Many of the plans outlined in the Trustees Annual Report of 2023 had to be put on hold due to the significant and unresolved health issues of our President. The following updates can, however, be given:



The purpose and main activity of the Langley Institute of Ministry (LIM) is to advance the Christian faith for the public benefit in the UK and overseas in accordance with the Statement of Faith. This is realised by providing a Biblical Teaching Ministry through online media tools; a Life Ministry program to develop sustainable, income generating projects; and a practical Care Ministry to relieve the suffering of LIM leaders and students. LIM is governed by a Board of Trustees and all Trustees have seen the guidance issued by the Charity Commission and commit to abide by this guidance. LIM is now in its sixth year as a charity, and it has over 2,000 students, in 65 centres located in Africa and Asia

During the reporting period some significant planning has been undertaken to define a more sustainable organisational structure for the Charity. The key elements of this plan are

- **Curriculum development** - ensuring that the format and content of all teaching materials are updated and expanded so that they can easily be used by other leaders.
- **Translation** - all course materials to be translated into the local language.
- **Mentoring** – The President transitioning from mainly teaching to mainly mentoring.
- **Structuring of academic year** - Wherever practical, standard teaching breaks should be introduced that are common to all regions and nations. This gives both teachers and students an opportunity to pause and reflect on progress.
- **Greater delegation to National Leadership** - training and empowering our national leadership to take decisions on all operational matters within national borders including new centres, quality of teaching, budgets, care ministry and authorisation to award graduation certificates.
- **UK Leadership** - will prioritise their activities on Curriculum Development and fundraising.
- **Appointment of a new Vice Principal** to expand the skill set and experience on the Leadership Team and to initiate some aspects of succession planning.
- **Fundraising** - Significant increase in operating budget is anticipated if most of the above is to be realised. It is expected that most of this must come from new sources of income including grants and commercial donors

A global leadership Conference was held at the end of 2023 to communicate this new strategic direction and it is hoped to start the roll-out of this new structure in 2024. The financial requirements to support this roll-out have been calculated and efforts to raise additional funds are underway.

LIM's financial robustness continues to strengthen. A cash balance of £4163.03 was held in the main bank accounts and carried forward to 2024, of which LIM holds £4,000.89 in a contingency account. This is an increase of almost 250% relative to the start of year balance. LIM only pays out expenses from cleared funds and therefore has no liabilities to cover. An independent audit of the 2023 accounts was conducted and were reported to be free from material mis-statement.

There were no changes to the Board of Trustees through 2023.



The purpose and main activity of the Langley Institute of Ministry (LIM) is to advance the Christian faith for the public benefit in the UK and overseas in accordance with the Statement of Faith. This is realised by providing a Biblical Teaching Ministry through online media tools; a Life Ministry program to develop sustainable, income generating projects; and a practical Care Ministry to relieve the suffering of LIM leaders and students. LIM is governed by a Board of Trustees and all Trustees have seen the guidance issued by the Charity Commission and commit to abide by this guidance.

LIM is now in its fifth year as a charity (but seventh year as an organisation), and it has over 2,500 students, in 65 centres located in Angola, India, Kenya, Nepal, Pakistan, Rwanda, Sri Lanka, Tanzania, Uganda. This year has seen two new centres opened in Rwanda and has also seen the development of new leaders, as part of our locally led leadership network. These new and existing centres have impacted the lives of thousands of people in the church and their local communities.

