Trustees' Annual Report

01.04.2020 – 31.03.21

Objectives and Activities

1. Purposes

The Charity's purposes are to:

- Promote afforestation for the benefit of the public for the general improvement of land or of the environment
- Promote the conservation and enhancement of the natural environment and the advancement of public education therein with particular reference to deforestation and other effects of the release of carbon dioxide emissions into the atmosphere and the encouragement of afforestation.

2. Activities

In the period 01.04.2020 – 31.03.21, further trees were added to the groves that the Charity set up through Trees for Life (registered Scottish charity SC021303) in the previous financial year. The trees were donated by the Charity via donations it received and by supporters of the Charity donating direct to Trees for Life.

- 402 trees were added to The Scientists Grove (<https://treesforlife.org.uk/groves/78550/>).
- 229 trees and £12 were added to the Friends of All Things Small and Green Grove (<https://treesforlife.org.uk/groves/84303/>).
- 64 trees and £3 were added to the Academics Grove (<https://treesforlife.org.uk/groves/88880/>).
- 187 trees and £18 were added to The UCL Grove (<https://treesforlife.org.uk/groves/144298/>).

In addition and with the assistance of the Charity, the following 2 groves were also set up:

- The Cognitive Science Society grove was set up on 25.04.20 and in the period 01.04.20-31.03.21, 779 trees were donated to the grove and £797. (<https://cognitivesciencesociety.org/cognitive-science-society-grove/>)
- The Imperial College Centre for Structural Biology grove was set up on 28.02.21 (<https://treesforlife.org.uk/groves/300267/>)

All donations received directly by the Charity were applied to either the Scientists, Friends of or Academics groves. The Trustees have at all times had regard to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit.

Achievements and Performance

During this second year of the Charity's existence, it has continued to focus on native reforestation as a means to improve the environment for the benefit of the public and mitigate the impact of carbon emissions, working through Trees for Life, the long established and well respected charity based in Scotland in the UK.

The Charity has continued to encourage donations to its established groves and have worked with both the Cognitive Science Society and The Imperial College Centre for Structural Biology to set up groves directly in their names. In this financial year, another 1,661 trees have been planted and separately £830 donated.

Financial Review

As mentioned above, the Trustees apply all donations received by the Charity to the Scientists, Friends of and Academics groves. Given the way that the charity currently operates, the Trustees do not consider it necessary to hold reserves. The Charity has no overheads.

Structure, Governance and Management

The Charity is a Charitable Incorporated Organisation operating under a standard CIO constitution. Trustees are appointed for a 4 year term and every trustee must be appointed by a resolution passed at a properly convened meeting of the charity trustees.
