Objectives and Activities

The Akhirah Team is a UK based charity established to relieve poverty and hardship through the raising and distribution of charitable donations. The charity exists to support individuals and families experiencing economic disadvantages both in the UK and internationally, providing aid and relief to those most in need.

The charity operates without discrimination. Support is provided regardless of age, ill health, disability, religious belief, gender, or social background. Our work is rooted in the principle that dignity, fairness, and access to basic necessities should be available to all.

Our charitable activities focus on addressing poverty by providing essential support including food aid, financial assistance, clothing, and other services as determined appropriate by the trustees for each project. The charity also delivers targeted humanitarian and development programmes, including funding for medical treatment,

education initiatives, food parcels, and water access projects such as boreholes, hand pumps, RO plants, and water filtration systems.

As a non-profit making organisation, The Akhirah Team's mission is to tackle poverty and improve living conditions in some of the most deprived communities. All programmes are designed to deliver practical impact and meaningful change, with trustees exercising oversight to ensure funds are used responsibly and in line with the charity's objectives.

As Chair of The Akhirah Team, I am proud to present this Trustees' Annual Report for the year ended 31 March 2025. This year has been one of the most demanding and meaningful periods in our charity's journey. In the face of global conflict, humanitarian crises, and rising hardship both overseas and here in the UK, our supporters, volunteers, and trustees stepped forward with unwavering commitment.

From emergency responses across the world, to long-term projects providing clean water, food security, and livelihoods, our work this year reflects the values that have always defined The Akhirah Team: compassion, trust, and responsibility. I would like to sincerely thank our donors, volunteers, partners, and fellow trustees for their continued dedication and trust.

Background

This Trustees' Annual Report has been prepared in accordance with the Charities Act 2011 and covers the activities of The Akhirah Team for the period from **1 April 2024 to 31 March 2025**. The report outlines our charitable objectives, activities, achievements, and governance during the year and demonstrates how the charity has delivered public benefit.

The Akhirah Team is a Charitable Incorporated Organisation governed by its constitution dated 2 November 2018. The charity is managed by a Board of Trustees who meet regularly to oversee strategy, risk, finances, and compliance.

Between April 2024 and March 2025, The Akhirah Team delivered humanitarian aid, seasonal initiatives, and long-term development projects across Asia, Africa, the Middle East, and the UK.

Changes in the structure

During the reporting period, Shishu Miah Ali resigned from his role as Trustee & Secretary at the end of March 2025. The trustees formally record their thanks for his service and contribution to the charity.

A replacement trustee will be appointed as soon as possible, and the trustees are currently in the process of identifying a suitable candidate.

Achievements and Performance

Ramadhan 2024

The charity delivered Ramadhan food parcels and hot meals to approximately 31,128 individuals and families across seven countries. This support helped meet essential food needs during the month of Ramadhan, particularly for vulnerable households facing food insecurity, and ensured regular access to meals during a period of increased financial pressure.



Cakes, Sweet, Ajwa Ramadan 2024/2025

During Ramadan, the charity ran a series of fundraising initiatives including the sale of Ajwa dates, sweets, and our much-loved Double Chocolate Fudge Cakes. All funds raised from the cake, sweets and Ajwa sales were dedicated to supporting Palestine and Lebanon.

These Ramadan initiatives provided a meaningful way for supporters to give during the blessed month while bringing joy to families through shared traditions. The success of these campaigns was driven by the commitment and hard work of our volunteers, who managed operations and deliveries with care and efficiency, ensuring the initiatives ran smoothly and achieved their intended impact.

Fitrana and Fidya Distribution

Through the generous support of our donors, we distributed Fitrana and Fidya to individuals and families in need across Pakistan and Bangladesh. These funds provided essential support, helping households meet basic food and living needs during the month of Ramadhan and at the time of Eid.

Fitrana ensured that vulnerable individuals were able to take part in the Eid celebrations with dignity, while Fidya supported those who were unable to fast due to health or other valid reasons by providing necessary assistance.



