### **OBJECTIVES**

# Objectives of the Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO) are

1) To advance the education of the public in subjects relating to farming, conservation, and country crafts in particular but not exclusively by providing courses, workshops and talks.

2) To provide or assist in the provision of facilities in the interests of social welfare for recreation or other leisure time occupation of individuals who have need of such facilities by reason of their youth, age, infirmity or disability, financial hardship, social circumstances or for the public at large with the object of improving their conditions of life.

### **STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT**

Bosavern Community Farm Charitable (BCFC) is a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO) and was registered with the Charity Commission on the 27th February 2019. Its registration number is 1182238.

The CIO uses the 'Foundation' model constitution and only voting members are its charity trustees.

New Trustees of the Charity are elected by the current Trustees of the charity at a General Meeting. The Trustees aim to recruit Trustees with a wide range of skills and experience, and who can help the charity fulfil its objectives.

Trustees are provided with key documents on appointment and are encouraged to attend appropriate external training courses where these will facilitate the understanding of their roles.

#### **ACTIVITIES AND OBJECTIVES IN THE YEAR**

We received a grant from the Mounts Bay & Penzance Rotary Club to allow us to furnish a map and nature trail infrastructure at Bosavern Community Farm. This was to support community access to the farm's natural resources.

Following two resignations, for a substantial period of the year this report covers, April 2021 – March 2022, the charity only had two Trustees. To make any decision apart from appointing Trustees, at least three Trustees are required. This meant that very little further activity happened during this year.

Since one of the remaining two Trustees resignation in May 2022, three new Trustees have been appointed, activity resumed.

#### **FINANCIAL REVIEW**

We received a grant from Mounts Bay & Penzance Rotary Club and some small donations from supporters of the community farm. Our only expenditure was on items for the nature trail as detailed above.


