Report of the Trustees

The Trustees present the Annual Report and Financial Statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2025.

Objects and Activities

The object of the Charity is to benefit the public by encouraging support through prayer, personal service and financial grants, in order to advance the Christian faith in the Episcopal/Anglican Province of Alexandria, to provide and maintain its church buildings and to enable public worship, pastoral care, outreach and witness, training and education, healthcare, relief of poverty and community development.

The Province of Alexandria has four dioceses, Egypt, North Africa, the Horn of Africa, and Gambella. Under the overall leadership of Archbishop Samy Shehata, these dioceses are led respectively by Bishops Ashley Null, Martin Reakes-Williams, and Jeremiah Paul Koryom.

During this year, our principal activities included:

Promoting Support and Interest in the Province

During the year, Trustees met three times by Zoom to be updated on life and ministry in the Province, review our trustee group, membership and giving, and conduct other business. We were invited to be represented and attend online the afternoon open gathering with the JMECA Council and Provincial Bishops on 26 November at Westminster Abbey.

Communication with members and friends

Two FAPA newsletters were published in 2025 and distributed to about 100 FAPA members and sister organisations who share similar interests in Anglican/Episcopal churches in the region.

Praying for the Province

Zoom prayer meetings, led by Chairman Mike, were held in January, March, September and November, each time offering afternoon and evening sessions.

Exploring options to offer a Pilgrimage Tour to Egypt.

We continue to commend extended study opportunities in Cairo, Alexandria and at Anafora Retreat Centre. This provides possibilities for study leave or sabbaticals in the Province to:

- experience the living Christian faith and worship of Anglican/Episcopal congregations, and their ecumenical links with Coptic and other churches
- explore 'Interfaith' through the Diocese's agencies and contacts at Al-Azhar University
- discover the warm welcome and vibrant contemporary life, worship and ministry of the monasteries of the Egyptian desert
- encounter the social justice and refugee ministries of the Diocese of Egypt
- pursue individual research or participate in study at the Alexandria School of Theology

We continue to review our role and possibilities of closer collaboration with other networks

Financial Review

The Charity received Unrestricted income of £7,020 from individuals, and £16,208 as restricted donations. A charity can claim Gift Aid of 25% of donations from individuals who pay tax and have signed a Gift Aid form. Income from donations and subscriptions include the Gift Aid the charity has claimed. The charity remitted £15,745 for the Province of Alexandria which comprised income donated for specific purposes of £9,895 and £5,850 from general donations remitted to be used at the discretion of the Archbishop. The charity also supported the expenditure for the Diocese of North Africa totalling £9,313 with donations specifically received for this purpose.

The Charity is immensely thankful to all individual donors and partner church donors for their generous donations as this has enabled FAPA to make significant grants to support the activities of the Anglican Province of Alexandria.

We believe the most significant risk is sustainability of donations.

General Reserves

The Trustees consider that approximately £1,500 should be retained to meet future needs of the charity. At 31 December 2025 the level of unrestricted reserves was £2,583. The charity received a legacy of £1,000 at the end of the year and hence the level of unrestricted reserves at the year end was higher than anticipated.

Report of the Trustees

The Trustees present their annual report and financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2024

Objects and Activities

The object of the Charity is to benefit the public by encouraging support with financial grants, prayer and personal service in order to advance the Christian faith in the Episcopal/Anglican Province of Alexandria - to provide and maintain its church buildings and to enable public worship, pastoral care, outreach and witness, training and education, healthcare, the relief of poverty and community development.

