Annual Report

As a result of a successful masters training programme to develop leadership skills during 2023 and the qualifying of 2 new level 2 coaches in March 2024, the summer of 24 was the year for our new coaches to begin to put their training in to practice. We encouraged new coaches to plan and deliver sessions which was successful in seeing the leader's confidence and leadership develop and seeing the nippers respond and engage with new leaders.

Last year, we took on 32 new members from our waiting list, this year we took on 21 new members. Less growth, but more consistency in numbers attending sessions and more sessions running throughout the summer months. This year we also started weekly winter strength and fitness circuit training for senior club members

The senior pool training sessions continued throughout the year and attendance remained good, and the session subscribed to capacity. The coaches continue to note marked improvement in confidence, ability and fitness in the pool which in turn saw increased participation, confidence and skill when it came to beach sessions and ocean activities. We have allocated 1 lane for youth.

We did not run a lifeguard course this year, started putting members through skill competencies, and carried out in house requalification's in water safety certificates.

Trustees

The 7 trustees remain in position with Ryan Callaby and Ian Fredericks standing down and being re-elected at the AGM.

Membership

At the close of 2024 our total membership across all sections was 116.

43 Nipper (7-13yrs) members - this figure is an increase of 9 from the previous year

14 Youth (14-16yrs) member - this figure saw a decline of 1 from previous year

59 senior (18yrs +) members - this figure shows an increase of 13

Competition

For the first time we took a team of 4 Masters and 4 Nippers to the Surf Lifesaving Great Britain National competition.

As with previous years we concluded the summer with the Surf Lifesaving Great Britain Eastern Region surf lifesaving competition. 62 of our members participated (44 in 2023) and once again we finished in overall 2nd place.

Finally, 7 of our youth and open members were selected for the first time to participate in the Celtic Cup competition competing against teams from Cornwall, Devon and Wales.

Outside of our own policy on how we spend money, we do not have any restricted funds at present.

During this year we bought £28182 of new equipment. Which comprised of 8 surf ski, and 10 Nipper transition boards.

Annual Report

We continued to have a waiting list of 32 children and decided take a new group of Nippers so they develop the skills, discipline and fitness to become competent youth.

The senior pool training sessions continued throughout the year and attendance remained good. The coaches noted a marked improvement in seniors' confidence, ability and fitness in the pool which in turn saw increased participation, confidence and skill when it came to beach sessions and ocean activities.

We have had one member completing the probationary Trainor/Assessor which means we can now run our own courses. This year we have trained;

Tube rescuer – 15, Lifeguard – 3, Surf Lifesaver - 2

Annual Report

During this year we saw all previous restrictions of C19 guidelines lifted for outside sports clubs. The focus of the year was to give seniors the training and experience in the sport, to create a new bank of coaches and water safety cover so we can develop all squads.

We achieved this by focusing on senior training and creating a group for people completely new to the sport and who had never surfed. This group, focused on core skills and confidence with the aim of then including them into the main seniors training. This was hugely successful, and five out of the group, at the beginning of 2023, trained as Nipper (7-11 years) coaches, and obtained their tube rescue safety award.

In June 2022 we managed to secure, a swim slot at the local leisure centre, to enable us to pilot a senior swim training session. We agreed that participants would contribute to the cost of the pool hire, but as swimming is the fundamental skill of surf lifesaving, it was agreed that swimming was something the charity should subsidise for its members, for both the development of the sport at club level, the training of future lifeguards to provide water safety within club and to create employment opportunities with the RNLI.

Trustees

In October 2022, the trustees voted in and welcomed 3 new trustees, each who bring a fantastic range of skills to complement the existing trustees. Sarah Hunter, Susan Brockhouse and Mark Gray. Sarah has many years' experience as a school governor, and is a local business woman. Sue is a very experience athlete and coach, and has been an Ofsted inspector and Early Years Advisor, and Mark has lived by the sea and surfed for his whole life, and runs his family business with in the village of Mundesley.

Membership

At the close of 2022 our total membership across all sections was 78. This shows very little growth from 2021. Without the development and training of water safety and leaders, the ability to increase membership is impossible.

