The South West Food Collective was granted charitable status on 18 July 2018, under charity number 1179238. It is constituted as a community interest organisation, the constitution having last been updated on 10th July 2018.

Structure

The charity trustees are responsible for the general control and management of the charity and its activities. The trustees give their time freely and receive no remuneration or other financial benefits.

The charity has no paid employees; all charitable activities were carried out by the trustees and volunteers.

Appointment of trustees

There were no changes to the board of trustees this year and SWFC is satisfied that the existing board represents a satisfactory range of skills and competencies for the administration of the charity.

How our activities deliver public benefit

SWFC's primary activities of collecting and redistributing surplus food directly address its charitable aims of relief of disadvantaged people (whether by economic circumstances or otherwise, depending on the recipient charities) and the protection of the environment through the reduction of food waste, a major contributor to climate change. The trustees consider that these activities therefore provide meaningful benefit to both the recipients of the food and the wider public.

Events scheme

This year due to the personal circumstances of the trustees who have thus far coordinated all of SWFC's charitable activities, it was necessary to put those operations largely on hold and SWFC was not able to continue our food salvage operations from previous years.

We were able to assist in the running of a staff canteen at Glastonbury festival using only food that would otherwise have gone to waste.

Use of volunteers

Since we have not been able to continue our food salvage operations this year we have also not had any volunteer involvement, with the exception of trustees, who give their time freely to the administration of the charity and management of operations.

Fundraising

This year, although there was the possibility of continuing with the model established last year in our partnership with Festival Republic, we were ultimately unable to do so, and so we also did not raise any funds, which would have come from the associated service charges. We were able to cover operating overheads from reserves.

Future plans

There is no resolution in sight for resuming operations in the immediate future; in the coming year we can look to find new trustees or volunteers with the capacity to take on the administration of the charity; otherwise we may need to look into dissolving it.



Financial review

Summary

The financial statements show no receipts due to the lack of activity; payments represent reimbursements of out-of-pocket expenses, including expenses from previous years and ongoing overheads.

SWFC's primary activities of collecting and redistributing surplus food directly address its charitable aims of relief of disadvantaged people (whether by economic circumstances or otherwise, depending on the recipient charities) and the protection of the environment through the reduction of food waste, a major contributor to climate change. The trustees consider that these activities therefore provide meaningful benefit to both the recipients of the food and the wider public.

Events scheme

This year SWFC was able to make good on last year's plans to expand our relationship with Festival Republic. This year we once again worked at Camp Bestival and Reading Festival, as well as working with Latitude Festival for the first time. Across the three events, we saved over 7 tonnes of food, corresponding to an approximate retail value well over £20,000 and over 30 tonnes of CO₂. This is considerably more than any previous year, due to a combination of the addition of Latitude and a significantly increased quantity of Reading Festival, which accounted for over 4 tonnes of this total. This achievement was made possible by working more closely with the festival to establish donation points throughout all the campsites using their existing infrastructure, instead of only running our own donation points.

Use of volunteers

SWFC's activities are largely facilitated by volunteers, who take on the majority of the manual labour involved in food collections and deliveries, and without their contribution our activities would not be possible. By partnering with festival organisers, we are able to compensate festival volunteers with free attendance at the festival, providing an incentive to participate. This year around 30 volunteers participated in SWFC's activities. Our trustees also give their time freely to the administration of the charity and management of operations.

Fundraising

This year we followed through with implementing the new funding model we developed last year, based on charging for the costs incurred in food salvage at festivals. This was a big success, and is mutually beneficial for SWFC and the festivals we work with: festivals



are able to improve their practices with regard to sustainability, save on waste disposal costs, and deliver public benefit for a very modest outlay, and SWFC is able to finance its operations to become financially sustainable on an ongoing basis; this is important since with all our administrative work being done on a volunteer basis it is not viable to do much in the way of fundraising elsewhere.

We were able to cover all of our operating costs through this new fundraising model, along with a small reserve. Due to the arrangement of payment in arrears it was necessary for trustees to continue to cover operating costs such as transport, insurance, and web hosting in the first instance for later reimbursement.