The Province of Alexandria contains four dioceses (Egypt, North Africa, the Horn of Africa, and Gambella) which are being established over a five-year transition period. Bishop Anthony Ball, Chair of The Jerusalem & Middle East Church Association, is tasked with establishing the legal and administrative arrangements for the three new dioceses of North Africa, Horn of Africa and Gambella. Diocesan Synods have been held in all four Dioceses during the year, and the Consecration of Bishops took place in Chad on 17 January: Venerable Jeremiah Paul Koryom – Gambella; Revd Canon Martin Reakes – Williams-The Horn of Africa; Bishop Anthony Ball – North Africa

Promoting Support and Interest in the Province The Trustees have met remotely by “zoom” to conduct business during the year; members were invited to attend the afternoon Open Gathering of the JMECA and Diocesan Bishops Meeting on 27 November at St Margaret’s Westminster .(in person or via Zoom).

The Pilgrimage Study Tour to Tunisia took place in April 2024. FAPA Deputy Charman, Richard Hibbert reported that 11 FAPA members/friends participated and found the experience hugely significant.

Extended Study Opportunities Trustee Christopher Andrews continues to promote an Extended Study Opportunities programme in Cairo, Alexandria and at Anafora Retreat Centre – an opportunity for persons exploring the possibilities of study leave or a sabbatical in the Province to:

- Experience the living Christian faith and worship of Anglican Episcopal congregations and ecumenical links with the Coptic and other churches;
- Explore ‘Interfaith’ through the Diocese's networks and contacts at Al-Azhar University, Cairo;
- Discover the warm welcome and vibrant contemporary life, worship and ministry of the monasteries of the Egyptian desert;
- Encounter the social justice ministry of the Diocese of Egypt;
- Pursue individual research or participate in a course of theological study at the Alexandria School of Theology.

FAPA Role Review Archbishop Samy has given support to a proposal that that the new Province might be better supported by an ‘amalgamation’ of FAPA and FACE with JMECA. FAPA Chairman will lead the consultation.

Communication. Three FAPA newsletters were published in 2024 and distributed widely to sister organisations and to about 100 FAPA members.

The FAPA web site www.fapa-egypt.org is the main vehicle for equipping and inspiring members to pray for the Province - a vital FAPA mission activity.

Financial Review

The Charity received Unrestricted income of £5,356 from individuals, and £60,997 from individuals and two partner churches as restricted donations. A charity can claim Gift Aid of 25% of donations from individuals who pay tax and have signed a Gift Aid form. Income from donations and subscriptions include the Gift Aid the charity has claimed. The charity remitted £44,952 for the Province of Alexandria which comprised income donated for specific purposes of £40,360 and £4,850 from general donations remitted to be used at the discretion of the Archbishop. The charity also supported the expenditure for the Diocese of North Africa totalling £15,846 with donations specifically received for this purpose

The Charity is immensely thankful to all individual donors and partner church donors for their generous donations as this has enabled FAPA to make significant grants to support the activities of the Province of Alexandria.

The most significant risk is sustainability of donations.

Structure and Governance

The Charity was registered as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation on 17 December 2018, having been reconstituted from the previously unincorporated Charity number 209145. The Charity changed its name from the Egypt Diocesan Association (EDA) to Friends of the Anglican Province of Alexandria (FAPA) in June 2020. Report of the Trustees

The Trustees present their annual report and financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2023.

Objects and Activities

The object of the Charity is to benefit the public by encouraging support with financial grants, prayer and personal service in order to advance the Christian faith in the Episcopal/Anglican Province of Alexandria - to provide and maintain its church buildings and to enable public worship, pastoral care, outreach and witness, training and education, healthcare, the relief of poverty and community development.

The Province of Alexandria contains four dioceses (Egypt, North Africa, the Horn of Africa, and Gambella) which are being established over a five-year transition period. Assistant Bishop Anthony Ball, Chair of The Jerusalem & Middle East Church Association, is tasked with establishing the legal and administrative arrangements for the three new dioceses of North Africa, Horn of Africa and Gambella. The first Provincial Synod was held in Cairo in February 2023, and despite access difficulties (especially visas) Diocesan Synods have been held in all four Dioceses during the year. Structures for the functioning of the different dioceses are gradually being put in place – in Ethiopia this involves altering the current registration with the Ethiopian government to include two dioceses within the country; in North Africa this requires a lot of groundwork in establishing a diocesan centre potentially in Tunis or Algiers. Church membership has increased in most areas despite enormous challenges, and Bishop Anthony has reported encouraging signs of a spiritual awakening. Archbishop Samy Shehata, Primate of the Province of Alexandria has a vision for the whole Province and, with structures increasingly in place, a major focus is on personnel - it is hoped that by 2025 it will be possible for bishops to be elected in the new dioceses. For the moment, Archbishop Samy has temporary appointed diocesans for North Africa, Horn of Africa and Gambella.

