As some of the Trustees have now served a 3-year term since the formation of HAS as a CIO, they are duly available for re-election as Trustees at the 2025 AGM, which took place on 21st January 2026.

Dereck Tasker offered to resign in rotation and at the AGM on 21st January 2026 was duly re-elected as a Trustee by unanimous vote

Alex Crossley-Fells has volunteered to become an additional Trustee. This was put to a vote at the AGM and was passed unanimously.

Organisational Structure

HAS operates with a group of Trustees – as listed above – who are responsible for ensuring that HAS meets its aims and objectives.

Presently [January 2026] we operate with trustees who volunteered from within the membership of HAS.

As yet no external Trustees have been appointed. A further drive will be made during 2026-27.

The current Trustees are also members of the Society's Committee.

In 2023-24, the Trustees agreed to set up and run a digital messaging service so that decisions requiring a quick resolution could be performed as well as a better means to communicate important activities that the organisation wished to undertake.

In the past 12 months the Trustees and Committee members have – once again - found this a very useful approach to facilitate the business of our Organisation, for when personnel are not reachable for a face-to-face discussion.

Since November 2019 we continue to build partnerships with two other organisations as detailed below:

- a) The Huddersfield Rugby Union Football Club based at Lockwood Park, Huddersfield, HD4 6EN, who we hire a room from to provide facilities to hold meetings and from where we run an Introductory Astronomy Course at least one per year. We have made a commitment to this organisation to continue to utilise their premises for our Meetings for the next 12 months at the minimum.
- b) YWT Stirley, Hall Bower, Huddersfield, HD4 6RP, with whom we are developing an observing

site – known as the Garden of Stars - in partnership with the Yorkshire Wildlife Trust. In the past twelve months HAS has been part of a number of joint events at the YWT Stirley site and HAS has used significant financial resources as well as the time and effort of a number of our organisations' Volunteers – and those provided to us by YWT Stirley - to make the Garden of Stars a working outdoor space for educational outreach cementing our commitment to this joint venture for many years to come. We anticipate further development of this outdoor space in the coming years.

Aims and Objectives

HAS has a defined set of aims and objectives:

- a) To help facilitate the observing of the objects of the night and daytime sky using suitable equipment obtained by grant funds supplied by outside organisations
 - b) To promote the understanding and observation of the night sky by the people of Kirklees
 - c) To help cultivate links to community and educational organisations in Kirklees who have an interest in learning about the Night Sky
 - d) To promote the aims of objectives of our umbrella organisation the Federation of Astronomy Societies, of which HAS is a full member
- We remain committed to these aims and objectives

Achievements and Performance

During 2024-2025, the Astronomy Society consolidated its development plan as outlined in the Trustees Annual Report for 2023-2024.

We have resumed face-to-face meetings and continue to see enquiries about our activities grow.

We have also undertaken a small number of outreach activities with youth organisations and this remains an important facet of our Aims and Objectives as described above.

We completed an Introductory Astronomy Course in Autumn 2025 and are planning to start a further Course in October 2026 – if there is sufficient demand for it.

This has been key to improving our cash flow over recent months and will be essential to continue our recovery during the months ahead.

Financial Review

Mr Rob Wylie remains in the role of Treasurer of HAS.

Mr R Wylie has full control of all financial affairs of HAS, including liaising with our financial accountants and as a signatory on the HAS bank account.

In 2024-25 HAS made a significant financial commitment to YWT Stirley to develop an Observing Site. This was completed on time and close to the expected budget. In the past 12 months there has been a significant uptake of these facilities and we hope to continue this development over the next 12 months and beyond.

In the past 12 months we have made significant use of the Garden of Stars at Stirley for members events. We are encouraged by the commitment of our Members to this new opportunity and it also provides a small income to support our ongoing presence at YWT Stirley. We anticipate this will continue to grow in the future.

Since we restarted Membership fees in Spring 2021 the Trustees are encouraged by the retention of established members as well as an influx of new members from course retentions and interested parties new to the organisation.

We hope that this will help us continue to secure our membership base.

Since November 2019 we have continued to build partnerships with two other organisations as detailed below:

a) The Huddersfield Rugby Union Football Club based at Lockwood Park, Huddersfield, HD4 6EN, who we hire a room from to provide facilities to hold meetings and from where we run an Introductory Astronomy Course at least one per year. We have made a commitment to this organisation to continue to utilise their premises for our Meetings for the next 12 months at the minimum.

b) YWT Stirley, Hall Bower, Huddersfield, HD4 6RP, who we are starting to develop and observing site with, in partnership with the Yorkshire Wildlife Trust. In the past twelve months HAS has been part of a number of joint events at the YWT Stirley site and has begun a significant project to install a dedicated observing facility at the site which we hope will be a long term project coming months.

During 2022-2023, the Astronomy Society made changes to its development plan as outlined in the Trustees Annual Report for 2021-2022.

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We have also undertaken a small number of outreach activities with youth organisations and this remains an important facet of our Aims and Objectives as described above.

We completed an Introductory Astronomy Course in Autumn 2023 and are planning to start a further Course in February 2024 – if there is sufficient demand for it.

This has been key to improving our cash flow over recent months and will be essential to continue our recovery during the months ahead.

The completion of a significant phase of building and installations works at YWT Stirley in the past few months, including a substantial financial commitment by HAS, will – the Trustees hope – have a transformative effect on our organisation as well as The Yorkshire Wildlife Trust at Stirley in the near future.

