Chairman's Report

Fundraising activities this year has seen us cook over 175 breakfasts, wheel a very full wheelbarrow around the village, hunt for the yellow bucket (on several occasions), become a human fruit machine, serve 500 ice creams and enjoy some wonderful Christmas Advent windows. Whilst some hard work has been involved, it has been lots of fun and we have raised a considerable amount in 12 months. A ginormous thank you goes to all of you for all you have done to achieve this.

We have a zip wire! After a very successful year fund raising and some very generous donations, we were absolutely chuffed to see the zip wire installed at the end of May.

Another addition at the playing field is some new composite picnic benches, these were purchased by the parish council.

Next on the list is the trim trial. The parish council have once again applied for a CIF grant that if successful will fund 50 % of the cost. We do need to finalise what apparatus we would like it to include, I think a site meeting would be the best idea to discuss as a whole?

As always please continue to monitor and let us know of any maintenance required at the playground. We do need to organise a painting day soon.

Treasurer's Report

The total income for the period 1st November, 2023 to the 31st October, 2024 is £11522.45

Money raised this year from Stoke Goldington Advent Trail was kindly donated to the Playground fund, out of 4 donations received a magnificent £555 was raised.

At the beginning of January, we also received a donation of £5000 from an anonymous resident of the village. This obviously was a huge amount and made a significant input into our zip wire fund raising pot.

We have held 3 Breakfasts at The Reading Room this year in February, May and September, altogether they raised £1224.54. As well as being a successful fundraiser it has been heart warming to see the community cohesion it brings to perhaps residents that wouldn't attend other village events.

Tanya Potts applied for a charity request from her employer David Lock Associates, it was successful, they very kindly donated £1500.

The May breakfast bought about the launch of Jules's wheelbarrow. This was an incredible hit and resulted in £1096 being raised.

1 week later a fabulous team effort at the Car rally held at the Playing field saw us raise a further £800.09. Thank you very much to everyone involved.

We also received a donation of £492 from Kay Thompsons estate. I think Kay would have loved a go on the zip wire!

At the end of May the zip wire was installed. The total cost of this was £16767.78. A CIF grant from MK Council covered half the cost and the remainder we donated to the parish council so they could purchase it on behalf of the village. The siting of the zip wire meant that the playing field football goals needed to be relocated. The playground bought new sockets and concrete to do this.

Our total expenditure for the year therefore is £9247.65.

The total profit for the year was £2274.80. This leaves us with a current account balance as of 1st November, 2024 of £12571.13

Chairman's Report

Following last year's AGM, I attended the November Parish Council meeting to propose our decision of adding some additional play equipment to the playground. The committee decided our order of preference to propose was 1. Zipline 2. Trim Trail 3. Clamberstack. The Parish Council fully supported any additions (be that 1,2 or 3). A site meeting was therefore arranged with play equipment manufacturers; Timotay, Wicksteed and Playdale to discuss suitable places to site and obtain quotes. Quotes received were as follows:

Zipline -

Wicksteed - £11409.63

Discovery Timber Play - £8295.00

Playdale - £18631.46

Timotay - £11000

Zipline, Clamberstack and Trim Trail:

Wicksteed Total - £45211.50

Contact was also made with Phillip Snell, Strategic Landscape and Countryside Manager at Milton Keynes Council to ask for advice re the new equipment. The impression received from his reply that the Council would be happier with us using one of the companies they already work with for the zipline to help with maintenance especially when tensioning the cable.

The Parish Council also asked us to clarify with Phillip if the zipline was to be installed outside the fenced area of the existing playground would it still be covered by the council's maintenance team for maintenance, wear, and repair. As well as if MK Council's insurance covered all liabilities if a zipline was installed. Phillip Snell's reply drew attention to the fact that Parish Councils' public liability insurance covers the playgrounds insurance as the items belong to the parish. As Stoke Goldington Playground bought the new play equipment, this exposed a grey area of who owned the play equipment and therefore if the Parish Council's insurance covered it. A committee meeting of the Playground was formed and the decision made to gift the playground equipment (and any further purchases) to the Parish Council. The gifting letter dated 27th July 2023, stated that the trustees agreed that the basket swing, climbing frame, roundabout, swing seats, playground signs and wet pour safety surface for the slide were gifted to Stoke Goldington Parish Council.

