Activities: The charity exists to prevent or relieve food poverty and need in Glastonbury and the surrounding BA6 and BA16 postcode area, mainly through the provision of emergency food parcels and other necessary items. Working with referral agencies, we aim to provide an individual or family with non-perishable and fresh food for a balanced diet for approximately a week.

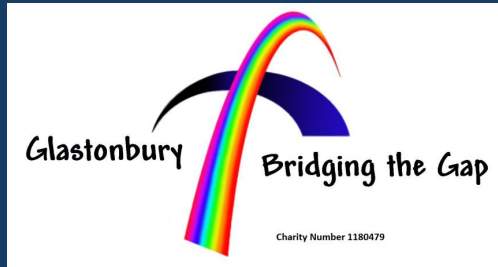

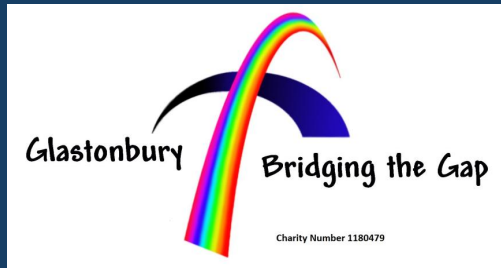

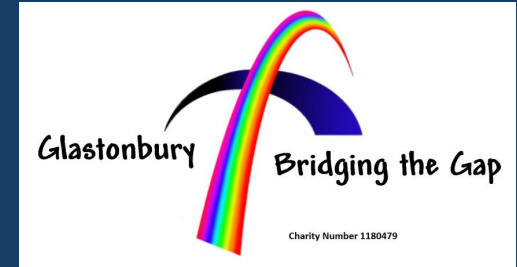
Glastonbury & Street Bridging the Gap foodbank is a local, volunteer-led charity serving mainly the BA6 and BA16 postcodes, providing food and other essentials to individuals and families. It was established more than 10 years ago by the local Churches Together to meet a need for food provision.

Glastonbury Bridging the Gap is a registered charity operating under a constitution adopted in May 2018. Our trustees are elected on a 3 year rolling term, and we invite other interested parties in the local community to consider becoming a trustee. Our current trustees are:

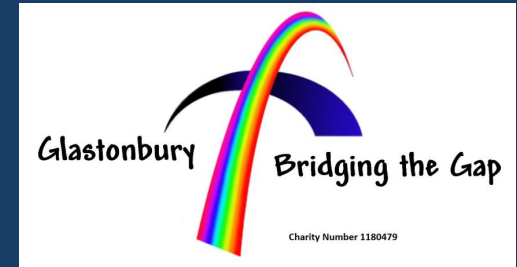

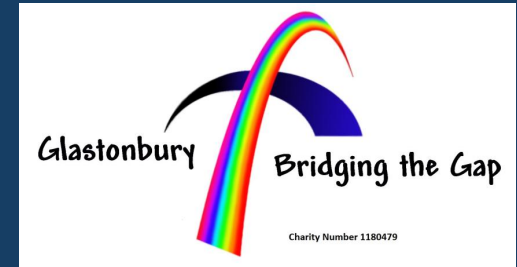


Food poverty can hit anybody, anywhere.

An unexpected bill, a rise in rent, a relationship breakdown, childcare costs.



Glastonbury St Benedict's Ward is in the highest decile of deprivation according to government figures. Over 25% of children in St Benedict's Ward are living in poverty and more than 35% of households in Glastonbury experience deprivation in at least 1 area. Low-paying jobs, a seasonal economy, lack of employment opportunities, dearth of affordable housing, and low-level crime/antisocial behaviour add to the sense of hopelessness for established residents. In addition, Glastonbury has long been a place that draws people, including both tourists and a transient population who come searching for something.





We are a referral only delivery service.

We aim to deliver a week's worth of packaged and fresh foods to recipients.

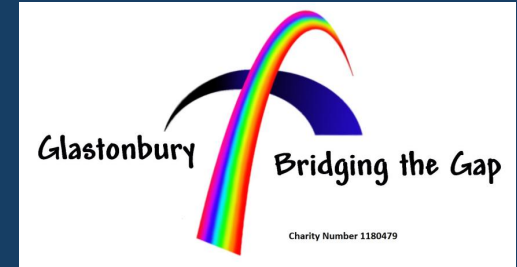

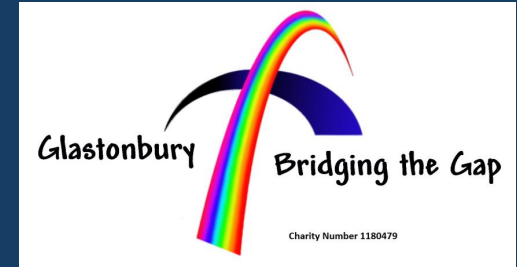


In the last year, we did 606 deliveries in the BA6 and BA16 area.

