Our services put faith and worship into practice through prayer, scripture and music.</p> <p>We enable people to live out their faith with like-minded yet a diverse group of people through prayer, the Word and worship; through providing pastoral care for people in the community and through outreach work.</p> <p>The main activities undertaken for public benefit this year in relation to advancing the Christian faith include holding regular services on Sunday afternoons which consist of praise & worship, sermons, prayer; a Sunday School for children under the age of 10; and a Teens Church for young people between the ages of 11&18.</p> <p>On Tuesday evenings the church holds a Bible Study class for those who wish to learn more about the Bible. We also hold regular prayer meetings throughout the week.</p> <p>The church has provided welfare to needy church members by providing food, financial support and advice regarding money management, mentoring and academic support.</p>

		<p>The Church currently holds both in-person and online activities.</p> <p>In August 2022, the Church organised an outreach program both in London and Birmingham to reach out to the needy and offered personal development sessions.</p> <p>Throughout the year, the Church held several camp meetings for Youth and Young adults to provide a learning and educative platform for them.</p> <p>In June 2022, the Church held BBQ party. The less privilege in the community were invited to be fed and be given clothes, food and drinks</p> <p>During the summer holidays when the children were returning to their various schools, the church gave vouchers from selected supermarket to the single parent homes.</p>