Qurbani Initiative

We successfully distributed Qurbani meat to 590 families in Afghanistan, Pakistan, The Gambia, Malawi, Tanzania and Uganda. Thanks to our donor's generosity, fresh meat was distributed to countless families who rarely have the opportunity to enjoy it.

This act of devotion brought smiles and nourishment to those in need, ensuring they could share in the joy of Eid-ul-Adha. This provided hope and comfort to some of the most vulnerable communities.



WATER PROJECTS

In Pakistan, we installed **179 water hand pumps** in rural villages across Punjab, providing local communities with reliable access to clean drinking water and reducing reliance on unsafe water sources. We also constructed a **reverse osmosis (RO) plant**, enabling up to 20,000 families and deprived communities to access clean and safe water on a sustainable basis.



In Bangladesh, we provided **203 water filtration** units, allowing local communities to access clean and safe drinking water. The provision of these units supported improved health and hygiene by reducing exposure to contaminated water, particularly in areas where access to safe drinking water remains limited.



Sustainable Projects

In Bangladesh, we donated **61 Tella's**, providing specially designed carts to individuals for the sale of fruit and vegetables. This initiative supported sustainable income generation by enabling beneficiaries to establish small businesses, helping families work towards financial stability and improved living conditions.



Tandoor Project

In Pakistan, the Tandoor project provided bread twice a day to **460 people** at a local village, supporting deprived communities through the regular provision of a basic staple food.



Education Initiatives

In Bangladesh, we distributed **58 school bags** to children from low-income households to support access to education. This ensured pupils were equipped with essential learning materials, helping to reduce barriers to school attendance and support continued participation in education. We also distributed over 500 copies of the Qur'an to individuals and community settings, supporting religious education and spiritual development. This enabled access to essential religious texts, particularly for those who may otherwise face barriers in obtaining them.

Hifaz Project

The Hifz Sponsorship Project supports 10 young individuals undertaking the memorisation of the Quran by providing essential resources alongside structured guidance and mentorship.

The initiative promotes both spiritual and educational development, enabling participants to continue their Hifz journey within a supportive and focused environment. As an ongoing project, it continues to inform future planning while aiming to deliver sustainable, long-term benefits to both individuals and the wider community.



Construction Projects

In Bangladesh, we distributed corrugated sheets to approximately **45 deprived families** to support home repairs and improvements. The provision of these materials enabled households to repair or replace damaged roofing, helping to improve living conditions and provide safer, more secure shelter.



Monthly Sadaqah Projects Delivered During 2024-2025

During the 2024 to 2025 financial year, the Monthly Sadaqah Projects continued to respond to a wide range of needs across multiple countries, delivering consistent and practical support through donor contributions.

The year began with the renovation of a madrassah in Kusia, Sylhet, Bangladesh in April 2024, improving the learning environment for students.

In May 2024, funds supported a general feeding programme for impoverished communities in Malawi. June 2024 focused on livelihood support in Afghanistan through the provision of chicken and juice carts, enabling individuals to generate sustainable income.



In July 2024, the charity provided 14 sewing machines to beneficiaries in Sylhet, Bangladesh, supporting skills development and self-reliance.



August 2024 saw the delivery of regular meals to children and teachers across three orphanages in The Gambia, benefiting hundreds of individuals through daily breakfasts and lunches.



In September 2024, essential housing repairs were carried out in West Africa through the rebuilding of a ceiling and veranda for a family home in The Gambia.

October 2024 focused on improving access to clean water through the delivery of a water project in Tanzania.



In November 2024, the Monthly Sadaqah Project supported orphaned children in Afghanistan by providing new footwear, nutritious meals, and a day of care and wellbeing.



December 2024 involved a partnership with Give a Gift in Leeds, through which food, essential items, and support were provided to over 100 vulnerable families in Leeds during a challenging period.