Fundraising this year has been a great success with amounts detailed in the treasurer's report.

In June the Parish Council applied to the Community Infrastructure Fund (CIF) if successful they will receive 50% of the total cost of the zipline. We will hear in April 2024 if this application has been successful. If we are we will have sufficient funds to install the zipline this year!

We have made the playground ours, something we are all very proud of, it is important that we all take responsibility for its upkeep, if anyone spots any jobs that need doing, please let us know on the WhatsApp group so we can get on top of them as soon as possible.

- The quarterly maintenance check of the playground is due. MM will carry this out when she next visits the playground.

Unfortunately, this year the Bowls Club held at the Village Hall folded, they generously chose the Playground fund to donate their £438.20 bank balance to.

The car rally held in May raised an awesome £1010.70. Thank you to everyone involved in collecting bottles, selling tickets, bagging sweets....and serving and selling the ever so popular ice-creams!

Jules's fabulously fabulous wheelie bins made an incredible £2235.89. Thank you Jules I promise not to have an idea and then completely land you with all the donkey work, for a little while now!!

After the last AGM I promised to investigate costs for items on our wish list. I approached Discovery Timber Play (suppliers of the basket swing and climbing frame) the prices I was given on 21st January were as follows (all are excluding VAT):

Clamberstack, Bonded Rubber Mulch & Install £12698.10

30m Zip Wire, Rubber Mats and Install £8295.00

Timber Trim Trail £5871.60

In February Sam Finningan very kindly volunteered to pressure wash the safety surfaces of the playground, removing all the slippery moss and algae. Our very grateful thanks go to Sam for doing this.

In 8th May we all joined together fundraising for the playground at the Car Rally held on the playing field. Thank you to everyone that helped with the bottle tombola, sweet stall and ice cream stall, we raised an incredible amount in an afternoon's work!

The playground committee participated in the Jubilee Flower Festival held by the Church, decorating the pulpit as a helter-skelter!

As part of the villages prize for The Best Kept Village the Parish Council have been given a tree. They are planning to plant this in the playground to provide shade, the preferred proposed site is where the horse chestnut tree used to be near the road. The Parish Council have also suggested that we could install a sail in the corner of the playground near the climbing frame to also provide shade.

The picnic benches have required some maintenance during the year, with Steve Porritt stepping in swiftly before the parish council got to them. Thanks Steve! Thank you also for the help with pruning back the brambles and bushes in the playground, please continue to let us know of any jobs that you spot need doing so we can continue to keep our playground in tip top condition.

Matters Arising from Chairman's Report

- DK suggested to keep on top of any playground maintenance maybe end of season checks could be carried out each quarter. To cover vegetation, safety surface checks and quality of paint on equipment. MM will carry the first one at the end of November/Autumn.
- ES to contact Discovery Timber Play to ask if there is anything we need to do to preserve the longevity of the climbing frame and basket swing.
- Our wish list for new equipment was discussed further and possible sightings. Our existing equipment is more suitable for the younger residents. If the children (and committee) were to have a dream piece of equipment it would be the zipline, just because it's what we would all like to have a go on! However, all the equipment suggested would meet the needs of our older children as well as the younger. The trim trail and clamberstack would probably be easier to obtain a grant for as it meets many educational and healthy If a zipline was installed it would need to be sited probably where the picnic tables are now, as it might be too noisy down the Leaside side and impact the trees/nature area at the far side of the playing field. A trim trail would be less noise and probably could be sited between the trees at the top end of brook side and not impact the residents of Leaside. The clamberstack is big and probably would need to go in the corner near to the basket swing (but outside fenced area). ES to approach the parish council to ask their thoughts re new

Chairman's Report

I had anticipated that it would be a quieter year than last year, but I did not envisage the year we have had!

The trustees at present are: Eleanor Sapwell, Danielle Young and Maxime Marsh. The WhatsApp 'committee' at present are: Eleanor Sapwell, Danielle Young, Maxime Marsh, Georgie Donaghy, Jenny Letts, Julie-anne Newton, Lindsey McCaffrey, Tori Lock and Jo Bull.

