## Trustees Annual Report 2025

57:fourteen is a registered charity supporting those in the criminal justice system. It was formed in ~~2010~~ from a group of volunteers who assisted the Chaplain at HMP Risley in delivering the Alpha course for the previous six years. The objects of the charity are:

- As a Christian organisation, to assist those of any or no faith at risk of becoming involved in or already within the Criminal Justice System to a full and permanent rehabilitation by means of faith-based education and training, together with the support of and mentoring within local faith-based communities.
- To ensure best practice, particularly regarding safeguarding issues, in supporting those returning from the Criminal Justice System by maximising the proper use of available resources to local faith-based communities.

During the past year the Board has held four meetings at St James Church, Westhead.

Peter Wren, from St John's Church, Burscough attended the play *If prison walls could speak*, promoted by 57:fourteen. He has attended board meetings since April 2024 and has agreed to become a Trustee.

Contacts with prisons and churches have progressed and new opportunities continue to be explored with churches throughout the Diocese of Liverpool. Meetings have been held with the prison chaplain of HMP Liverpool and it is hoped to establish our presence there.


Joe Cottrell from the *Network of Kindness* attended one meeting. This organisation helps churches engage in social action, including debt advice, food pantries, etc. It is part of Together Liverpool and works with ex-offenders. It is hoped that our common objectives may develop.

The proposed partnership with Junction 42, a similar charity based in Newcastle, continues to develop, where our church links can dovetail with their prison links.

Our Policies and Procedures are continually updated, and liaison with Liverpool Diocese's Safeguarding Officer continues.

Regarding the WO Street restricted fund, in the grant application and covering letter, the funding was required for: "Deliver courses in Prison – Mentor/Pastorally Care in line with other relevant organisations in the Community. To ensure best practice, particularly with regard to safeguarding issues, in supporting those returning from the Criminal Justice System by maximising the proper use of available resources to local faith-based communities." The response noted: "This grant (the Grant) is made in support of the project as outlined in detail in your grant application to the Foundation (working with offenders, ex-offenders and those at risk of offending in Lancashire)".

There remains a need to appoint a Liaison Officer who might further promote 57:fourteen and continue the connection with partnering organisations.





**Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year**

During the past year the Board has held four meetings at The Studio in Lathom.

57:fourteen promoted a play "If prison walls could speak" staged by the Artless Theatre Company. It was held in St John's Church, Burscough in October 2023 and attracted a significant number of people from throughout Liverpool Diocese. It was a great success. Our chairman gave a short address about the work of 57:fourteen and some attendees agreed to assist the work of the charity. These contacts are being developed.

57:fourteen's Policies and Procedures are continually updated, and liaison with Liverpool Diocese's Safeguarding Officer continues. Contacts with prisons and churches have progressed and new opportunities are being explored with churches throughout the Diocese. It is anticipated that the original six participating churches will increase significantly.

We have maintained contact with Paul Brown from the Message Trust who is working in Altcourse Prison, using Alpha and other relevant courses.

The proposed partnership with Junction 42, a similar charity based in Newcastle, is being further developed. It is hoped that 57:fourteen's church links will dovetail with J42's prison links. We are looking at initial contacts being made directly between churches and offenders through prayer partnerships, possible letter-writing ministry (anonymous) and eventually settlement of ex-offenders in local churches.

Stuart Duffy, from Westhead St James, has attended board meetings since January 2022 and has agreed to become a Trustee.

There remains a need to appoint a Liaison Officer who might further promote 57:fourteen and continue the liaison with partnering organisations.

**Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year**

During the year the Board has held seven meetings, some via Zoom and some in person, generally at The Studio in Lathom.

Liaison with churches has continued. A 57fourteen member gave his testimony at an Ormskirk church in October 2022, raising the vision of 57fourteen. The charity is promoting a play, "If prison walls could speak", due to be performed by the Artless Theatre Company at St John's Church, Burscough in October 2023. Churches across the north-west will be invited to attend. This will be an opportunity to relaunch the connection with churches already affiliated to 57fourteen and to make new connections.

Liaison with Junction 42, a Newcastle-based charity with similar aims has continued. 57fourteen members visited Newcastle to see at first-hand how Junction 42 operated. They are in touch with the majority of UK prisons and each year issue over 130,000 "prison packs" containing scriptures, crafts, prayer journal, worship CD, etc. A Zoom meeting was held in September 2022 with its director, John O'Connor, which explored ways in which we might work in partnership together. This included the possibility of setting up a local "Missional Community" for ex-offenders.

Discussions have been held with local prisons, including Risley, Hindley, Thorncross and Liverpool regarding resettlement of ex-offenders in local churches.

Following this, a map of north-west prisons and a strategy document were drawn up showing how this partnership may proceed. It included topics relating to identifying prisons and partnering churches, training, operational manuals, etc.

