Para 1.20	<p>The year started in April 2020 with the first national lockdown due to the Covid 19 Pandemic. Lockdown meant that the RLNI were unable to prepare for the season and as restrictions started to lift we saw an increased numbers of inexperienced beach users. Club members sprang into action undertaking Beach Warden qualifications and running beach surveillance with a significant number of rescues and preventative actions taking place. There is no doubt that several lives were saved due to our activity. We received commendation from HMCG for our efforts having saved the lifeboat and coastguard from having to be called. Our patrolling strengthened our already strong relationships with the local community, local businesses, parish council and National Trust.</p> <p>With no RNLI on the beach, it meant that we had less access to necessary first aid equipment and other resource. As such we launched a crowdfunder and thanks the generosity of local businesses and the community, significant funds were raised which immediately helped saved lives and also created a legacy that will continue long beyond. As a result, we now have patrol tabards, essential PPE, sanitizer, new binoculars, radios and a defibrillator (the latter of which we have installed</p>

		<p>at the Beach so as to benefit the community at all times).</p> <p>Thanks to our volunteers undertaking COVID safety training once out of lockdown we were able to continue training for our members.</p>