Promoting Support and Interest in the Province The Trustees have met remotely by “zoom” to conduct business during the year, plus informally at the Annual Gathering. A Safeguarding Policy has been adopted by the Trustees. The AGM of the charity was held in April 2023.

A (hybrid) Annual Gathering was held in St Margaret’s Church, Westminster (by kind permission of the Dean and Chapter of Westminster Abbey on 13 September, 2023. About 15 members attended in person, including our Patron Bishop Michael Ipgrave, and a similar number joined via the video link. The gathering enjoyed an uplifting talk from Archbishop Samy Shehata (via a video link from Cairo) – members are encouraged to pray for:

- The consecration of the new Cathedral in Gambella; encouragement of Archdeacon Jeremiah, and the clergy, lay persons and Mothers Union leaders and members throughout the Diocese of Gambella. .
- For the development of clergy and lay members in the Horn of Africa; plus the delicate situation on Ethiopia, in the camps near the border etc.
- For the missionary Diocese of North Africa, especially the need for a mature priest to guide the ministry at Holy Trinity, Algiers. And the general climate of hostility to Christians and Christian witness within the political and security apparatus of the country.
- For the blossoming of old and new ministries through many institutions in Egypt as new hospital wards, education centres, cultural centres etc. come on stream. For the various “sector” directors and their staff.

- For the clergy and congregations of the many churches and congregations throughout Egypt; including the celebrating of Church of Good Shepherd in Giza in its 100th Anniversary.
- For the ministry to desperate refugees and migrants throughout the Province.
- For the ministry of the Alexandria School of Theology through its many campuses; with thanks for the gradual gaining of PhD's by various faculty and progress towards good accreditation of AST courses.
- For ecumenical cooperation and interfaith involvement at local level throughout the Province.

A Pilgrimage Study Tour to Tunisia has been organised to take place in April 2024 (delayed from April 2023). This will be a private tour for FAPA members and friends led by Trustee Richard Hibbert with a Tunisian guide.

Extended Study Opportunities Trustee Christopher Andrews has initiated an Extended Study Opportunities programme in Cairo, Alexandria and at Anafora Retreat Centre – an opportunity for persons exploring the possibilities of study leave or a sabbatical in the Province to:

- Experience the living Christian faith and worship of Anglican Episcopal congregations and ecumenical links with the Coptic and other churches;
- Explore 'Interfaith' through the Diocese's networks and contacts at Al-Azhar University, Cairo;
- Discover the warm welcome and vibrant contemporary life, worship and ministry of the monasteries of the Egyptian desert;
- Encounter the social justice ministry of the Diocese of Egypt;
- Pursue individual research or participate in a course of theological study at the Alexandria School of Theology.

Communication. Three FAPA newsletters were published in 2023 and distributed widely to sister organisations and to about 100 FAPA members.

The FAPA web site www.fapa-egypt.org is the main vehicle for equipping and inspiring members to pray for the Province - a vital FAPA mission activity.

Financial Review

The Charity received Unrestricted income of £5,435 from individuals, and £19,202 from individuals and two partner churches as Restricted donations. A charity can claim Gift Aid of 25% of donations from individuals who pay tax and have signed a Gift Aid form. Income from donations and subscriptions include the Gift Aid the charity has claimed. The charity remitted £26,313 for the Province of Alexandria which comprised income donated for specific purposes of £20,688 and £5,625 from general donations remitted to be used at the discretion of the Archbishop.