Over 1100 people benefitted, including more than 350 children.

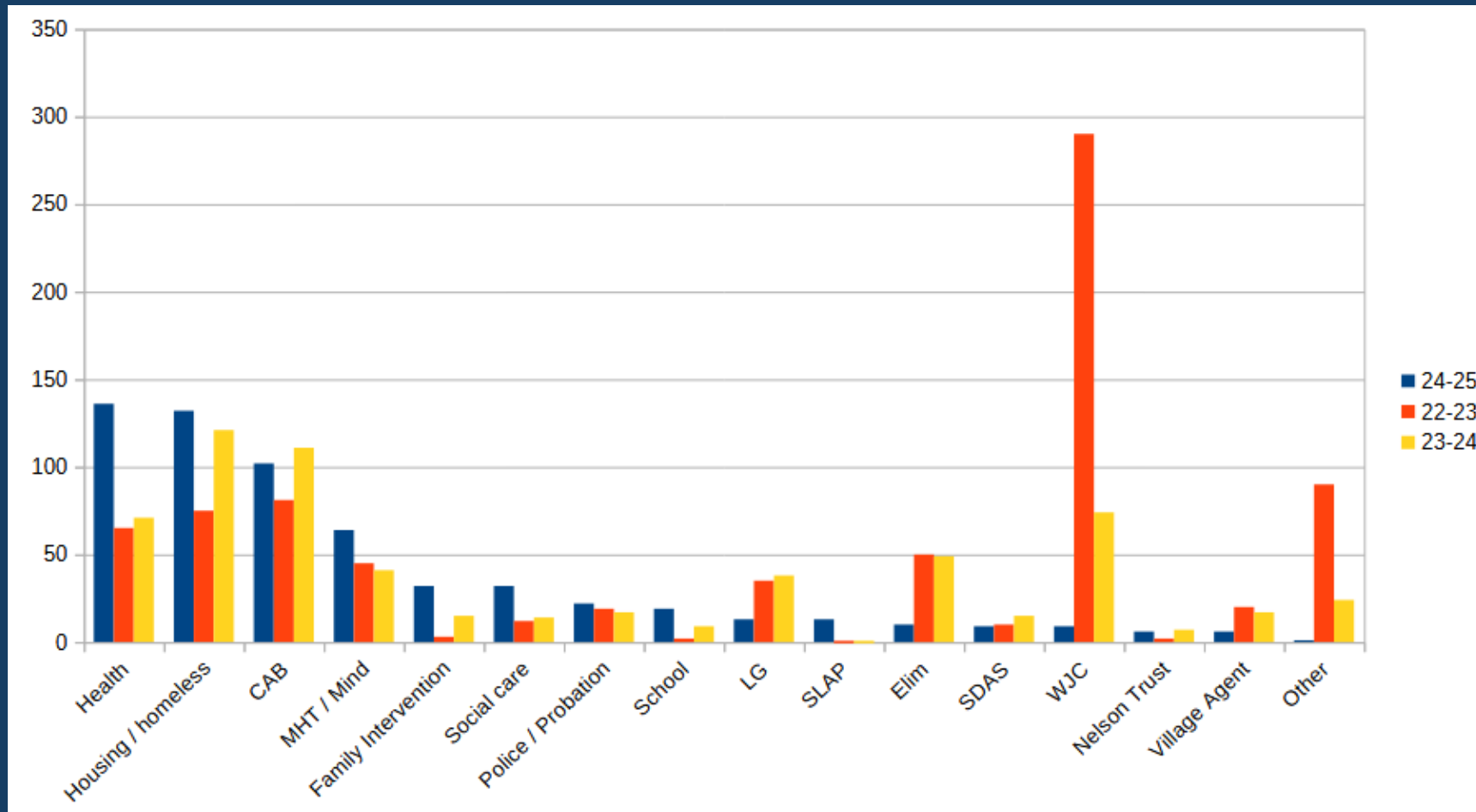
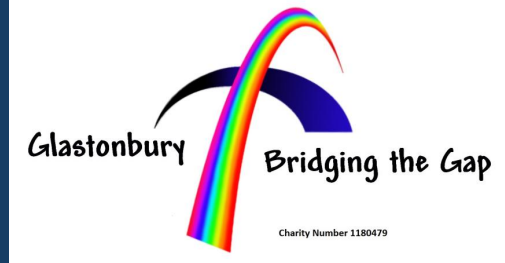

