This is the result of changes to personnel at hiring organisations and the availability of funds from the Duke of Edinburgh Award to support organisations to purchase their own equipment. This has meant we have been able to service requests comfortably in the peak season. Changes at hiring organisations are a regular occurrence and BASE needs to be reactive and flexible to accommodate requests.

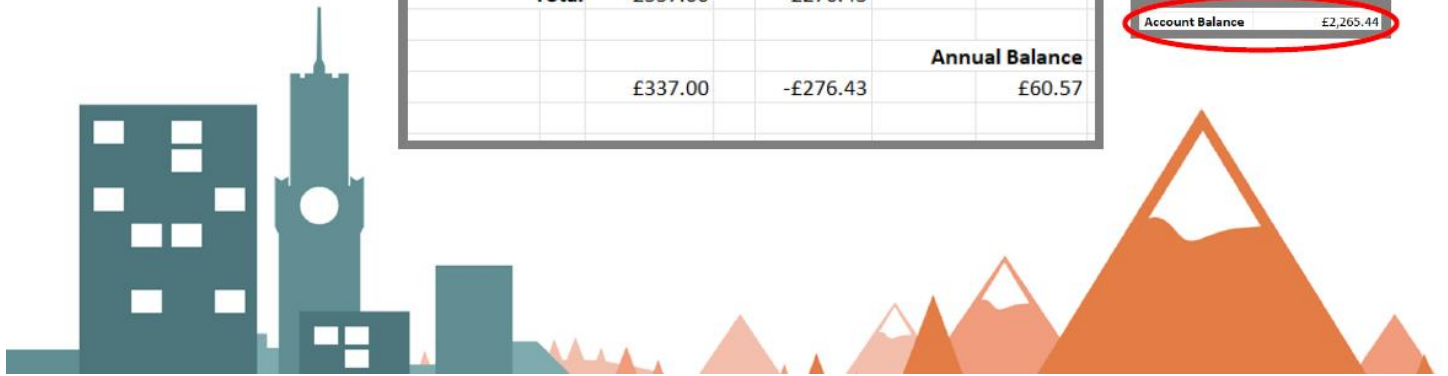

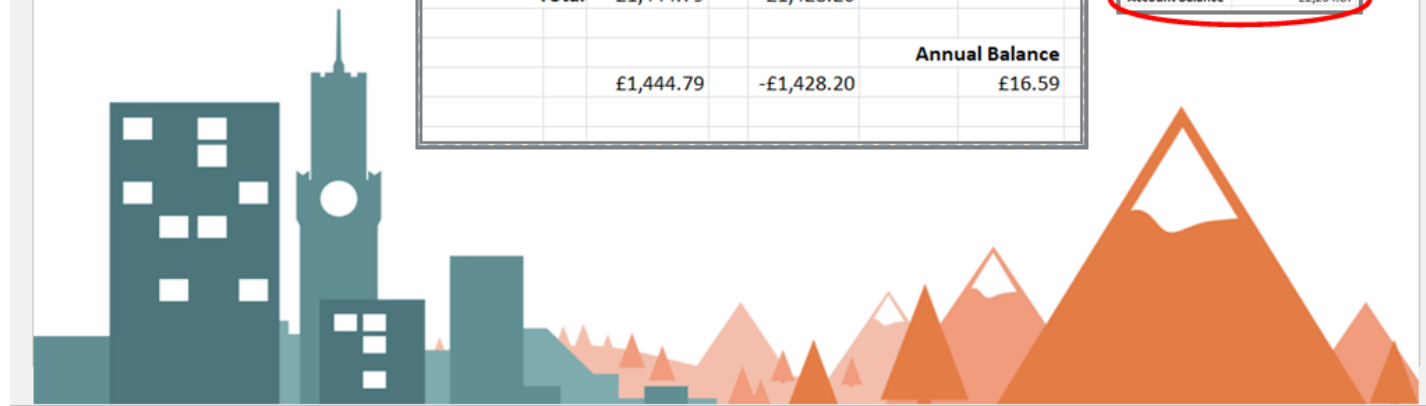
