

Independent examiner's report to the trustees of Tectivity charity no.1179177, 2021-2022

Charitable aims:

1. To relieve the charitable needs of children and young people who are in need by reason of cognitive disabilities including but not limited to ADHD, autism spectrum disorders, learning difficulties and social anxiety, their families and carers;
2. To provide or assist in the provision of facilities in the interests of social welfare for recreation or other leisure time occupation of such children, young people and their families and carers with the object of improving their conditions of life.

I report to the charity trustees on my examination of the accounts of the Company for the year ended 30 June 2022.

Responsibilities and basis of report

As the charity's trustees of the Company (and also its directors for the purposes of company law) you are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the requirements of the Companies Act 2006 ('the 2006 Act').

Having satisfied myself that the accounts of the Company are not required to be audited under Part 16 of the 2006 Act and are eligible for independent examination, I report in respect of my examination of your charities accounts as carried out under section 145 of the Charities Act 2011 ('the 2011 Act'). In carrying out my examination I have followed the Directions given by the Charity Commission under section 145(5) (b) of the 2011 Act.


Independent examiner's statement

Trustees Annual Report for the period 1st July 2020 to 30th June 2021

Objectives and Activities

The purpose of our charity, as set out in our governing document, is to relieve the needs of children, young people and their families who are in need by reason of the cognitive disabilities of ADHD, Autism, learning difficulties and social anxiety who reside in Bridgend and the surrounding area. We achieve this through providing and / or assisting in the provision of facilities in the interests of social welfare for recreation or other leisure time occupation of such children, young people and families with the object of improving their condition of life.

In normal times, our main activities are a weekly technology club (Tech club), a fortnightly trampolining club (Altitude), 4-5 events per week through the school holidays and a surf club which runs through the spring and summer months (Wave Riders). In addition, we support the parent carers who attend these activities with their children through social gathering and relaxation opportunities.

Our charity is run by volunteers all of whom are parent carers.

Achievements and Performance

During the year 2021-2022, our charity :

- Maintained an ongoing relationship with our councils disability sports department
- Continued working with a local CIC, Karma Seas, in providing our families with the opportunity to surf through Wave Riders as a joint venture between both groups
- Restarted our in person clubs which had paused due to the pandemic
- Provided in person events and breaks for our members
- Provided household packs and offered household items for sale at our in person clubs to support with the cost of living crisis

Financial Review

Please see our submitted receipts and payments accounts for details of the amounts held at the end of the period 2021/2022. Overall, we are pleased with our position at the end of the year and believe it leaves us in a strong position for the next year.

In relation to holding reserves, we aim to have 6 months worth of running costs (in our own fundraising / unreserved funds) at any time. This ensures that we are able to continue running our charity for a period of 6 months if we do not obtain grants.

Structure, Governance and Management

Our governance document is a Constitution (Charitable Incorporated Organisation).

Trustees are selected within our AGM. They must register interest through the completion of a form stating why they want to become a Trustee and what skills and experience they would bring to the charity. The current Trustees review all forms, discuss and vote on the applications before communicating the decision/s made. Only the current Trustees are entitled to appoint new Trustees.

There have been no changes to our Trustees during this period.