A meeting was held with Paul Brown, formerly of The Message Trust, who is working in Altcourse Prison. Paul invited us to visit Altcourse and keeps us informed of activities there via WhatsApp.

57Fourteen has previously received several grants to assist in setting up the work. All the grants have been handled as restricted although only the grant from WO Street has restrictions specified, namely, to deliver courses in Prison and to ensure best practice, particularly with regard to safeguarding issues, in supporting those returning from the Criminal Justice System by maximising the proper use of available resources to local faith-based communities. Although it has not been possible to progress these activities, these funds are carefully maintained for this use in future.

There remains a need to appoint a Liaison Officer who might further promote 57fourteen and continue the liaison with partnering organisations.

## Achievements and performance

### Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

During the past year the Board held five meetings, all of which were conducted by Zoom. This is a consequence of the on-going Coronavirus pandemic.

Some close liaison with churches and Christian Fellowship groups has continued. A presentation to members of Ormskirk Deanery Synod outlining the vision and aims of 57:14 has taken place. The presentation included a short video concerning aspects of our work.

Positive communications and a helpful exchange of ideas have been held with officials of "Junction 42", located in the North East of England.

Some in-depth discussions and dissemination of information has taken place with the Leader and Founder of J42. This organisation has a similar vision to ourselves, but has considerably more resources; both financial and in terms of the number of involved personnel. Junction 42 has been able to initiate some engagement with prisons nationally and has close contacts with prisoners, their families and friends primarily through 'Missional Communities' set up in local and often working class areas of North East England and Scotland.

It is envisaged that Board Members will make a visit to one of the 'Missional Communities' in the Spring of 2022. Once this visit has taken place the Board may wish to reevaluate the aims and vision of 57:14 and also consider any positive partnerships involving closer liaison with Junction 42 in order to identify, develop and strengthen the benefits to Offenders within the North West area.

The appointment of a Prison Community Liaison Officer has yet to be made. This has regrettably been delayed – again due to the current coronavirus situation. This appointment will remain a priority of the Board during 2022.

Making direct contact with prisons and Chaplaincy Teams has often been difficult during the year. Current infection rates are very high amongst prisoners and staff. As a result, regimes both within the wider prison community and chaplaincy departments have remained severely restricted. The direct involvement with prisoners from volunteer groups has also been severely curtailed in many establishments within the North West.

With the possible easing of Coronavirus restrictions we look forward to a year where progress can be made and as a result the work of our organisation can move forward in a positive direction.



In undertaking activities the trustees have taken due regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit.

2020 has been a year of positive consolidation and reflection.

It was only possible for one Board meeting which took place in March 2019 when Trustees could meet together; however, all other Board meetings during the year took place via Zoom. It is positive to report that several organisations and churches contributed to the charity's account and we are now in a strong position to consider the recruitment of a Project Development and Administrative worker in accordance with one of the priorities identified for 2020.

Unfortunately, the effects of the Corona pandemic have limited the progress of the work we intended to make during 2020. Since the Spring of 2019 many prisoners have remained in their cells for more than 23 hours each day; often only being allowed out of cell to collect meals. Chaplaincy services have either not taken place at all in establishments or numbers allowed to attend have been seriously curtailed. Staffing levels within Chaplaincy Teams have also been very seriously depleted with many chaplains shielding or working from home. Chaplains have not always been able to visit prisoners 'within cell' particularly on Wings affected by Covid positive prisoners. Domestic visits for all prisoners have taken place via Zoom. Chaplaincy volunteers, who often lead groups and contribute significantly to the spiritual welfare of prisoners, have temporarily been refused permission to enter prison establishments. Many churches in our local communities have been closed or are operating within exceptionally strict guidelines. As a result, these situations have impacted significantly upon our important work of supporting offenders and those who are in need.

In preparation of the lifting of restrictions, which will enable us to more actively pursue our priorities, we have received a number of small grants and fundraising efforts are continuing. It is hoped that once restrictions begin to be lifted, we will be in a position to ensure that our work with ex-offenders will be resumed and restored.

Partnerships have continued to be maintained with a number of churches and these have been strengthened through the publication of literature, posters and video materials clearly outlining the aims and objectives of 57: Fourteen. The implementation of a training programme for churches remains an ongoing project, although we hope that this work will proceed during the latter part of 2021 once "lockdown" restrictions have been lifted by HM Government.

We have been able to make contact with 'Junction 42' - an organisation based in the North East of England. This group has broadly similar aims, not only in supporting and mentoring the needs of ex-offenders but also partnering churches and particularly so in deprived communities. Board members were able to have some very positive discussions with one of the founders of Junction 42 via Zoom.

Junction 42 has been established for several years and would appear to be a much larger group than 57:fourteen, employing a substantial number of salaried staff. We gained considerable knowledge and insight from their organisation and it was readily agreed that we should keep in touch.