During the reporting period, we have worked to make our curriculum even more relevant to the real needs of the people in the countries we serve. Our curriculum is not just focussed on academic rigour but is also geared towards seeing faith expressed in mission activities. Inevitably the communities we serve are always glad of the teaching, but we are very aware that their learning is only completed when our biblical teaching is leading them to be better servants within the community they inhabit, more devoted husbands and wives, and more enthusiastic to honour the God we love. In August, the President and Director travelled to Uganda to host a conference with our East African leaders to discuss such matters as: curriculum development - to provide good understanding of and conform to government requirements; safeguarding – the care of children and vulnerable adults; due-diligence - making good and appropriate business as well as adhering to relevant regulations in their locations; the task of sending financial support to them whilst being aware of a culture of corruption; leadership training and the importance of developing sustainable ministry – how to empower local leaders to support and multiply their own LIM ministries. We were also there to participate in three graduations, one among over 2,000 LIM refugee students mainly from Burundi Rwanda and the Democratic Republic of Congo, the second from a group of 30 'coffee pastors' within Mubende, the third were based in Kampala led by our country leader Bishop Nelson and involving 70 students. Although some aspects of this trip did not match our expectations these 'disappointments' have become learning points teaching us better ways for training our leaders in these areas.

LIM's financial robustness is strengthening. The principal source of income is still through voluntary donations and the concerted effort to turn ad-hoc donations into regular monthly donations has been successful. A cash balance of £1714.87 was held in the main bank accounts and carried forward to 2023, of which LIM holds £1,000.45 in a contingency account. LIM only pays out expenses from cleared funds and therefore has no liabilities to cover. An independent audit of the 2022 accounts was conducted and were reported to be free from material mis-statement.

One of our Trustees, David Warren stood down in May after serving for three years. Three new Trustees , Eleanor Cryer MBE, Christine Barrett and John Sadler, joined the Board of Trustees in November 2022.

The purpose and main activity of the Langley Institute of Ministry (LIM) is to advance the Christian faith for the public benefit in the UK and overseas in accordance with the Statement of Faith. This is realised by providing a Biblical Teaching Ministry through online media tools; a Life Ministry program to develop sustainable, income generating projects; and a practical Care Ministry to relieve the suffering of LIM leaders and students. LIM is governed by a Board of Trustees and all Trustees have seen the guidance issued by the Charity Commission and commit to abide by this guidance.

LIM is now in its fourth year as a charity (but sixth year as an organisation), and it has over 4,000 students, in 50 centres located in Angola, India, Kenya, Nepal, Pakistan, Sri Lanka, Tanzania, Uganda, and West Bengal. This year has seen new centres in Sri Lanka, Pakistan, India, and Africa and has seen the development of new leaders, as part of our locally led leadership network. These new and existing centres have impacted the lives of thousands of people in the church and their local communities.

Our students have commented that being part of LIM, has increased their sense of dignity both for themselves and their families, self-worth, and sense of purpose. Graduation with a Certificate in Theology or a Diploma in Theology represents a significant milestone in the lives of many of these students. At a community level, being part of LIM has increased their social standing, as they have more confidence, they feel that they are becoming better citizens and has supported them to fight corruption in both actions and in the wider community.

As part of our poverty alleviation work, LIM is continuing its Sewing Machine projects and has started new ones in Gullalamoda and Berhampur India which have been sewing masks and clothes for sale in the local market. These projects not only support students/workers but also ensures that the LIM work can become sustainable. LIM also supports students and their communities with food relief, medicines, clothing, and bibles. Our work among refugees especially has been most appreciated in Pakistan and Uganda where our centre leaders have been at the very forefront of our compassionate care. During the reporting period, LIM has helped students and leaders with book expenses, travel costs, some food costs, medical expenses, rent, or graduation costs and occasionally where their accommodation needs to be developed to cope with student numbers.

LIM's financial robustness is developing. The principal source of income is through voluntary donations and a concerted effort to turn ad-hoc donations into regular monthly donations has generally been successful but is still ongoing. A cash balance of £1490 was held in the bank accounts and carried forward to 2022. LIM only pays out expenses from cleared funds and therefore has no liabilities to cover. An independent audit of the 2021 accounts was conducted and were reported to be free from material misstatement.

LIM's governance structure has also developed. In October 2021, two new Trustees were appointed - Joshua Shinhar and Mark Thorogood; in January 2022, Mark Thorogood was appointed Director and therefore stood down as a Trustee; finally, in May 2022, a long serving Trustee, David Warren, stepped down and Lynne King was reappointed for a further 3 years. The search for additional Trustees is ongoing.