From January to March 2025, projects continued to deliver daily impact. In Malawi, 50 of the most vulnerable individuals, including widows, people with disabilities, and those experiencing homelessness, received warm and nutritious meals on a daily basis in Limbe near Blantyre. During the holy month of Ramadan, support was extended to four areas within the Sylhet district of Bangladesh, where 250 families received rice distributions to meet essential nutritional needs. Additionally, Sadaqah funds enabled the provision of a wheelchair for an elderly woman following a leg amputation, restoring vital mobility and independence.



Across the year, the Monthly Sadaqah Projects reflected the charity's commitment to addressing immediate hardship while supporting dignity, sustainability, and long-term wellbeing for individuals and communities both internationally and within the UK.

Volunteer and Fundraising

Volunteers continued to play a central role in the charity’s fundraising and community engagement activities throughout the year. Their commitment, time, and energy enabled the charity to deliver events that not only raised funds but also strengthened partnerships and community involvement.

In May 2024, volunteers took part in a united fundraising hike at Mount Snowdon in Wales in support of Palestine. This event was delivered in collaboration with One Nation and Hope Welfare Trust and brought together supporters from different organisations in a shared effort to raise awareness and funds for humanitarian relief.



In September 2024, volunteers organised and participated in a Manchester to Leeds sponsored walk for Palestine. The event demonstrated strong community solidarity and provided an opportunity for supporters to actively contribute through physical challenge and collective action.



In December 2024, the charity held a Winter Family Fun Day in partnership with Junior Supports Hub. This community focused event provided a welcoming space for families while raising funds and awareness, highlighting the importance of accessible and inclusive fundraising activities.

These initiatives reflect the dedication of our volunteers and the strength of our partnerships. Their ongoing support continues to be vital in enabling the charity to deliver its work and extend its reach across both local and international projects.

The Giving Day Initiative

Local businesses/organisations continued to play an important role in supporting the charity during the 2024 to 2025 financial year. Several partners, including **Chicken Shack, Osmandthorpe Lane Masjid, SC Glamour, BISON, Naheem Barbers, Ice Scoop, Nanu Sports Foundation. Goat Training and Eye 2 Eye** once again worked alongside the charity by generously donating a portion or, in some cases, all their profits towards charitable causes.

The continued support of these businesses reflects strong community relationships and shared values. Their ongoing collaboration demonstrated a collective commitment to giving back and contributed meaningfully to the charity's ability to deliver its projects and support those in need.

Deployment

During the 2024 to 2025 financial year, the charity undertook several international deployments to support the delivery, monitoring, and implementation of key projects on the ground.

In April 2024, members of the team travelled to Egypt to support humanitarian efforts for Gaza. The deployment focused on assisting with the loading and preparation of aid trucks, ensuring essential supplies were organised and ready for onward distribution.

In September 2024, the team deployed to Bangladesh to oversee the delivery of multiple projects. These included the installation of Tella distribution, water filtration units, the distribution of corrugated sheets to support housing repairs, food parcel distributions, and the delivery of feeding programmes. This deployment allowed the team to directly monitor project delivery and engage with local communities to ensure support reached those most in need.

In November 2024, further deployments were carried out in Tanzania and Malawi. In Tanzania, the team conducted cataract eye screenings alongside feeding programmes, providing essential medical support and nutritious meals to vulnerable communities. The visit also included assessments of potential future projects for consideration. In Malawi, the team reviewed existing projects and supported the opening of a masjid funded by a donor, as well as a borehole delivered as part of the Monthly Sadaqah Project.



These deployments played an important role in maintaining accountability, strengthening relationships with local partners, and ensuring the effective delivery of charitable activities across all regions supported by the charity.

Emergency and Humanitarian Relief

Emergency appeals formed a major part of the charity's work during the year. Food parcels were delivered to Bangladesh Flood appeal.



Aid was delivered to Gaza and Palestine for hot meals, baby milk, water tanks and cash assistance.



Communications

The charity kept supporters informed through regular updates on social media and community channels, sharing project outcomes, emergency appeals, and deployment updates to maintain transparency and accountability.

