March Lions club is a member club of the International association of Lions Clubs through Lions Clubs International.

The membership of the club has declined slightly over the last few years and is currently standing at 20. However, as many members are into retirement (or approaching it) and traditional methods of recruitment produce limited numbers, and usually within the same age bracket, 'Friends of March Lions' recruitment programme is in full swing and continues to attract people.

March Lions Club continues to have a strong working partnership with March Rotary Club, especially with respect to 'Santa on Tour' at Christmas.

Currently 2 members of the Club serve on the Lions District

All trustees have had the opportunity to read the guidance document.

Trustee Meetings are incorporated into the end of Club Business meetings and are also held separately for specific purposes.

The club has carried out the following activities this year in respect of the objects of the club.

In September we held a small gala that included a dozen or so stalls of local charities which allowed for them an opportunity to raise funds.

The Club was able to provide Santa on his sleigh for the Town's Light Switch-on and then had a stall on the Christmas Market.

Santa went on tour over 6 nights with the help of our friends from Rotary. As well as raising money this gives many local people (children especially) a lot of pleasure seeing Santa on his decorated sleigh. We also collected dry food for the local Food Bank. Two static Santa fund-raising events were held at local supermarkets.

This year, in addition to the regular Static Santa and Santa on Tour, the Lions and Rotary introduced a Christmas Eve Static Santa stop in the Town Centre to greet families and help raise a final burst of festive funds.

In April, at the St Georges Day Event, March Lions held a low-cost Bacon Sandwich stall selling them for a small cost to the public.

In June, March Lions held their annual March Gala during the March Summer Festival Weekend. Allowing for many smaller local businesses and charities to have access to a wide number of people, raise funds and publicise what it is they are doing.

Across the year we try to get local schools involved with Lions Projects including the Peace Poster scheme ([Peace Poster Contest | Lions Clubs International](#)). Local schools include Cavalry Primary School ([Cavalry Primary School - Home](#)), Westwood Primary School ([Home | Westwood Primary School \(westwood-cambs.org\)](#)), Burrowmoor Primary School ([Burrowmoor Primary Academy - Home](#)) and All Saints Interchurch Academy ([All Saints Interchurch Academy - Home](#)).

We also support the Lions, Young Leaders in Service scheme which recognises the amount of time young people are providing in service to their communities. This year awards were given to members of Young

The Club's policy on grant making is based on how the organisation has carried this prior to becoming a CIO. Applications from the public, groups and other charities are heard at normal Club Business Meetings, sometimes passed to the Welfare Committee to generate specific proposals or discussed by all members and Trustees at that meeting. Based on the merits of the application, or Welfare proposal, the Club is invited to propose a sum and vote to accept or reject, counter proposals may also be heard. If the vote achieves a majority approval, then it is then ratified by the Trustees and if approved the grant is made by the Treasurer to the organisation requesting assistance.

Applications for funding from Commercial organisations or for Commercial or for potentially illegal purposes are automatically rejected.

The club does not at present have any investments.

The Club enjoys a significant amount of support from family members and partners as well as from the local Rotary Club. As can be seen from previously in the report it will be seeking further support through its 'Friends of March Lions' programme. These 'Friends' are not full Lions but people prepared to help out at events and join in social activities who may, in time, become Lions.

The Club has 20 members and at least 16 constant 'Friends' that help at events. The number of Friends increase and decrease dependent on the time of year and if they are free to help.

The club now has a designated Safeguarding Officer and all members have recently undertaken DBS checks. Risk assessments are written for all events that involve club members.

However, as many members are into retirement (or approaching it) and traditional methods of recruitment produce limited numbers, and usually within the same age bracket, 'Friends of March Lions' recruitment programme is in full swing and continues to attract people.

March Lions Club continues to have a strong working partnership with March Rotary Club, especially with respect to 'Santa on Tour' at Christmas.

Currently 2 members of the Club serve on the Lions District Cabinet.

The club has carried out the following activities this year in respect of the objects of the club.

In September we held a small gala that included a dozen or so stalls of local charities which allowed for them an opportunity to raise funds.

The Club was able to provide Santa on his sleigh for the Town's Light Switch-on and then had a stall on the Christmas Market. Santa went on tour over 6 nights with the help of our friends from Rotary. As well as raising money this gives many local people (children especially) a lot of pleasure seeing Santa on his decorated sleigh. We also collected dry food for the local Food Bank. Two static Santa fund-raising events were held at local supermarkets.

In April, at the St Georges Day Event, March Lions held a low-cost Bacon Sandwich stall selling them for a small cost to the town.

With the absence of the normal March Summer Festival, March Lions held their annual March Gala on their own. Allowing for many smaller local businesses and charities to have access to a wide number of people, raise funds and publicise what it is they are doing.

Across the year we try to get local schools involved with Lions Projects including the Peace Poster scheme ([Peace Poster Contest | Lions Clubs International](#)). Local schools include Cavalry Primary School ([Cavalry Primary School - Home](#)), Westwood Primary School ([Home | Westwood Primary School \(westwood-cambs.org\)](#)), Burrowmoor Primary School ([Burrowmoor Primary Academy - Home](#)) and All Saints Interchurch Academy ([All Saints Interchurch Academy - Home](#)).

We also support the Lions, Young Leaders in Service scheme which recognises the amount of time young people are providing in service to their communities. This year awards were given to members of Young People March (YPM) and 20/20 Productions.

March Lions Club continues to have a strong working partnership with March Rotary Club, especially with respect to 'Santa on Tour' at Christmas.

Currently 2 members of the Club serve on the Lions District Cabinet.

The club has carried out the following activities this year in respect of the objects of the club.

In September we held a small gala that included a dozen or so stalls of local charities which allowed for them an opportunity to raise funds. We also attended the March Armed Forces Fair.

The Club was able to provide Santa on his sleigh for the Town's Light Switch-on and then had a stall on the Christmas Market. Santa went on tour over 6 nights with the help of our friends from Rotary. As well as raising money this gives many local people (children especially) a lot of pleasure seeing Santa on his decorated sleigh. We also collected dry food for the local Food Bank. Two static Santa fund-raising events were held at local supermarkets.

In April, due to the usual St Georges Day Event being unable to happen, March Lions held a low-cost Bacon Sandwich stall selling them for a small cost to the town and arranged a mini gala for other local charities.

In June along with the March Summer Festival, March Lions held their annual March Gala on the Saturday of the Festival. Allowing for many local businesses and charities to have access to a wide number of people, raise funds and publicise what it is they are doing.

Across the year we try to get local schools involved with Lions Projects including the Peace Poster scheme ([Peace Poster Contest | Lions Clubs International](#)). Local schools include Cavalry Primary School ([Cavalry Primary School - Home](#)), Westwood Primary School ([Home | Westwood Primary School \(westwood-cambs.org\)](#)), Burrowmoor Primary School ([Burrowmoor Primary Academy - Home](#)) and All Saints Interchurch Academy ([All Saints Interchurch Academy - Home](#)).



The £200 to each local primary school was handed out as they returned in September. These have ranged from specific journals to gardening equipment and signage for a developing 'buddy' system.
