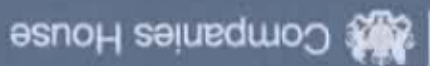
Financial Performance

Our financial position continues to be healthy, with a credit balance of £4566.80 in our NatWest bank account. Donations from the sale of produce grown in the garden throughout the year, for cakes and refreshments at events and monies dropped in the general donation box have contributed to this success. In addition, funds have been raised from membership subscriptions and tree sponsorship.

Operational Achievements

We have had some new volunteers join us and now have a great team, bringing their different skills and experience to the garden. We had several successful, well supported events during the year. The annual Wassailing event in January, as always proved very popular with families and it was wonderful to watch them all singing and banging saucepans as they danced round the orchard following the Morris men. In Spring we held a family picnic with heritage lawn games and a garden trail. During the rest of the year, we were visited by several local schools who came to learn about growing vegetables in season. For National Heritage weekend in September we held a big screen presentation, detailing the history of the walled garden and about the heritage fruit and vegetables we grow. Also, in September we had a team of volunteers from Warwickshire Wildlife Trust work with us in clearing an overgrown area of the garden to create a wildlife habitat. In October, we held our last event of the year demonstrating how to make juice from our crop of apples and pears.
