TRUSTEES' ANNUAL REPORT

Structure and governance

East Keswick Wildlife Trust (the "Trust") is a registered charity which is set up as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO). The constitution governing the CIO is dated 6 February 2019. Up until February 2021 the Trust was governed by a constitution adopted on 4 June 1992 and amended on 15 October 1992 and 11 May 1998.

At each annual general meeting of the Trust's members one third of the charity trustees shall retire from office or, where the number of charity trustees is not an exact multiple of 3 the number nearest to one third shall retire. The charity trustees to retire by rotation shall be those who have been longest in office since their last appointment or reappointment. Any person who retires as a charity trustee by rotation is eligible for reappointment. Effectively charity trustees may serve a maximum 3 year term before seeking re-election (if they so wish).

The members of the Trust or the existing charity trustees may appoint a new charity trustee at any time subject to the maximum number of charity trustees at any time which is 12. Any appointments as charity trustees during the financial year are to be confirmed by the decision of the members of the Trust at the Annual General Meeting. A person so appointed by the charity trustees shall not be counted for the purpose of determining which of the charity trustees is to retire by rotation at that meeting. There must be at least 3 charity trustees. If the number falls below this minimum the remaining charity trustees or trustee must call a meeting to appoint new charity trustees.

Objectives and activities

The objectives of the Trust are:

- To promote the conservation, maintenance and study of places and objects of botanical, zoological, geological, ecological or scientific interest in the Parish of East Keswick and elsewhere.
- To establish, form, own and maintain sanctuaries or reserves for the conservation of flora and fauna.
- To promote the education of the public, particularly young people, in the understanding, enjoyment and conservation of natural flora and fauna.
- To promote, organise and carry out study and research in the principles and practice of nature conservation, and to publish useful results of such research.
- To co-operate with other bodies of allied interest where this may assist in attaining the aim of the Trust
- To liaise with voluntary and statutory bodies involved in local land use and development, and to advise on the management of sites.

TRUSTEES' ANNUAL REPORT

Review of the Period

The Trustees are pleased to report that they have actively pursued all the objectives of the Trust over the previous 12 months.

All Trustees and Officers of the Trust are volunteers receiving no financial remuneration from the Trust apart from the reimbursement of expenses incurred on behalf of the Trust. As a result this ensures that all income and funding received by the Trust can be spent on conservation works, land acquisition and running expenses incurred in pursuit of the Trust's objectives.

To date the Wildlife Trust has acquired various land freeholds totalling 65 acres and has an additional 35.5 acres under management agreements and leases with other land owners.

On these various landholdings the Trust has established four nature reserves with public access and the recent acquisition of land at Bardsey of 23 acres will become the fifth, securing safe havens for local wildlife, education and public access.

Over the past 12 months much of the Trust's effort and expenditure has been directed towards our latest acquisition of the land known as Bardsey Fields. The Trust's army of volunteers has planted hundreds of metres of new hedgerows along with thousands of trees and shrubs forming small copses, all of which will benefit existing wildlife and improve the diversity of the site. Volunteers have supported contractors and stock fencing has been erected enabling on site conservation grazing to commence. Already educational visits have begun with visits from Bardsey Primary Academy school children and it is hoped to expand the educational opportunities which the new site offers to the other local schools. Grants have been secured from Countryside Stewardship schemes to provide support to establish the conservation grazing and access while other grants from Yorkshire Water have paid for natural flood management works which will also create better wildlife habitat, improve in-stream water quality and reduce downstream flooding during periods of heavy rainfall. The Trust is grateful to Yorkshire Water, The Yorkshire Dales Rivers Trust and Bardsey Parish Council for their continued support on this ongoing project at Bardsey Fields.

The work of the Trust depends on it's army of volunteers, not only in it's administration but also on the ground. Every week, up to 30 volunteers work on various conservation projects, management of reserves and local habitat restoration. The Trust is very grateful for all their continued efforts.

To support the work of all these volunteers the Trust does incur costs on insurance, machinery, tools and equipment which all require funding. This is why the Trust is so grateful for every penny it receives and equally for the continued support provided by both Trust members and the local community.

The Trust considers that it's conservation work still gives incredible value and enables access to some very special wildlife-rich sites for educational purposes, for members and the public in general.

The Trust would like to take on more projects, acquire and conserve more land, and inspire and involve more people in nature conservation. To do this the Trust will need to access new sources of funding and income streams in order to continue it's work over the coming years.

The Trust hopes that all of its supporters will continue to support it with their membership and perhaps even consider leaving a legacy to the Trust in their will. This could enable the Trust to do so much more and to achieve the Trust's ambition, namely to have a local countryside rich in wildlife for our children and future generations to enjoy.

The Trust thanks all those that give the Trust's work their support, free time and donations. This has enabled the Trust not only to survive but achieve such a positive local impact over the past years.

While it is important to recognise the Trust's successes over the past three decades, it is also important not to forget that the countryside's wildlife is still in serious trouble and there is a need to redouble our efforts as the decline of local wildlife in our area and the wider countryside continues.

