At the end of the reporting period the charity had free reserves amounting to £15,914 (2021: £11,120).

In addition to the free reserves the charity has cash balances of £71,028 (2021: £58,570) and investments with a value of £1,345,537 and cost of £100,000 within the expendable endowment fund which can be released to support the activities of the charity.

The Trustees pursue a policy of maintaining a free reserve available to be spent in the furtherance of the charity's objectives, as well as covering future needs, opportunities, contingencies and risks.

No trustee received any remuneration nor reimbursed any expenses in the year under review.

During the period under review Coutts & Co, a trustee of the charity to July 2021, were paid fees for the provision of administration and investment management services amounting to £9,986 whilst a trustee. Ludlow Trust Company Limited was appointed trustee in July 2021 and was paid fees totalling £5,972 between appointment and the reporting date. These fees are authorised under clause 6 of the trust deed.