The new fully inclusive roundabout was expected to be delivered in early November, due to a manufacturer problem it arrived on 12th December ready for installation by Serco. Installation began on 17th December. Unfortunately, installation was not very straight forward - I had few sleepless nights over it! But eventually in late February a new team of contractors reinstalled it and thankfully we had eventually got a roundabout that whizzed round! It has been a wonderful to see it being used by many and I know of one particular family with a daughter in a wheelchair who are delighted that they can now bring her to play alongside her siblings and peers.

Using money obtained from MK Council Community Infrastructure Fund (grant applied for via SG playground) the Parish Council bought 3 picnic benches, these have been installed on the playing field outside the playground. They also arranged to have the drain that used to regularly flood the car park and entrance to the playground rediverted.

At the end of February, the new swing seats were also installed on the toddler swings and the flat swings.

George Letts painted the playground fence as part of his volunteering section of his Silver Duke of Edinburgh, thank you George it looks much smarter!

Then it all went a bit quiet! Due to Covid lockdown the playground was shut at the end of March, it was a very sad to walk by and see it not being played with, the playground remained shut until 4th July.

The handle of the rocker was replaced by MK Council in early September.

Many thanks to Ken Denoven who very kindly spruced up a very overgrown playground. I hadn't realised how much everything had grown down there! We will need to organise a spruce up party in early Spring to keep on top of all the jobs. We have made the playground ours, something to be proud of, it is important that we all take responsibility for its upkeep, if anyone spots any jobs that need doing please let us know on the whats app group so we can get on top of them as soon as possible.

We have been approached over the last few months to help other villages in their quest to improve their playgrounds, I have shared information with both North Crawley and Ravenstone of how we have gone about improving ours.

Fundraising has not been able to happen this year. We were hoping that we would be able to run some stalls at the classic car rally due to be held on the May bank holiday weekend and also host The Wesley Cup, but unfortunately both events had to be cancelled due to Covid. We therefore have had very little income this year. Obviously fundraising for the forthcoming year will also be very dependent on Covid restrictions but we do need to put some thought into alternative ways of raising some funds to support the playground. It is important that we keep some contingency funds in the bank for maintenance and repair, it is also hoped that we can replace the wetpour safety surface around the slide. I have asked Serco to supply us with a quote for this.

The last question I have is what's next, do we have any further ideas for the playground?

Matters Arising from Chairman's Report

It was discussed that all that could have been done this year was done due to Covid. It was sad to see the playground empty, but how lovely it was to see it alive again when we were allowed to open it again.

The next job to be done which would complete phase 1 of the playground development it to put wetpour around the slide area. We anticipate this to be around £4000. ES to chase quotes for this. Everything is under warranty, so we don't expect much outgoing this year.

We would like to start fundraising again when we are able to and develop the park further with maybe a trim trail or zip line the future.

ES has offered to look into getting grants to improve the tennis courts but this was rejected by the Village Hall Committee.

We need to look at the paintwork in the summer with the view to refreshing it.

Treasurer's Report

Our year end is the 1st November, 2020 however I do not anticipate any further payments in the next 3 days.

The total income for the period 1st November, 2019 to the 31st October, 2020 is £358.25. In mid November we received the awaited £250 grant from Waitrose, Oakgrove for their green token scheme. Easy Fund Raising turns our everyday shopping into donations for us and in November we also received £108.25 from them, thank you very much Danielle for setting this up, It may be an idea to promote this again in the near future?

In early November, a sign was purchased acknowledging the benefactors of the playground at a cost of £52.33. This is now sited at the car park entrance to the playground.

Using the grant awarded by The Postcode Lottery Local Grant we were able to purchase our new accessible roundabout, this was installed just before Christmas. The cost of the roundabout was £6132.00, installation and the wetpour surface cost £4512.00.

We have also purchased new swing seats for both the toddler swings and the flat swings, the cost of these was £300.

Our total expenditure for the year therefore is £10996.33.

This leaves us with a current account balance as of 1st November, 2020 of £4969.19