It is recognised that the climate crisis is a global problem. However by being a member of the East Keswick Wildlife Trust you can be part of a local solution.

Financial Accounts

In summary, the activities for the year resulted in an excess of payments over receipts of £6,753 (2024 : surplus of receipts over payments of £10,534), which includes expenditure on the purchase of tools and equipment each year.

The Trustees have again utilised the option available to a charity to prepare the year end accounts on a cash accounting basis (receipts and payments) instead of preparing the accounts under an accruals based accounting policy following the Charities Statement of Recommended Practice. At 31 March 2025 the net assets of the Trust amounted to £413,923 (2024 : £414,674) including cash funds of £2,264 (2024 : £9,017).

It should be noted that the cash funds at the year end were temporarily at a level lower than normal for the Trust. In the latter part of the year the Trust had to monitor its expenditure and outgoings carefully to ensure that it was able to complete the works on Bardsey Fields by the end of the year, particularly with respect to the works schedule agreed for the grant funding from Yorkshire Water. The expenditure for these works had to be incurred by the Trust and completed on time before the grant monies already approved could be claimed. After the year end the grant claim was made and subsequently received from Yorkshire Water within a couple of weeks of the start of the new financial year.

The Trustees are satisfied that the Trust has adequate cash resources to enable it to continue in operation and meet its financial obligations going forward. For these purposes, the Trust aims to maintain a minimum cash balance of general unrestricted funds in the range between £5,000 and £10,000 in order to meet running expenses of the Trust going forward. As stated above, by the end of this financial year the Trust did allow its funds to fall below this stated level for cash reserves on the basis that grant funding from Yorkshire Water relating to the works on Bardsey Fields would be paid to the Trust shortly after the year end. At this point the Trust was able to achieve its cash reserves policy once again.

Public Benefit statement

In carrying out the objectives and activities of the Trust, the Trustees consider that they have complied with their duty to have due regard to the guidance on public benefit published by the Charity Commission in exercising their powers and duties.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on a cash basis when receipts and payments take place through the Trust's bank and building society accounts.

Assessment of Going Concern

Preparation of the accounts is on a going concern basis. The Trustees consider that there are no material uncertainties about the Trust's ability to continue as a going concern.

Fund Accounting

General unrestricted income funds comprise those funds which the Trustees are free to use for any purpose in furtherance of the Trust's charitable objectives.

Restricted income funds are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by the donor and/or under the terms related to a specific appeal.

Incoming Resources

All incoming resources are recognised once the charity has entitlement to the resources and the money has been paid to the Trust.

Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on a cash basis when payments have been made through the Trust's accounts.

Taxation

The Trust is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

4. RESTRICTED FUNDS

The total restricted funds balance carried forward of £240,078 at 31 March 2023 related to the purchase of a 23 acre wildflower rich site in Bardsey. In the year ended 31 March 2024 further contributions were received of £40,313 together with a transfer of £24,686 from the accumulated reserves of the Trust. The aggregate of these amounts is equal to the purchase price of this land in Bardsey (referred to as Bardsey Fields in the statement of fixed assets), the purchase of which was completed in May 2023. As a result the restricted funds balance at 31 March 2024 is £nil.

Part of the monies received from the the fundraising appeal to help the Trust purchase the land in Bardsey included the following grants:

- a) Leeds City Council made a payment of £40,000 to the Trust in May 2023 from a fund held by the Council for distribution to projects having a public benefit pursuant to agreements made under section 106 of the Town and Country Planning Act in connection with the development of land at Harewood as a film production set. The purpose of this grant was solely to assist the Trust with the purchase of the land in Bardsey (in front of Bardsey Primary Academy) which was duly completed also in May 2023. Other conditions attached to this grant would result in this grant being repayable to Leeds City Council in the event that the Trust ceases to operate, becomes insolvent, etc before the end of May 2025.
- b) Bardsey Parish Council made a payment of £30,200 to the Trust in February 2023 in order to assist the Trust with the acquisition of this piece of land located in the centre of Bardsey, so that by working together with the Trust the land could be preserved as an environmental asset for Bardsey and surrounding communities for the future. It is understood that this grant by the Parish Council would be subject to repayment by the Trust in the event that this land were to be sold/transferred to any third party other than a charitable institution having similar objects to the objects of the Trust. The Trust has no intention of selling/transferring this land which was acquired for the purpose of conserving the flora and fauna in this local habitat and opportunities for education and public access.

5. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Subject to the further comment below, no related party transactions took place during the year other than the reimbursement of expenses incurred by trustees for the day to day running of the Trust.

In order to assist the cashflow position of the Trust at the time of purchasing the land in Bardsey in May 2023, as the Trust needed to provide the majority of it's accumulated cash funds to enable the purchase to be completed, short term interest-free loans in the total sum of £10,000 were made to the Trust by one of the trustees in April 2023. These loans were fully repaid to this trustee by February 2024 and no interest has been charged or paid on these loans by the Trust.