Financial Review

Brief statement of the charity's policy on reserves

The Financial Statements were prepared for the 12 months ended 31 March 2025. At the end of the financial year, the charity had a surplus balance to fund charitable projects due at the beginning of the next financial year.

Statement of trustees' responsibilities

The trustees are responsible for preparing the Trustees' Annual Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

Law applicable to charities in England and Wales requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of charity and of the incoming resources and application of resources of the charity for that year. In preparing these financial statements the trustees are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently.
- observe the methods and principles in the Charities SORP;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; state whether applicable UK Accounting Standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements and;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in operation.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities Act 2011 and the Charity (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Changes in the structure

Achievements and Performance

Tella Project (Bangladesh):

This initiative provided specially designed carts to individuals for selling fruits and vegetables, creating sustainable income opportunities. By equipping them with the means to start their own small businesses, the project has empowered families to achieve financial independence and improve their standard of living.



Sewing Machine Project (Bangladesh & Pakistan):

This project distributed sewing machines to underprivileged women and men with no means of income, empowering them to earn a living through tailoring. It has provided a vital lifeline for these women and men to achieve financial independence and support their families.



The Water Borehole Project in Pakistan, Bangladesh, and Malawi: provides essential clean water solutions to underprivileged communities. These boreholes play a pivotal role in enhancing health and sanitation, reducing waterborne diseases, and easing the burden on families who previously travelled long distances to fetch water. Each borehole serves as a lifeline, transforming lives and empowering communities to thrive.



The Widow Support Project in Pakistan: offers vital assistance to widows by providing regular food parcels and access to daily tandoor services, supplying fresh bread or naan twice a day. This initiative ensures food security, eased financial burdens, and supported widows in maintaining their dignity and well-being during challenging times.



Community Engagement Projects

Engaging our local communities through sports and activities has been a cornerstone of our fundraising efforts, allowing us to unite people around shared passions while supporting important causes. In 2023–2024, we organised a series of dynamic events that not only raised critical funds but also fostered a sense of unity, purpose, and camaraderie.

Football Tournament for Girls' Madrasah in Bangladesh:

We hosted an exciting football tournament dedicated to raising funds for a Girls' Madrasah in Bangladesh. This event brought together teams from across the community, encouraging participation while spotlighting the importance of education for young girls. The funds raised helped provide essential resources to the Madrasah, empowering the students with an environment conducive to learning and spiritual growth.



Non-Stop Football Tournament for Palestine:



This six-hour non-stop football tournament brought together 40 dedicated players from Leeds and Manchester. Participants demonstrated remarkable energy and commitment, playing back-to-back matches to raise funds for

Palestinian relief. The event served as both a powerful act of solidarity with the people of Palestine and a testament to the strength of community spirit, with players and supporters alike coming together for a shared humanitarian cause.

Khan Badminton Club Charity Tournament for Palestine:

Organised in collaboration with the Islamic Centre for Gaza/Palestine and the community of Leeds, the Khan Badminton Club Charity Tournament was a vibrant and impactful event. Players from diverse backgrounds competed with enthusiasm, with proceeds dedicated to supporting relief efforts in Gaza and Palestine. The tournament provided an opportunity for community members to contribute meaningfully while promoting health, fitness, and goodwill. Through these initiatives, we have successfully combined community engagement with charitable giving, demonstrating how sports and shared activities can inspire change and make a lasting impact on lives far beyond our borders.



Strengthening Faith and Community

The **Masjid Development Project** in Malawi supported the construction of a masjid, creating a vital space for prayer, learning, and community gatherings. To foster community engagement, feeding programs were conducted, benefiting hundreds and strengthening bonds within the local population.



The **Hifz Sponsorship Project** in Pakistan is a pilot project which supported individuals in memorising the Quran by providing essential resources, guidance, and mentorship. This initiative fostered both spiritual and academic growth, empowering participants to preserve and cherish the Quran while building a foundation for personal and community development.