The Charity is immensely thankful to all individual donors and partner church donors for their generous donations as this has enabled FAPA to make significant grants to support the activities of the Province of Alexandria.

The most significant risk is sustainability of donations.

Reserves

The Trustees consider that approximately £1,500 should be retained to meet future needs of the charity. At 31 December 2023 the level of unrestricted reserves was £1,437.

Report of the Trustees

The Trustees present their annual report and financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2022.

Objects and Activities

The object of the Charity, as defined in the constitution, is to benefit the public by encouraging support with financial grants, prayer and personal service in order to advance the Christian faith in the Episcopal/Anglican Province of Alexandria - to provide and maintain its church buildings and to enable public worship, pastoral care, outreach and witness, training and education, healthcare, the relief of poverty and community development.

The Province of Alexandria contains four dioceses: Egypt, North Africa, the Horn of Africa, and Gambella which are being established over a five-year transition period ending in June 2025. Assistant Bishop Anthony Ball, Chair of JMECA, is especially tasked with helping bring into reality personnel and structures to make viable the maturing of the three new dioceses of North Africa, Horn of Africa and Gambella by June 2025.

The Deputy Chair and Hon. Secretary were welcomed to the annual meeting of JMECA along with equivalent officers of FACE (Friends of the Anglican Church in Ethiopia) as part of our efforts to make the best contribution in support of the Province and emerging Dioceses.

Promoting Support and Interest in the Province

A winter seminar programme was undertaken in January, February and March which included: 'The Church in Ethiopia' – history and challenges, 'Anglicans in Egypt – future challenges', and 'Ecumenical and Interfaith Relations in the Developing Province.' These were virtual (90 minute) sessions to an invited audience and involved a small panel of 'experts', some from overseas. About 60 persons from a variety of organisations expressed an interest in the seminars which were considered to be a success. It hoped to organise a further seminar programme in 2024.

The 2022 Annual Gathering was a virtual 'zoom' meeting – the AGM was preceded by a presentation by Archbishop Samy Shehata, Primate of the Province of Alexandria – his vision for the period 2023-2033. It is planned to hold a 'hybrid' Annual Gathering in St Margaret's Church, Westminster in September 2023 now that Covid restrictions have eased. The AGM will be a virtual meeting in April.

A Pilgrimage Study Tour to Tunisia was organised to take place in May 2023, but this has now been postponed until 2024. This will be a private tour for FAPA members and friends led by trustees Richard Hibbert and Andy Wheeler with a Tunisian guide.

Three FAPA Newsletter editions were produced (Easter, Autumn and Advent) and distributed widely to sister organisations in addition to the current FAPA membership (about 100).

The FAPA web site www.fapa-egypt.org is the main vehicle for equipping and inspiring members to pray for the Province - a vital FAPA mission activity.



Financial Review

The Charity received Unrestricted income of £4,666 from individuals, and £26,167 from three partner churches and a charity and a few individual donors as restricted donations. A charity can claim Gift Aid of 25% of donations from individuals who pay tax and have signed a Gift aid form and during the year we claimed £530. Please consider signing a form if you have not done so in the past. The form is available on our website.

The Charity is immensely thankful to all individual donors and partner church donors for their generous donations as this has enabled FAPA to make significant grants to support the activities of the Province of Alexandria.

The charity remitted £28,149 for specific activities of the Diocese of Egypt which comprised income donated for specific purposes of £23,949 and £4,200 from general donations was remitted to be used at the discretion of the Archbishop.

Structure and Governance

The Charity was registered as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation on 17 December 2018, having been reconstituted from the previously unincorporated Charity number 209145. The Charity changed its name from the Egypt Diocesan Association (EDA) to Friends of the Anglican Province of Alexandria (FAPA) in June 2020.

The Charity is governed by a constitution which places no maximum on the number of charity trustees that may be appointed; membership is open to anyone who is interested in furthering the purposes of the Charity.

Report of the Trustees

The Trustees present their annual report and financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2021.

