Our Mission

Warming Hope aims to alleviate financial hardship and support vulnerable communities in London, with a particular focus on the homeless and low-income families with children.

What We Do

- Distribute food, clothing, and essential items to those in need
- Promote inclusive events that offer positive social and educational engagement
- Raise public awareness and support through our campaign and event series, **Hope**
- Work toward establishing community-based services including foodbanks, youth hubs, and rehabilitation housing

Objectives and Activities

Charitable Objectives

Warming Hope exists to relieve poverty and support those facing financial hardship in London, particularly the homeless and families with children.

- Raise awareness and support through our community project "**Hope**"
- Work toward establishing rehabilitation houses, foodbanks, and youth clubs throughout London

These activities benefit young people by developing their self-confidence and social skills, their practical IT skills and life skills and providing opportunities for young people to become volunteers themselves. We welcome all young people, aged between 11 and 18, regardless of personal background, faith, gender or personal circumstances.

We are grateful for the many hours volunteers, including member volunteers, have spent listening and encouraging our guests and working with the charity workers. Without this valuable contribution of time, energy and expertise we would not have been able to achieve so much.