Gaza and Global Emergency Appeal:

Delivered critical aid to regions impacted by conflict and disasters, including Gaza, Lebanon, Morocco, Bangladesh floods and Afghanistan. This project provided essential support such as food, medical supplies, and shelter, offering relief to vulnerable communities during times of crisis.



Monthly Sadaqah Projects Delivered During 2023/2024:

In 2023 and early 2024, the Monthly Sadaqah Projects addressed diverse needs globally & locally, including providing school uniforms, shoes, and madrassah supplies for children, renovating a mosque, and enhancing learning conditions in Pakistan, Kenya, The Gambia, and Bangladesh.



Humanitarian aid efforts included feeding programmes, food parcels, and blankets for vulnerable families in Bangladesh and Afghanistan, as well as support for homeless individuals in Leeds. The projects also funded water boreholes, housing for widows, and wedding support in Pakistan, and collaborated with Give a Gift to bring Eid joy to vulnerable children, including refugees and asylum seekers in Leeds.



Volunteer and Fundraising Efforts

Extreme Challenges for Charity:

Organised marathon challenges to support Palestine and a Ben Nevis climb by the inspiring Halifax sisters to raise funds for orphans in The Gambia. These remarkable efforts united communities, generating vital resources for vulnerable children while showcasing resilience and solidarity.



The Giving Day Initiative united local businesses, including HFC, Cardigan Fish Bar, Legends, Charcoal Chicken, Osmandthorpe Lane Masjid, SC Glamour, BISON, and Ice Scoop, who generously contributed a portion or all of their profits to support meaningful causes. This collaborative effort exemplified community spirit and solidarity, bringing together businesses and individuals to create a significant and lasting impact.



Charity BBQs

Throughout 2023 and 2024, our dedicated volunteers organised a series of charity BBQs to raise funds for Turkey, Palestine and a Girls Madrassah in Bangladesh. Their hard work and commitment brought communities together, not only to enjoy delicious meals but also to support meaningful causes.



In Turkey and Palestine, the funds also played a vital role in supporting earthquake victims, providing essential food parcels and medical aid to those in desperate need. These efforts extended beyond education, bringing relief to vulnerable communities during times of crisis.

Through their unwavering dedication, the volunteers have significantly empowered young girls through education, offering them opportunities for a brighter future, while also standing in solidarity with disaster-affected regions. Their commitment has been instrumental in the success of these impactful initiatives.

House Build Projects Update

We have successfully completed house build projects in Bangladesh, Turkey (in response to the devastating earthquake), and Pakistan.



In Bangladesh, we provided secure housing for families struggling with inadequate shelter. In Turkey, we stepped in to support those who lost everything during the earthquake, giving them a safe place to begin rebuilding their lives. In Pakistan, we offered stable homes to vulnerable families, ensuring they could live with dignity and security.



Water Projects in Pakistan & Bangladesh

In 2023 and 2024, we made significant strides in improving water access by completing the installation of 122 water handpumps across Pakistan and Bangladesh and a borehole in a rural village in Pakistan. These initiatives



provided clean, reliable water sources for underserved communities, alleviating the challenges of water scarcity and promoting better health. The borehole specifically targeted a remote village, serving the most vulnerable and ensuring equitable access to this vital resource. Together, these projects exemplify our commitment to sustainable solutions that transform lives and empower communities.

Water Filters Bangladesh

In 2023, we distributed 300 portable water filters to the most vulnerable communities in Bangladesh. These innovative filters transform contaminated water into safe drinking water, addressing critical health risks and ensuring access to a fundamental resource. This initiative provides an immediate and sustainable solution for families in need, reducing waterborne illnesses and promoting well-being. By empowering communities with these portable tools, we continue to make strides in improving lives through practical and impactful interventions.



Ramadan Feeding Projects 2023 (Food Parcels & Hot Meals)

Our Ramadan Feeding Projects for 2023 were successfully completed in Pakistan, India, Bangladesh, The Gambia, Malawi, and Tanzania. With our donor's



incredible support, we were able to provide essential food packs to struggling families, ensuring they had enough to eat during the blessed month of Ramadan.

