- organising Garage Sales in several villages which are for the benefit of the local communities
- provision of a Christmas Tree and presents for the elderly residents of a care home in Brundall
- running various other events for people to participate in and enjoy, while raising funds for local causes

The trustees believe that members of Acle and Brundall Lions Club, in carrying out their duties, do so purely for the benefit of the local community.
