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Report of the Trustees

Year ended 31st December 2025

The Alvis Archive Trust was constituted under the Charities Act 2011 as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation, Association Model, on 10th September 2018, registered as Charity number 1179868 in England and Wales.

The objects of the CIO are, for the public benefit, to: *obtain and preserve the heritage of, and any objects, information or data of historical interest relevant to; Alvis, the Alvis company or related personalities of any era; and/or promote the study and appreciation of the history and heritage of Alvis products as items of historical interest.*

During the year the trustees have complied with their duty to have due regard to the guidance on public benefit published by the Charity Commission in exercising their powers or duties.

The main website www.alvisarchive.com attracted a record 200,000 “views” during the year attributable to the increased number of photographs added to the site. The websites www.alvis14.com, www.alvisfourpoint3.wordpress.com and www.alvisvehicles.wordpress.com continued to attract visitors.

At the AGM in May John Fox retired as a trustee by rotation. Edmund Waterhouse, Martin Wickham and Greg Wrapson agreed to continue as trustees. John Fox agreed to continue to administer the charity for the trustees.

During the year a substantial amount of aero engine and vintage car material was digitised and benefitted donors who were proposing to rebuild Leonides engines. We were able to assist donors to recover original registration numbers for their cars being restored, and provide historical information on cars acquired by them. A donation of new books was received “Alvis, Coventry and the Iron Lung”. The Trust is more frequently mentioned in advertisements for cars for sale when provenance is being described. The DVLA also seeks assistance from time to time in identifying cars.

A three day gathering was organised in April 2025 in Lincolnshire for members in and to promote the Trust to non-member Alvis owners. Members continue to meet monthly at the Bowcliffe Drivers Club which has attracted some new members during the year. We also were present at the Bowcliffe & Beaulieu event in July. Four members made a presentation on Alvis cars in the Ballroom for visitors to “Masters of Motoring” and displayed four cars outside the main entrance. We have assisted a number of people to find Alvis cars.

The financial statements show that the cash reserves have increased. Continued efforts will need to be made to increase income from donations and other sources. The trustees and members propose to attend more motoring related events to publicise our existence.

Year ended 31st December 2024

The Alvis Archive Trust was constituted under the Charities Act 2011 as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation, Association Model, on 10th September 2018, registered as Charity number 1179868 in England and Wales.

The objects of the CIO are, for the public benefit, to: ***obtain and preserve the heritage of, and any objects, information or data of historical interest relevant to; Alvis, the Alvis company or related personalities of any era; and/or promote the study and appreciation of the history and heritage of Alvis products as items of historical interest.***

During the year the trustees have complied with their duty to have due regard to the guidance on public benefit published by the Charity Commission in exercising their powers or duties.

The website www.alvisarchive.com attracted a 20% increase in the numbers of visitors. The main website chronicles the activities of the trustees but does not record all donations of material which are logged separately. During the year we acquired the art work of Tony Philips-Smith (APSLEY).

The websites www.alvis14.com and www.alvisfourpoint3.wordpress.com also cater for two car models and a further new site www.alvisvehicles.wordpress.com was added thanks to the volunteer efforts of Mark Ellis who scanned hundreds of photographs which are now in the public domain.

At the AGM Brian Hartley retired as a trustee. Vacancies may be filled by the decision of the members at the AGM and two new trustees, Edmund Waterhouse, Martin Wickham were appointed to serve with reappointed trustees John Fox and Greg Wrapson.

After the AGM Brian Hartley organised an off-road event for the attending members in his Land Rover.

As the lease at Bowcliffe expired it was decided at the AGM to temporarily move the physical archives to the offices of John Fox for further digitisation, cataloguing and pruning before securing more permanent storage. Brian Hartley kindly provided the necessary transportation and helpers to achieve a smooth transition.

The financial statements show that our cash reserves increased but continued efforts will need to be made to increase income from memberships and other sources as the final £1,000 payment of financial support from the AOC was made in 2024.

A two-night three day event has been organised for April 2025 for members and to promote the Trust to non-member Alvis owners.

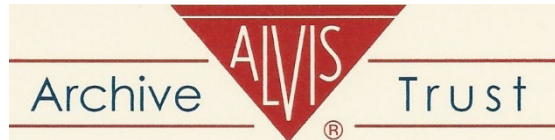

Trustee meetings were held during the year to discuss the relationship with Alvis Owner Club Limited. The outcome was a statement from the Board that the AOC encourages voluntary support but with no commitment by the Club to contribute after 2024 or assist in collecting contributions.

The financial statements show that our cash reserves increased but continued efforts will need to be made to increase income from memberships and other sources as the final £1,000 payment of financial support from the AOC is due in 2024.

Donations of archive material were also gratefully received during the year from the Vintage Alvis Register and Martin Wickham relating to fighting vehicles and aero engines.

We were pleased to welcome several overseas members to Bowcliffe Hall with their cars and other members who visited the archives during the year.

A meeting was held with the Swiss Car Register in Lucerne with a view to collaborating with archive material on the Swiss built Graber cars.