Annual report - For the year ending 28th February 2021

In just our second year, we along the rest of the world, we faced the coronavirus pandemic. From being in the middle of our winter swim programme everything came to an abrupt standstill, with guidelines from our governing body, initially denying any club activity to take place. As the year progressed, we were able to operate but under strict new guidelines. We had to practice in strict bubble of 6, maintaining social distancing, and we were not allowed to share equipment. We were not authorised to carry out any minor first aid on participants so parents/carers had to stay within the activity vicinity to receive their child mid-session should the need of arisen. The head coach also had to ensure parents did not enter the bubbles during the session and did not breach guidelines and the start and end of each session. To facilitate the sessions complying with the guidelines we staggered the start of each bubble by 15 minutes. Each child and parent had to sign the covid code of practice for club to be sure everyone was fully aware of what we could and couldn't do.

Membership

At the close of 2020 we had a total 56 members, this is an increase of just 3 members from 2019. Despite having a waiting list we were unable to recruit new members as we had to keep group sizes small in line with C-19 guidelines. All of these members are active in either the delivering or participating in surf lifesaving activities. At the end of the year we had 20 on our waiting list

Nipper (age 8-12) Coaching-

14 Nipper members

We recommenced beach activities in July 2020, splitting the Nippers into 3 bubbles each with the same coach working with them each week. The bubbles were not allowed to be greater than 6 including the coach so our participant/coach ratio was 5:1. Each coach was also a qualified lifeguard. Additional lifeguards and the head coach remained outside of the bubbles overseeing the overall safety.

Youth (age 13-18) Coaching

24 Youth members

The older Nippers moved up into development youth this season and they operated in the bubble system the same way as the Nippers.

Unfortunately, due the fact we were not allowed to share equipment during a session, and our existing youth group of 15/16 year olds did not get to train this year. We just didn't enough equipment to go round or enough experienced leader who could take on a completely new session.

Seniors Coaching

20 Senior members

Most of our seniors are involved in the coaching of the Nippers and Youth, some as qualified coaches, some as lifeguards and some as beach and water helpers. The covid guidelines put a stop to seniors getting involved, and learning the sport for themselves as the 6 bubble system didn't allow for additional helpers. This was sad as it meant some seniors didn't really partake in club activity for the whole year.

Positively, the leaders running bubbles, stepped out of their comfort zone and were suddenly leading rather than assisting small groups. We saw leaders really develop their practical skills and in turn saw a huge progression in the participants development within the sport. The model of the same leader working regularly with the same group, particularly with the younger members was very positive something we will continue to implement.

Beach Warden

In light of the RNLI not opening lifeguarded beaches at the beginning of the season due to C-19, our governing body, set up the Beach warden scheme. This was a brand-new voluntary lifeguard service, in which members with a current lifeguard qualification could undertake additional online training, to act as a Beach Warden. We were not allowed to carry out rescues, but were allowed to operate in an advisory and preventative role on the beach. 11 of our seniors trained as beach wardens and we provided 86 hours of voluntary lifeguard service at Mundesley beach. The RNLI started back on the beach on the 4th of July, at the same time we were allowed to open our doors to the training previously mentioned. We liaised and worked closely with the coastguard, North Norfolk District Council and the RNLI whilst carrying out the beach warden service.

Training

All of our 14 lifeguards requalified this year.

11 lifeguards undertook additional training to become beach wardens.

There were no other training opportunities this year.

Coaches remain the same as previous year with

- 4 level 1 coaches
- 5 level 2

Competition

There were not any competitions held this year due to C-19

Outreach

We were not able to carry out any educational outreach this year.

Finance

Start of financial period 1st march 2021 = **£2146.37**

Unrestricted funds income - during the financial year 01/03/20 - 28/02/21 our income was £28,493. This is made up from membership fundraising and merchandise with a large proportion £26,420.00 coming from the estate of Miss Mary Evelyn Blomfield. This is the initial payment of the total amount of £ 225,000.00 bequest to Mundesley Surf lifesaving Club. Spending total was £4687 leaving a balance of £2879

Restricted Funds - During the same period our restricted income was £1316.00. This was the total of 2 Grants from Tesco Groundworks, North Norfolk District Council reimbursement for beach warden expenses. There is a balance of £325 remaining in the restricted funds.
