Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

The focus of the charity has been very much on one area:

Stanton Kiosk – The kiosk has been running as our own operation since March 2023. The operation has been successful both in terms of sales and employment opportunities and being a suitable environment for a number of our employees. Parent, siblings, and volunteers have also valued the positive mental health gained from working at the Kiosk.

Sales have consisted mainly of hot drinks, snacks, cold drinks and ice cream. Sales have totalled around £13,800 with over 300 hours of employment.

We suffered a break in and theft from the Kiosk in June with losses of around £200.

Catering Trailer – We have been allocated a grant from the Lottery for a replacement trailer but only got around to purchasing one in April 2025, hence the spending is not included in this year's report.

A few events still took place outside of the Kiosk – Christchurch mulled wine sales, Old Town Beer Festival and Embrace Festival, using the coffee machine.

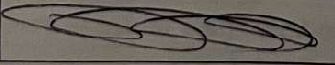

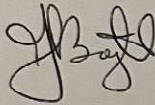

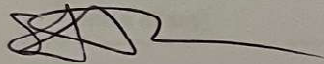

Stanton Kiosk – The kiosk has been running as our own operation since March 2023. The operation has been successful both in terms of sales and employment opportunities an being the “right” sort of environment for a number of our employees. Parent, siblings, and volunteers have also valued the positive mental health gained from working at the Kiosk.

Sales have consisted mainly of hot drinks, snacks, cold drinks and ice cream. Sales have totalled around £13,500 with over 350 hours of employment.

Three volunteers used the kiosk as part of gaining their DofE awards.

Catering Trailer – The trailer attended 23 events, which would have been more without cancellations due to poor weather for 10 additional events. Sales have been in excess of £10,500.

Unfortunately, in March 2024 we discovered that the trailer was no longer roadworthy and we have had to retire it from use. We will look to raise funds, source funding for a replacement asap.

Other - We have engaged 3 additional employees this year and have serve our 10,000th customer.

Some equipment has reached the end of its life (crepe machines) and replacements will need to be sought.

We have moved to Xero accounting software, hence the increase in Accountancy fees from last year.

We had a busy and successful year following the previous COVID impacted year. We attended 24 events from locations in Swindon, to Cinema events in Longleat, Bath and Westonbirt. It was good to have repeat attendance at events that we had previously visited and also to take on board new events.

Our main purchase was the Canopy for the rear bed of the Ford Ranger to allow us to transport equipment in a dry and secure manner. This was funded by the Wiltshire Foundation grant.

The biggest events (revenue wise) were Cirencester Advent Market, Shrivenham Fete and MantonFest in Marlborough.

Across the 24 events, we employed 12 young adults with Learning Difficulties, for a total of 230 hours of employment at £10 (Real National Living Wage), rising to £11 towards the end of the year.

We trialled working at Stanton Park Kiosk for 10 months of the year and in March, took over the running of the Kiosk, operating at weekends throughout March. We have a one-year contract, so expect hours and revenue to increase in 2022/23. We are grateful to Every Cloud for giving us the opportunity to work at the Kiosk.

We have planned for a similar or slightly increased number of events in 2022/23.

We emerged from Covid soon after the start of the financial year and events slowly started to re-hire vendors like ourselves. We attended 7 events in the year and generated profits of around 30% on these events. Because of fixed costs associated with insurance, memberships, parking, etc, we had to use some of our reserves from the previous years and also relied on grants from Tesco, the National Lottery, UnLtd and the Additional Restrictions Grant related to Covid support.

Our main purchase was the Ford Ranger to allow us to tow the catering trailer and expand our reach. This was funded by the Lottery and the UnLtd grants.

The biggest events were DOCA Lantern Festival in Devizes, Pride in Swindon and Wroughton Carnival. The Advent market at Cirencester was unfortunately cancelled at the last minute due to high winds, which impacted our income probably to the tune of £1,000.

Across the 7 events, we employed 10 young adults with Learning Difficulties, for a total of 72 hours of employment at £10 (Real National Living Wage).

We added another trustee and with the availability of the catering trailer, we have put in plans for a greater number and wider spread of events in 2022/23.