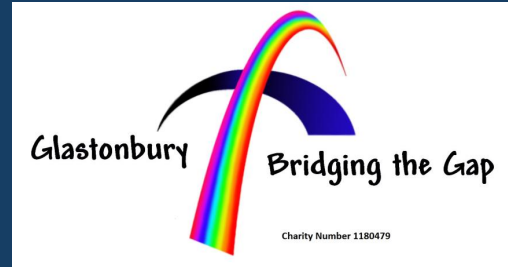

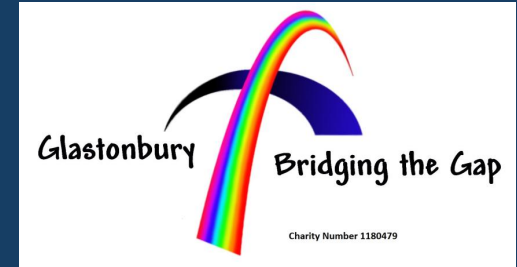
Sample contents of packed parcel for single non-vegetarian

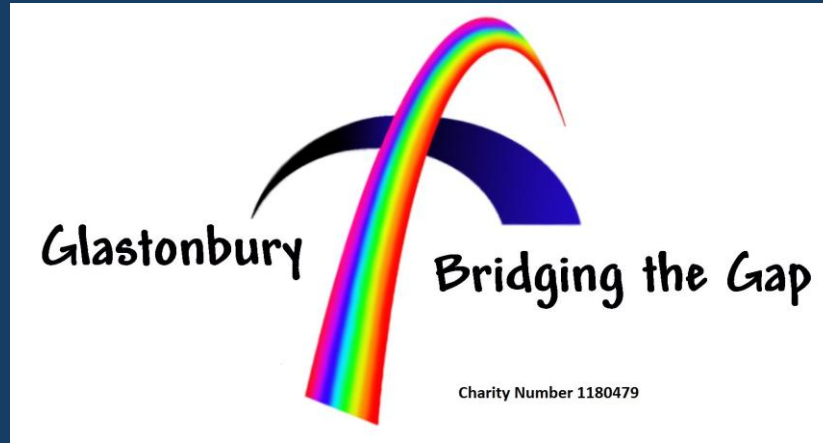



Summary of the purposes of the charity as set out in its governing document	Para 1.17	To alleviate food poverty for people living in the BA6 and BA16 postcode areas. Anyone who is referred by one of our recognised agents/organisations/ individuals is able to benefit. Often the recipients are in disadvantaged groups such as single parents, disabled, travellers, or those having mental health issues. Our volunteers also benefit from the sense of service and involvement in their community. The charity was originally set up by the Churches in the town as a means of sharing the love of Jesus with those in need.

Para 1.17 and 1.19	We work closely with referral agencies and other food providers to provide food and other essential items to people in need. Generally, we deliver a whole week's worth of fresh and ambient food to individual and families. We also provide emergency energy top-ups, gas or other fuel for heating, as well as meeting needs for baby items, toiletries, and sanitary supplies. Where needed, our shelter packs can offer temporary cover and warmth to someone who is homeless, along

		with basic items for preparing and eating food.

Our volunteers are at the heart of the organisation and we normally meet at least twice a year (at the AGM and a Volunteer Meeting) to share information, answer questions and listen to the concerns of our volunteers.

Para 1.20	<p>Despite the difficulties due to COVID, the charity was still able to provide food assistance to 790 adults and 410 children in the year May 2020-April 2021. Some of the circumstances were challenging, including finding caravans in fields to make deliveries, providing food for those with no cooking facilities or being housed temporarily at the Travelodge, or providing for very restrictive diets. This was done in a socially distanced and safe manner. We have worked with other food providers in the local area to ensure that people in genuine need are assisted to overcome their difficulties, and also that requests are not duplicated with multiple agencies. We were unable to hold an in-person Volunteer Meeting due to Covid, but volunteers have grown in confidence and find fulfilment in helping others.</p> <p>Because we receive donations from a wide variety of sources, such as schools, local companies, customers of local supermarkets, we have also been able to highlight the needs of the local community and to demonstrate that food insecurity is an issue that is important not only in large cities but in our own area.</p>

Financial Review

Review of the charity's financial position at the end of the period	Para 1.21	At the end of this financial period, the charity was in a very stable and strong position. This is partly due to the grants we received from local government for supporting food resilience during the pandemic. We do not expect to receive these monies after the pandemic is resolved. Until this year, all of our operating costs have been covered by individual donations, either of money or food items. During lockdown periods, donations of food dropped dramatically, but the monetary donations continued so that we were able to purchase what was needed. Because other local provision developed during the pandemic such as the Community Fridge and Pantry, our expenditure did not increase as much as we may have expected.
Statement explaining the policy for holding reserves stating why they are held	Para 1.22	Our Reserves Policy which was originally adopted in 2020, calls for us to hold funds equal to 6-12 months of the charity's expected expenditure. As noted above, we have received additional grants during the financial period, so we are holding slightly more than what the policy calls for. This is due to the fact that we are currently searching for new premises. We anticipate that if we have to find a commercial premises in the local area, the rent would be substantial. So any extra in our funds is earmarked for rent when we find an appropriate place.