Objects and Activities

The object of the Charity, as defined in the constitution, is to benefit the public by encouraging support with financial grants, prayer and personal service in order to advance the Christian faith in the Episcopal/Anglican Province of Alexandria - to provide and maintain its church buildings and to enable public worship, pastoral care, outreach and witness, training and education, healthcare, the relief of poverty and community development.

The Province of Alexandria contains four dioceses: Egypt, North Africa, the Horn of Africa, and Gambella which will be established over a five-year transition period. The Friends of the Alexandria Province of Alexandria (FAPA) is called to support the work of the clergy, churches and ministries in Algeria, Chad, Djibouti, Egypt, Eritrea, Ethiopia, Libya, Mauretania, Somalia, and Tunisia.

At the 'virtual' Annual General Meeting which took place on 24 June, 2021, the Rt. Revd Dr Michael Ipgrave OBE, Bishop of Lichfield was welcomed as a Patron of FAPA. Archbishop Samy was congratulated on his succession as Archbishop of the Province and Bishop of the Diocese of Egypt, and President of FAPA. It was noted that Bishop Mouneer Anis has graciously accepted to be a Patron of FAPA.

Prior to the AGM, participants were graced with the presence by Zoom of Bishop Michael and Archbishop Samy, plus Shady Anis (studying at Cambridge). Archbishop Samy presented his "Vision for the Province of Alexandria" under the headings of ministry, ecumenical relations, dialogue, service. He informed us that some new leadership roles had been established or envisaged for North Africa, the Horn of Africa and Gambella. The *Archbishop Mouneer Centre for Christian Relationships* had been established in Egypt, arising out of the historic relationship between the Diocese of Egypt and al-Azhar University.

The trustees have invited the involvement in their meetings during the year of three candidates for trusteeship.

The Chair and Hon. Secretary were welcomed to the annual meeting of JMECA along with equivalent officers of FACE (Friends of the Anglican Church in Ethiopia) as part of our efforts to each/all make the best contribution in support of the Province and emerging Dioceses. We were delighted to learn of the consecration as bishop and appointment as Assistant to Archbishop Samy of Rev'd Canon Anthony Ball, Chair of JMECA in November 2021. Bishop Anthony is especially tasked with helping bring into reality personnel and structures to make viable the maturing of the three new dioceses of North Africa, Horn of Africa and Gambella by June 2025.

Promoting Support and Interest in the Province Trustees have given thought to three strategic activities for when the Covid restrictions are eased: a Lecture Series, Study Tours and Sabbaticals. Plans have been developed for a Seminar programme in January to March 2022, to include: 'The Church in Ethiopia' – history and challenges, and 'Anglicans in Egypt – future challenges' and 'Ecumenical and Interfaith Relations in the Developing Province.' These will be virtual (90 minute) sessions to an invited audience; a small panel of 'experts' will be involved. Looking further ahead, a Study Tour to Tunisia is being planned to take place in 2023. Newsletters are produced three times a year and distributed widely to sister organisations in addition to the current FAPA membership (about 100).

Financial Review

The Charity received Unrestricted income of £6,141 from individuals, and £11,940 from individuals and six partner churches as Restricted donations. A charity can claim Gift Aid of 25% of donations from individuals who pay tax and have signed a Gift aid form. Please consider signing a form if you have not done so in the past. The form is available on our website.

The Charity is immensely thankful to all individual donors and partner church donors for their generous donations as this has enabled FAPA to make significant grants to support the activities of the Province of Alexandria.

The charity remitted £17,691 for specific activities of the Diocese of Egypt which comprised income donated for specific purposes of £11,690 and £2,500 from general donations to support Lay leadership training. £3,501 was remitted to be used at the discretion of the Archbishop.

The most significant risk is sustainability of donations.

Reserves

The Trustees consider that approximately £2,000 should be retained to meet future needs of the charity. At 31 December 2021 the level of unrestricted reserves was £1,854.
