From Vision to Reality

Milestone Achievement: Property Acquisition & Launch

The defining moment in our history occurred in **December 2024**, when the Langley Islamic Centre successfully completed the **acquisition of a permanent commercial property**.

- **The Transition:** This milestone marks our evolution from a temporary prayer group to a permanent pillar of the Langley landscape.
- **The Launch:** Following a successful acquisition, we have officially opened our doors, welcoming the community into a home of their own. This move provides the permanent physical infrastructure essential to fulfilling our three-fold constitutional mandate: daily prayer, health awareness, and a community educational hub.

Financial Stewardship & Capital Investment

The fiscal years leading up to 2024/25 were characterized by unprecedented growth and community trust. The scale of our fundraising has directly enabled our transition from tenants to owners.

Trustee Note: Despite the significant increase in income, we maintained discipline in our spending. This allowed us to preserve over **93% of our total income** for the purchase and establishment of our new home.

Impact of the Permanent Premises

With our own building now fully operational, we are scaling our core objectives:

- **Spiritual Growth:** We have moved beyond the weekly average of **150 attendees** to a robust, daily service model, providing a spiritual home 365 days a year.
- **Educational Expansion:** Our property now hosts dedicated weekly sessions for youth, men, and women. These simultaneous programs have allowed us to double our educational capacity.
- **Community Welfare:** Our fixed location has become a reliable sanctuary for the community, providing a permanent base for community services and health awareness.



Mr Javaid Sultan currently has the role of chairperson of the Langley Islamic Centre; as such he has prepared this trustees report.

Langley Islamic Centre has (3) three objectives as part of our constitution:

(a) Build a community centre for daily activities such as prayer, medical awareness, teaching and learning of the Islamic faith for ladies, men and children.

1. Langley Islamic Centre has serviced an inclusive provision of Friday prayer and different activities during the year that has enhanced the spiritual development of the Islamic faith into a multi-generation and multi-ethnic community. In 2020-21 we had an average weekly attendance of 95 people who took part in our Friday sessions (approximately 80 adults and 15 kids)
2. Medical awareness sessions include: healthy lifestyles, educating young children and women on psychological issues, protection against Covid-19.
3. Community work done for all Muslims & non Muslims during Covid-19 which includes free food and medicines for those affected by Covid.
4. Covid SOP's awareness to the locality in different languages like Urdu, Pushto, Bangali.

(b) Providing Education

1. Basic Islamic education is provided to women on a monthly basis focusing on engagement with community and allowing them to learn new things based on the Islamic faith.
2. Quran sessions that take place on a weekly basis for young children and adults.

(c) Social Activities and Charity Events

1. **Eid Milan Party:** (this was restricted during Covid-19).
2. **Ramadan dinners:**(this was restricted during Covid-19).
3. **Education sessions:** for children during school holidays: scholars were invited who gave speeches to the younger Muslim generation highlighting basic beliefs on how to be better Muslims on Audio Messages or live on social media.
4. **Fund raising:** weekly charity collection and Ramadan charity events took place. Overall Langley Islamic Centre raised £20,788. The aim of our fund raising events is to build a community centre, provide help for orphans, widows and poor people.
5. **Minutes Meetings:** Monthly zoom meetings with volunteers were arranged in order to enhance our services and weekly reports. Recent weekly reports include: property search for our permanent premises, ways to make our project aim a success and how our Friday sessions can be safer during Covid-19.

Finances:

The trustees of Langley Islamic centre are responsible for day to day management are required to receive formally the end of year financial statement that has been independently examined by an accountant not linked with the management trustees. A copy of the final accounts is attached at the end of this report.
