The Trustees submit their Annual Report for the period 1st August 2022 - 31st July 2023 and once again are happy to report the continued impact of the Trust in primary schools and churches mainly within the Stockport area but also further afield. We receive a warm welcome on each occasion we visit and favourable comments about the quality of the presentations and the relevance of the material to all who see and hear.

School Visits

During the year, the Trust has presented 156 assemblies which have been warmly received by children and staff alike. We are delighted to be able to continue visiting schools and very much appreciate the opportunity for us to share our work with the children and adults.

Church based Events

This year we are pleased to report that the Trust has been able to present further church-based "Story Trails". These were The Christmas Story Trail at St Cuthbert's Church, Cheadle, and the Easter Story Trail in Hazel Grove Baptist Church, Hazel Grove, Stockport.