These food packs offered much-needed relief and allowed countless individuals to focus on their worship without worrying about where their next meal would come from. Our donor's contributions brought hope, comfort, and ease to so many.

The Hot Meals Programme in Pakistan, Bangladesh, The Gambia, Afghanistan and Malawi provided freshly prepared meals to vulnerable individuals, delivering immediate food



relief. Focused on children, the elderly, and families in need, the programme alleviated hunger while offering comfort and hope to communities affected by poverty and crises.

Cakes, Sweet, Ajwa Ramadan 2023/2024



During Ramadan 2023 and 2024, our efforts included the sale of Ajwa dates, sweets, and our ever-popular Double Chocolate Fudge Cakes. A percentage of the proceeds from Ajwa and sweets sales were allocated to support our broader charitable projects, ensuring a wider impact across our initiatives. Meanwhile, all funds raised through cake sales were dedicated to supporting KORT (Kashmir Orphans Relief Trust). These campaigns not only brought joy and sweetness to families during the blessed month but also played a significant role in

advancing our mission. The success of these efforts was made possible by the tireless dedication and hard work of our volunteers, who ensured smooth operations and timely deliveries, making a real difference in the lives of those we aim to serve.

Fitrana and Fidya Distribution Update

With our donor's generous contributions, we successfully distributed Fitrana and Fidya to those in need in Pakistan and Bangladesh. These funds provided essential support to families, ensuring they had food and necessities, especially during Ramadan and Eid.

Fitrana helped ensure that even the most vulnerable could join in the joy of Eid, while Fidya provided relief to those unable to fast due to health or other valid reasons.



Qurbani

We successfully carried out Qurbani in Pakistan, Bangladesh, The Gambia, Malawi, Tanzania, and India. Thanks to our donor's generosity, fresh meat was distributed to countless families who rarely have the opportunity to enjoy it.

This act of devotion brought smiles and nourishment to those in need, ensuring they could share in the joy of Eid-ul-Adha. This provided hope and comfort to some of the most vulnerable communities.



Deployments

Our team's unwavering dedication and commitment to serving those in need were demonstrated through impactful deployments across the globe during 2023 and 2024. These efforts, supported by the generosity of our donors and the hard work of our volunteers, brought relief and hope to vulnerable communities facing immense challenges.

September 2023 – Bangladesh Deployment

In September 2023, the Secretary, accompanied by a core team member and a



dedicated volunteer, deployed Ramadan 2023 funds to make a tangible difference in Sylhet. Key initiatives included the provision of rickshaws for

livelihoods, distribution of water filters, school bags, blankets for the homeless, hot meals, and food parcels. These efforts provided much-needed support to families and individuals struggling with poverty and hardship.

September/October 2023 – Turkey Earthquake Deployment

The Chairman, alongside two passionate volunteers, travelled to Turkey in collaboration with our partners at One Nation. This deployment focused on delivering aid funded by our Turkey Earthquake Appeal, including essential



resources to support communities devastated by the earthquake. The visit underscored the importance of solidarity and timely response in the face of disaster.

**January 2024 –
Morocco Earthquake
Deployment**

In January 2024, one of our core team members joined forces with volunteers from Nanu Football Academy to respond to the Morocco earthquake emergency appeal. Working in partnership, they distributed clothing, food parcels, and other essentials to families in



the affected Atlas Mountains region. This collaborative effort ensured that aid reached some of the hardest-hit and most remote communities.

Through these deployments, we have witnessed the incredible impact of collective action. From responding to natural disasters to addressing the day-to-day struggles of underserved communities, we remain steadfast in our mission to bring relief and hope wherever it is needed most.

Financial Review

Brief statement of the charity's policy on reserves

The Financial Statements were prepared for the 12 months ended 31 March 2024. At the end of the financial year, the charity had a surplus balance to fund charitable projects due at the beginning of the next financial year.

