Constitution

Soft Bones UK Foundation is constituted by a conveyance document dated 16th September 2018 and is registered with the Charity Commission under Charity Number 1181117.

Organisation

The charity is administered by an elected board of Trustees who normally meet a minimum of three times a year. The names of serving trustees and the other charity particulars are listed above. New or co-opted members are appointed, inducted and given details of their responsibilities by the Trustees and very little continuous training is required.

Aims and Objectives

The charity aims are to promote greater understanding of the causes, symptoms and treatment of Hypophosphatasia (HPP); to raise public awareness of the symptoms, needs and related medical conditions of those living with HPP and to assist people, their relatives and carers to get in contact with each other and to exchange information and experiences.

Achievements (April 2023 – March 2024)

Meryl Chambers, Chair, attended the OIFE Topical Meeting 2023: Balancing Life with OI: Pain and its impact in Stockholm in June 2023. This included discussions on pain in OI and other rare bone conditions, commonalities and differences and how we can work together. Meryl Chambers presented at the conference to inform the audience of Hypophosphatasia, the symptoms and HPP testimonials. Meryl Chambers also took part in a panel debate on pain across rare bone disease groups as a representative from the HPP community.
