veterinary demonstrations.

All the tent classes were again popular, with some exceptional quality and creativity on display. A lot of work goes into the organising and judging, and its great see so many children from the village and surrounding area putting in the effort.

The Main Ring saw a repeat visit from the Knights of Nottingham, but looking forward there are plans to develop this area. We saw new attractions like the Jofers Family History Group and the Purple Pig Company, proving popular and having been asked back for the 2023 Show. Static displays of classic cars and vintage tractors around the ring proved popular, this year with more interaction with their owners; something we want to build on. Everybody wants to tell their story, and getting people involved and participating is good value entertainment, and doesn’t cost us a lot.

“Feedback post the show”, organised by Dorothy Appleby through the Facebook page, has proved very effective in developing ideas for future

shows. We've learnt plenty. The overwhelming feedback was very positive. There are already plenty of ideas on how we can develop the diversity and choice of food and drink franchises.

Another change for this year's show was a significant upgrade in our online presence. A great many got involved in ideas for the website, producing content and pictures, design work and installing and operating the ticketing and gate management facility. However, particular thanks must go to Katy and Dean Hamblin for getting the project off the ground and liaising with Webcetera.

Looking to next year, it's the 125th Show. A staggering achievement. It is a challenge balancing traditional show values in a rapidly changing world. We still need to be providing fun, family entertainment and at good value. A challenge going forward given a cost of living crisis and rapid inflation. There are a great many people to thank over the year for their commitment. The Committee for organising the show, and those that volunteer in the days around the event. There are also those who are called on for favours, donating their skills and resources, working tirelessly in the background. Thank you.

Finally, thank you to the Stringer family for allowing the show to take place in their back yard. Thanks, must also go to the President and the Vice Presidents for their ongoing support in helping to maintain the viability of the show. Their support is intrinsic to the ongoing legacy of the event.



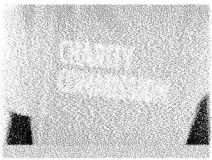

Despite the easing of the restrictions by the government on public gatherings due to the Corona pandemic, the committee decided to cancel the 2021 show. This difficult decision was made after consideration of the additional resources required to deliver a CoVID safe event especially within the marquees.

The trustees/committee recognising the health and well-being aspects of the Show for the local community identified some elements could be delivered in a CoVID secure manner.

This included the Half Marathon section of the show could be organised and a repetition of last year's virtual show for children and adults to enter should go ahead via the show's website.

As a result, the main objectives of the charity were only partially met this year.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

Despite the governments easing of restriction regarding public gatherings, the show committee decided it was in the best interest of public safety to cancel the show for the second time.

The committee was still able to organise the half marathon section of the show, which attracted over 200 runners of which over 140 competed, the remaining 60 did not attend due to the high temperature on the day.

The repeat of the virtual show was made up of 20 classes for children aged 4 to 11 years which included art, poster, photography, model and decorated plate. Over 200 pieces of work were submitted by 52 individual children, their work was then photographed and sent to the organisers to judge.






