The income for the year is £27,226 (2024: £101,141). Expenditure to support the charitable objectives during the year was £15,650 (2024: £48,199). Grants were made to institutions in the year amounting to £14,900 (2024: Grants £44,650). The charity is also committed to future grants totalling £67,480 (2024: £18,750).