Water projects

The provision of access to clean water is vital and fundamental to ensuring the basic human right of all individuals. It brings ongoing benefits to numerous children, families, and elders in impoverished communities. Clean water plays a critical role in changing and saving lives by preventing illnesses and reducing loss of life. This year, we were able to make a difference by aiding in the construction of water boreholes in Malawi and water pumps in Pakistan. These projects have extended the privilege and life-changing

Often, these communities do not have the financial means to construct even makeshift, temporary shelters.

Winter Appeal: Bangladesh, Pakistan & Afghanistan

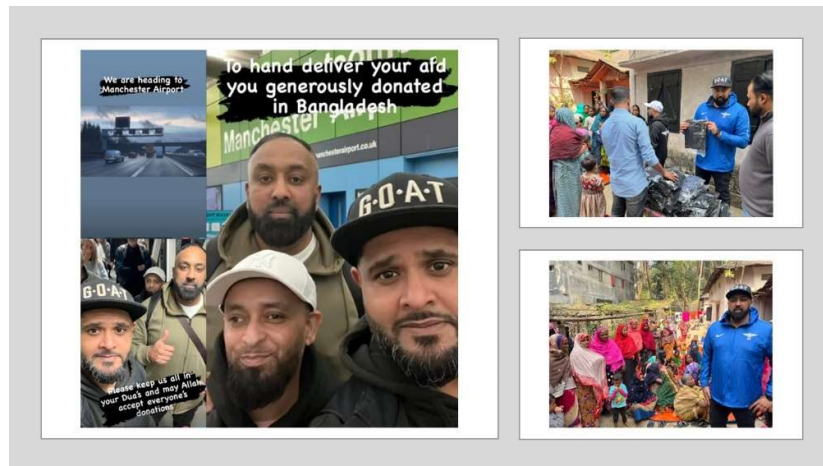

Turkey/Syria Campaign Launched

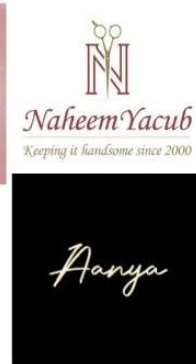

Our Cake A Difference campaign was especially pleasing & very well received as we were selling Deluxe Double Chocolate Fudge cake for £10 each that included delivery too!