HAS has begun a program of joint events with YWT Stirley in recent months, which have significantly raised our profile and we hope to continue and build on those foundations in the months and years to come.

President's Report AGM 2022

The past 12 months have seen HAS beginning to return to its normal operations.

The easing of pandemic rules has allowed some degree of normality to be possible for meetings and related activities of HAS.

The Trustees of HAS have taken every opportunity to discuss ongoing Society business, in person by both outdoor and indoor gatherings following the pertinent Government mandated rules applicable at the time.

This has resulted in our Society being able to function at almost normal levels of activity.

This has to be put into context that we are still one of the few organisations of our type that have returned to normal operating, whereas others are still undertaking remotely run activities or have ceased operations all-together.

During the past 12 months my normal workload has been impacted by substantial amount of shift-working – and I am grateful for many members being available to run meetings and other activities in my absence.

We have had a small number of invited speakers over the past 12 months, which have been well attended. This is in light of many Universities and related organisations pulling back from offering face-to-face meetings with their researchers, relying instead on remote presentations.

I believe we have taken the right approach over the past year and hope that we will be able to organise more invited speakers and more frequently over the next 12 months. Some time ago I provided Gain with a list of prospective speakers and I hope to see some of them in the near future.

The restart of the Beginners Astronomy Course over the past 12 months has been a major success story for the Society both in terms of stabilising our cash flow and getting a useful influx of new members into the Society. I am indebted to Gain for taking over the organisation of the course.

There are significant challenges ahead but so long as we are careful and thorough in our approach we will be OK.

I sincerely hope that the next 12 months will see the organisation undertaking more of what it has done well in the past, both at HRUFC and at YWT Stirley Farm.

Finally, I would like to formally welcome some new faces to the Society's Committee and group of Trustees and thank them for their participation during the past 12 months. Thank you for your service to our organisation.

Recently, HAS has been notified that some the Trustees wished to be released from their role. Replacements have been approached and their appointment along with the upcoming resignation of 1 existing trustee will be confirmed at the next AGM in January 2022.

Organisational Structure

HAS operates with a Group of trustees - as listed above - who are responsible for ensuring that HAS meets its aims and objectives. Presently [December 2021] we operate with trustees who volunteered from within the membership of HAS. It is our intention to recruit new Trustees from outside our Organisation, in accordance with our Constitution, as we develop deeper links with partner organisations. The current Trustees are also members of the Society's Committee.

During the period June 2020 to June 2021 COVID restrictions prevented the trustees from meeting in person. However a system of online meetings, organised via the Zoom platform, allowed the Trustees to discuss Society business based around a prescribed order of Meeting. From this decisions were made and acted upon - in an appropriate manner - by those trustees who have the necessary mandate to do so.

In July 2021, face-to-face meetings of the Committee were restarted - following current Government guidelines governing social distancing and the

rules agreed between HAS and HRUFC, from whom we rent a meeting space – to comply with government COVID-19 requirements.

Since November 2019 we have been building partnerships with two other organisations as detailed below:

a) The Huddersfield Rugby Union Football Club based at Lockwood Park, Huddersfield, HD4 6EN, who we hire a room from to provide facilities to hold meetings and from where we plan to run a Basic Astronomy Course twice yearly. We have made a commitment to this organisation to continue to utilise their premises for our Meetings when the current restrictions on public gatherings cease. We have been in discussion with HRUFC to continue our association with them for the next 12 months.

b) Stirley Community Farm, Hall Bower, Huddersfield, HD4 6RP, who we are starting to develop and observe site with, in partnership with the Yorkshire Wildlife Trust. Activities at the Stirley Farm site are currently suspended since March/April 2020. However we have kept in contact with the Trustees at the YWT at Stirley Farm and we remain committed to build our presence at the Farm site over the coming months.

We are starting to make more detailed plans in our activities for the next 6-12 months, subject to any future changes in Government regulations

We remain committed to these aims and objectives

Achievements and Performance

During 2020-21, the Astronomy Society has put on hold its development plan as outlined in the Trustees Annual report for 2019-2020.

During early 2020, HAS decided to postpone membership fees – more details in the financial review below. However since early 2021, we restarted the membership process and have been very satisfied with the return of established members and some new recruits to HAS.

We have [since September 2021] restarted our Social Astronomy meetings. These began as outdoor events until the restrictions were changed by the UK Government to hold indoor events. Again we have been delighted with the turn out to these events and we have now [December 2021] begun full meetings indoors. This will also include events with both indoor and outdoor components

We are also planning to restart our well established [before COVID] Beginners Astronomy Course in February 2021. This will be key to improving our cash flow over the coming months and beyond.

Financial Review

Because of government mandated restrictions to control COVID-19, our activities and as a consequence our financial results have been significantly impacted.

Our financial position has been impacted again, in 2020-21, however steps were taken to minimise outgoing fixed costs and we still retain a healthy financial reserve.

Mr S Maxwell stepped aside as Treasurer due to family commitments and was replaced by Mr Rob Wylie who has taken on full responsibility in the role of Treasurer of HAS. This change was fully agreed by all Trustees and confirmed by a vote at a Committee Meeting. Mr R Wylie has full control of all financial affairs of HAS, including liaising with our financial accountants and as a signatory on the HAS bank account.

We restarted Membership fees in Spring 2021 and so far are encouraged by the uptake of discounted subscriptions that were available for a time as well as an influx of new memberships since.