The objects of the CIO are, for the public benefit, to: ***obtain and preserve the heritage of, and any objects, information or data of historical interest relevant to; Alvis, the Alvis company or related personalities of any era; and/or promote the study and appreciation of the history and heritage of Alvis products as items of historical interest.***

Two trustees, Graham Maurice Clode and Christopher Taylor had served the maximum term of three years and retired at the AGM leaving Edmund Waterhouse and Martin Wickham who were appointed at the 2021 Annual General Meeting (AGM). Vacancies may be filled by the decision of the members at the AGM and John Fox was appointed as a new charity trustee.

During the year the trustees have complied with their duty to have due regard to the guidance on public benefit published by the Charity Commission in exercising their powers or duties.

During 2022 the website www.alvisarchive.com continued to attract new Followers and increased numbers of views. It chronicles the activities of the trustees but does not record all donations of material which are logged separately. The websites www.alvis14.com and www.alvisfourpoint3.wordpress.com also cater for two models.

We expanded the range of digitised archive material and more historic AOC Bulletins were made available for immediate download. The digital photo library was also expanded.

Visits to the archives increased as did the number of members. In order to reduce outgoings the office lease was renewed with reduced storage space for a further two years with the option to rent an additional room when required for larger gatherings.

Trustee meetings were held during the year at the Alvis Car Company and the Rootes Archives Trust. Several meetings were held with Directors and Officers of the Alvis Owner Club Limited during the year culminating with a presentation prior to their AGM in October to determine areas of cooperation.

The financial statements show that our cash reserves were maintained at a similar level to last year and further efforts will need to be made to increase income from memberships and other sources as the final £1,000 payment of financial support from the AOC is due in 2023. No agreement was reached on future support by means of voluntary AOC member contributions.

Donations of archive material were also gratefully received during the year.

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Report of the Trustees

Year ended 31st December 2021

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The first trustees were: Neil Kenneth Millington (died December 2020), John Ronald Fox (retired April 2021, continuing to act as Administrator and webmaster), Stephen Douglas Horne (retired March 2020) and Graham Maurice Clode.

Trustees serve for a maximum term of three years and one third of the trustees retire each year. Christopher Taylor was appointed as an additional trustee in April 2019. Edmund Waterhouse and Martin Wickham were appointed at the 2021 Annual General Meeting (AGM) on 23rd April 2021.

Graham Clode and Christopher Taylor will retire by rotation at the 2022 AGM and vacancies may be filled by the decision of the members at the AGM; any vacancies not so filled may be filled by the members or the charity trustees deciding to appoint a new charity trustee.

During the year the trustees have complied with their duty to have due regard to the guidance on public benefit published by the commission in exercising their powers or duties.

During 2021 the website www.alvisarchive.com continued to attract new Followers and increased numbers of views. It chronicles the activities of the trustees but does not record all donations of material which are logged separately. The websites www.alvis14.com and www.alvisfourpoint3.wordpress.com also cater for two models.

We expanded the range of digital car registers and more historic AOC Bulletins were made available for immediate download. The digital photo library was also expanded.

The process of digitising archive material continues to be the prime activity of the Trust and a major project was the manual for the Leonides aero engine which helped at least one engine back into operation.

Covid restrictions limited the number of visits to the archives but six successful lunch meetings were held during the year including 19 members attending a memorial lunch for Neil Millington.

During the year member Roy Probert passed away and had donated his archives and books to the Trust.

Without a substantial bequest the following financial statements would have reflected the continuing losses during 2021. The trustees have considered what steps to take to mitigate these during 2022. Advice has been sought from the FBHVC and the recommendations in the report of the Archives Director have been acted upon.

The news that Neil had died in Leeds Hospital (Jimmy’s) from pneumonia was a great loss to the Archive Trust to which he contributed so much.

He retired early from the business he bought out of Smiths Industries, Autosound in Bradford, and enjoyed fifteen years in retirement with his fleet of coaches that he kept in his unit next to Autosound, worked on every Monday by his enthusiast friends. He had enjoyed a long association with Land Rover and a series of Bentleys to complement his TF21. The number of comments of appreciation on the Archive Trust website are testament to the high regard he was held in the transport industry.

His wit, humour and good counsel endeared him to all who met him and we often joked that he was referred to as “a very nice man” on a number of occasions. His charm no doubt helped us secure our offices at Bowcliffe where we spent many happy hours. It will not be the same without him.

- 1 These accounts have been prepared on a cash basis but at the end of the year the Trust has no outstanding liabilities. The Trust has a potential Gift Aid claim amounting to £1,300 that is not reflected in these accounts as the cash has not yet been received.
- 2 In addition to cash donations Friends donated documentation, books, furniture and furnishings. The Alvis Owner Club ceased to fund the full cost of the rental of the Trust's offices at Bowcliffe Hall with effect from 31 May 2020. With effect from 1 June 2020 the Alvis Owner Club has reduced its financial support to £1000 per year. These accounts include £1000 received at the start of June 2020 to cover the period to 31 May 2021. Office rental costs shown in these accounts cover the period from 1 June to 31 December 2020. Donations have also been made for History Certificates provided by the Trust to vehicle owners. Friends making donations of £50 were given a Bulletin DVD.
- 3 The trustees have deferred most of their 2020 travelling costs. Where travel is wholly incurred on archive business the rate is 45p per mile.
- 4 The Trust holds all its cash reserves in an account with HSBC bank.
5. No valuation of the accumulated archives has been made. The website does not record all donations of material which are logged separately. The first annual general meeting of the charity was held at Bowcliffe Hall on 4th March 2020.
