Financial Review

Review of the charity's financial position at the end of the period	Para 1.21	At the beginning of the financial year, Theology School held a cash balance of £777.54. During the year, total income was £4,566, primarily comprising trustee donations (£3,800) and expense reimbursements (£766). Total expenditure amounted to £4,313, mainly covering online delivery costs, venue hire, course materials, and digital tools. The charity therefore ended the year with a cash balance of £1,030.68, demonstrating that its finances are stable and sufficient to continue its charitable activities.

Funds are not accumulated beyond operational requirements in order to maximise the impact of donations on charitable activities.

These funds supported free theological education, ministry resources, venue hire, outreach initiatives, and virtual meeting facilities. The cash balance carried forward into 2023 was £290.48. After expenditures aligned with the charity's objectives, the cash balance carried forward to 2024 is £233.84, with zero reserves. No significant financial risks were identified, and the charity continues to operate on a donation-funded model.