Future plans

In the coming year we expect to continue to work with Festival Republic, and hope to take on further festivals, expanding our volunteer pool with volunteers taking on greater responsibilities in the management of operations. However, the administrative workload is already very high to be completed solely on a volunteer basis, so we also hope to explore a more formal model for that administration, e.g. contracting some of this work. Any such solution would also require commensurate increases in fundraising, which could come through the existing service model or sourced through donations.

Financial review

Summary

The financial statements show the implementation of our new fundraising model, with funding coming entirely from services charges to the festivals we worked with. At the moment the statements show receipts being considerably higher than expenses, but this is primarily due to reimbursement for a number of expenses still being outstanding; service charges were not substantially higher than the actual costs of our activities.

The trustees consider that these activities therefore provide meaningful benefit to both the recipients of the food and the wider public.

Events scheme

Summer 2021 saw a welcome cautious return to large events, and SWFC was able to restart its charitable activities and put our planned partnership with Festival Republic, provisionally agreed the previous year, into practice. Namely, we worked at Camp Bestival and, for the first time, Reading Festival, which was by some margin the largest event we have tackled to date.

Unfortunately, due to the uncertainties stemming from the Covid-19 pandemic, these were the only two events we were able to attend this year. However, thanks to a combination of a large quantity of high-value chilled food from Camp Bestival's food hall and a huge take of long-life food from attendees at Reading, we were able to collect a total of 4.7 tonnes of food between the two events, with an estimated retail value of £17,800, and corresponding to nearly 20 tonnes of CO₂ saved. This therefore represents a record year for SWFC despite the challenging circumstances with many festivals still being unable to go ahead and significant challenges in our planning due to uncertainty. We look forward to the full return of the festival circuit next year and to topping this total once again.

Use of volunteers

SWFC's activities are largely facilitated by volunteers, who take on the majority of the manual labour involved in food collections and deliveries, and without their contribution our activities would not be possible. By partnering with festival organisers, we are able to compensate festival volunteers with free attendance at the festival, providing an incentive to participate. This year around 30 volunteers participated in SWFC's activities.



Our trustees also give their time freely to the administration of the charity and management of operations.

Fundraising

This year, all operating costs such as transport, insurance, and web hosting were covered by in-kind donations.

Future plans

In the coming year we expect to take on new festivals working with Festival Republic, and to establish a funding model for these events which we can generalise to other partnerships in the future. Due to the increasing workload for trustees, this may include administrative fees to cover some of this workload, either by trustees with the agreement of the board and in line with Charity Commission guidelines, or by employing e.g. more experienced volunteers on short-term bases.

Financial review

Summary

The financial statements again show no financial activity, with expenses continuing to be covered by in-kind donations. However, due to our expected expansion in the coming year, we are now looking to formalise a model of fundraising in the form of a charging model for events, which should be in place for the coming festival season.

Covid-19

Owing to the Covid-19 pandemic, most festivals and other large events were cancelled this year and as such the South West Food Collective has been unable to conduct its usual activities this financial year; however, following the acquisition of Bestival by Festival Republic we had fruitful discussions with Festival Republic in advance of the summer 2020 festival season, should it have gone ahead, and hope to be able to reap the benefits of this partnership once it is safe and legal for large events to go ahead again, with luck later in 2021.

Use of volunteers

This year because of the lack of events, SWFC activities were restricted to work by the trustees to develop partner relationships for future years. The trustees give this time freely.

Fundraising

This year no formal fundraising was conducted because of the pandemic; continuing overheads were covered by in-kind donations.

Future plans

The coming year's activities and expenses remain very uncertain due to the pandemic; we will look to cover costs firstly through partnership agreements and are not yet able to put in place firmer fundraising arrangements.



Financial review

Summary

The financial statements show no financial activity because of the lack of activity over the pandemic; in addition the charity's continuing expenses remain low enough that they can largely be covered ad-hoc by trustees. The charity is looking to put in place a charging model with event partners to cover operating expenses in return for the waste and sustainability benefits to the event.
