- Promoted volunteer contribution of members both financially and physically to deliver goods and medicine to in need. Financial contribution toward building the Charity's place of worship was continued as can be seen on the financial statement provided.
- Continuance of help and/or advice to the charity members who were under undue stress due to loss of a family member because of Covid19 and other medical/natural causes.
- Due to Covid19 lockdown Buddha Jayanti celebration, generally held in May every year, was postponed until May 2023.
- Continued raising awareness of Equality, human right issues and discipline to the members and wider community.

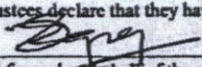
Objectives and activities

- to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

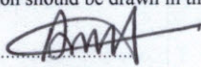
Independent Examiner's Statement

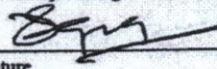
