Chairs report

Achievements and performance 2021/2022

Major lockdown as a consequence of the Pandemic is now easing and in Pakistan and the UK normalisation is occurring. ASF has been greatly affected by the pandemic and its consequences but has continued to support to people in Pakistan living in poverty.

For young people despite the challenges, we have continued to contribute to educational fees and provisions where we can.

The major operational issue remains implementation of our strategic plan, which was hampered for two years due to covid, delaying basic issues such as opening a bank account.

The effects of this have been that we have not grown in our operations over the last year as planned and we have not raised any new funds beyond the income we receive from the rented property passed down from the late Anwar Sultana but maintained

with some effort our donation to various charities and schools in Pakistan.

As we are still operating an account in the chair's name, we have as a board decided not to apply for funding or take in any other monies, other than the Dover property income, which has always been paid into the chair's personal account before the charity was formed or registered.

We hope to distribute as much of the Dover property income to international charities working in Pakistan and food and materials directly to agents in Pakistan.

Recruiting New Trustees

The chair recognises that there is a need to recruit new trustees to freshen up the trustee board and bring in new ideas and energy.

The chair will be consulting trustees on how to identify and reach and attract new trustees. However it is important that any new trustees exhibits the values of the Foundation which includes a whole hearted commitment to ending poverty in Pakistan.

New Website

The Foundation at the beginning had a website, however due to the pandemic, other priorities took over and the old website was not maintained, it is essential for funding purposes, as well as marketing and raising the profile of the Foundation that a new website is up and running again.

Staff

At present the Foundation has no staff and relies on the volunteering of the Trustee Board Members, this is not sustainable without either recruiting new Members of the Board or employing a part time member of staff to support the Chair and Treasurer.

Chairs report

Achievements and performance 2020/2021

We continue to provide support courtesy of the Dover income which continues to be £6500.

One year and half into the pandemic and there is no clear end in sight when things will go back to normal. ASF has been greatly affected by the ongoing pandemic, but has endeavoured to provide succour to those in need in a time of great uncertainty all over the world.

ASF continues to be to plan to offer a range of support to people in Pakistan living in poverty.

For young people for example, we aim to provide hope by supporting the cost of education for those who come within our scope and are identified as coming from poor backgrounds who cannot afford educational provisions.

However our capacity to reach the greatest number has been severely curtailed by the failure in ASF's attempt of the past 6 months to open a charity bank account with a high street bank to improve transfer of monies as well increase our chances of winning funding bids for projects.

All major banks suspended applications for community/charity bank accounts at the beginning of lock down and have not resumed. We made efforts to apply for a charity account with Charities Aid Foundation Bank (CAFbank). Although after submission, we provided further information requested by CAF including a guarantee of £500 mandate from our Dover property income, in the final analysis they rejected our bid after a 6 week process.

The effects of this has been that we have not grown in our operations over the last year, but maintained with some effort our donation to various International charities and schools in Pakistan.

As we are still operating an account in the chair's name, we have as a board decided not to apply for funding or take in any other monies, other than the Dover property income, which has always been paid into the chair's personal account before the charity was formed or registered.

As lockdown eases and we can go back into banks and charity accounts are again available, we will revisit our funding and growth plans, but for the next year as the last, we hope to distribute as much of the Dover property income to international charities working in Pakistan and food and materials directly to agents in Pakistan.