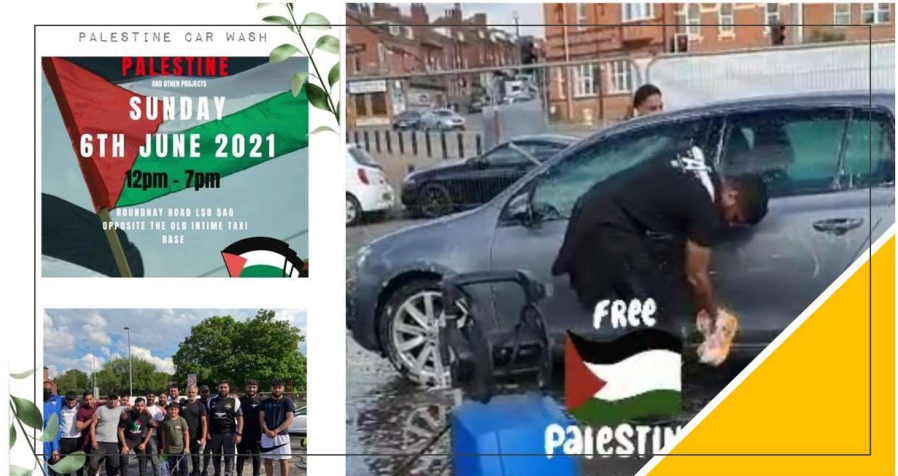


FITRANA

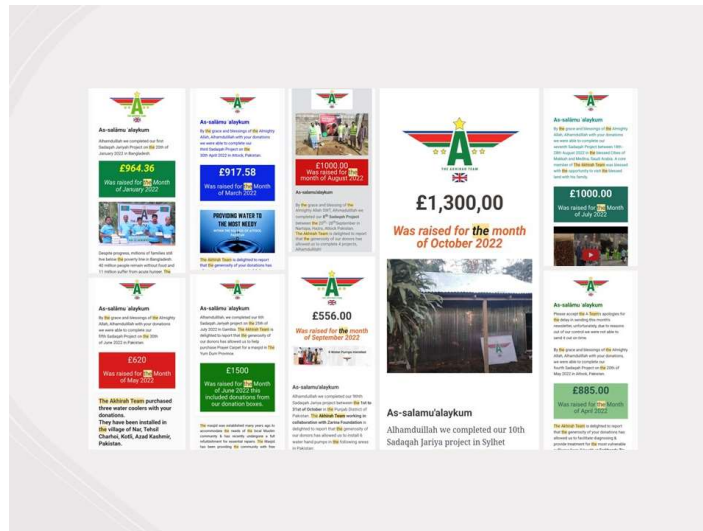
These packs contained warm blankets & basic food essentials for distribution to the poorest families to help them through the winter months.

Our mission statement as a non-profit making organisation and charity is to tackle poverty and assist people in the most deprived communities in the UK and around the world. All of our programmes aim to change the lives of people and benefit them in terms of providing donations and funding for medical treatments, schools, orphanages, food parcels, water wells and other causes for which our charity makes the executive decisions to raise funds for.

BACKGROUND

In 2018 five friends from Leeds who share a similar passion for charity work came together with aspirations of making a positive difference in this world by helping people affected by humanitarian disasters and poverty. The scope of this work was going to be both national and international. Two projects were identified at this early stage. Firstly to help the Rohingya people fleeing the genocide underway in Myanmar in 2018 and secondly to meet the challenge of building a mosque within the thirty days Ramadhan 2018 for the small Muslim community living in Stornaway in the Outer Hebrides.

Our decision to become a registered charity was influenced largely by the surprisingly broad media publicity we received from these early projects. We found ourselves unexpectedly inundated by SOS messages (both from the UK and from abroad) from individuals and Organisations alike. It was at this point that we realised that it was necessary for us to formally register a charity in order to effectively respond to these national and international calls for help. The Akhirah Team was thus formally incorporated into a registered charity on the 2nd November 2018 to meet these needs.

One of the first appeals we respond to as a registered charity was a request for help from a remote village in The Gambia. In the early days we lacked the robust infrastructure necessary to pull off a project on such a scale entirely on our own, as well as possessing limited experience of intercontinental project delivery. What we did have an abundance of was a great deal of heart and an instinctive desire to bring about positive change to the lives of the people of The Gambia. At this point our delivery strategy was extremely simple. We raise the necessary funds, provide financial help and material support and allow the people of The Gambia take a lead on the ground. This allows us to develop strong local networks and partnerships, while maintaining optimal transparency. Our modus operandi for international projects has remained the same since. We actively seek to work with our local partners on equal standing and encourage meaningful local grassroots involvement.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

Charity Gala Dinner 2019

The Inaugural Charity Gala Dinner 2019 hosted by The Akhirah Team, was held at the Queen Ethelberga's Collegiate in York. Two hundred guests including supporters, volunteers, donors and business sponsors attended this impressively memorable event. The evening offered the opportunity to showcase, celebrate and recognise some of the individuals (both patrons and volunteers) on the frontlines who have worked with committed determination to make our work in West Africa possible.

Drive UK driving school & Rochdale Crescent Radio

Alhamdulillah the Driving school community in Rochdale came together for the Yemen Appeal; and the brothers and sisters of Rochdale managed to raise a staggering £6243.00 for the cause. Brother Asmat and the entire team of volunteers who worked tirelessly on this occasion warrant a special mention. Thank you all! Your passion, enthusiasm and devotion were catching, helping ensure a great result and making it a truly memorable day.

Five Aside Football Tournament