Structure and governance

East Keswick Wildlife Trust (the "Trust") is a registered charity which is set up as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO). The constitution governing the CIO is dated 6 February 2019. Up until February 2021 the Trust was governed by a constitution adopted on 4 June 1992 and amended on 15 October 1992 and 11 May 1998.

At each annual general meeting of the Trust's members one third of the charity trustees shall retire from office or, where the number of charity trustees is not an exact multiple of 3 the number nearest to one third shall retire. The charity trustees to retire by rotation shall be those who have been longest in office since their last appointment or reappointment. Any person who retires as a charity trustee by rotation is eligible for reappointment. Effectively charity trustees may serve a maximum 3 year term before seeking re-election (if they so wish).

The members of the Trust or the existing charity trustees may appoint a new charity trustee at any time subject to the maximum number of charity trustees at any time which is 12. Any appointments as charity trustees during the financial year are to be confirmed by the decision of the members of the Trust at the Annual General Meeting. A person so appointed by the charity trustees shall not be counted for the purpose of determining which of the charity trustees is to retire by rotation at that meeting. There must be at least 3 charity trustees. If the number falls below this minimum the remaining charity trustees or trustee must call a meeting to appoint new charity trustees.

Objectives and activities

The objectives of the Trust are:

- To promote the conservation, maintenance and study of places and objects of botanical, zoological, geological, ecological or scientific interest in the Parish of East Keswick and elsewhere.
- To establish, form, own and maintain sanctuaries or reserves for the conservation of flora and fauna.
- To promote the education of the public, particularly young people, in the understanding, enjoyment and conservation of natural flora and fauna.
- To promote, organise and carry out study and research in the principles and practice of nature conservation, and to publish useful results of such research.
- To co-operate with other bodies of allied interest where this may assist in attaining the aim of the Trust
- To liaise with voluntary and statutory bodies involved in local land use and development, and to advise on the management of sites.

Review of the Period

The Trustees are pleased to report that they have actively pursued all the objectives of the Trust over the previous 12 months.

All Trustees and Officers of the Trust are volunteers receiving no financial remuneration from the Trust apart from the reimbursement of expenses incurred on behalf of the Trust. As a result this ensures that all income and funding received by the Trust can be spent on conservation works, land acquisition and running expenses incurred in pursuit of the Trust's objectives.

To date the Wildlife Trust has acquired various land freeholds totalling 65 acres and has an additional 35.5 acres under management agreements and leases with other land owners.

On these various landholdings the Trust has established four nature reserves with public access and the recent acquisition of land at Bardsey of 23 acres will become the fifth, securing safe havens for local wildlife, education and public access.

While it is important to recognise the Trust's successes over the past three decades, it is critical to recognise that the countryside's wildlife is still in serious trouble and the Trust needs to redouble its efforts as the decline in wildlife numbers both locally and across the wider country continues.

The work of the Trust depends on its army of volunteers, not only in its administration but also on the ground. Every week, up to 30 volunteers work on various conservation projects, management of reserves and local habitat restoration. The Trust is very grateful for all their continued efforts.

To support the work of all these volunteers the Trust does incur costs on insurance, machinery, tools and equipment which all require funding. This is why the Trust is so grateful for every penny it receives and equally for the continued support provided by both Trust members and the local community. Members will be aware that the Trust has increased membership fees this year, the first increase in over five years, which will help to offset the Trust's increased costs and the effects of inflation. The Trust believes these increased fees still give incredible value and enable access to some very special wildlife rich sites for educational purposes, for members and the public in general.

The Trust would like to take on more projects, acquire and conserve more land, and inspire and involve more people in nature conservation. To do this the Trust will need to access new sources of funding and income streams in order to continue its work over the coming years.

The Trust hopes that all of its supporters will continue to support it with their membership and perhaps even consider leaving a legacy to the Trust in their will. This could enable the Trust to do so much more and to achieve the Trust's ambition, namely to have a local countryside rich in wildlife for our children and future generations to enjoy.

The Trust thanks all those that give the Trust's work their support, free time and donations. This enables the Trust not only to survive but prosper.

It is recognised that the climate crisis is a global problem. However by being a member of the East Keswick Wildlife Trust you can be part of a local solution.

Financial Accounts

In summary, the activities for the year resulted in a surplus of receipts over payments of £10,534 (2023 : £9,216). In addition during this year the further sum of £40,313 has been contributed to the Trust in response to the Appeal for funds to help the Trust purchase the land in Bardsey, which was added to the net contributions received in the previous year of £240,078. The balance of the funds required to complete the purchase of the land in Bardsey, in the sum of £24,686, has been contributed directly by the Trust from its own accumulated funds. In May 2023 the land in Bardsey was acquired for the total purchase price of £305,077 (including legal fees).

The Trustees have again utilised the option available to a charity to prepare the year end accounts on a cash accounting basis (receipts and payments) instead of preparing the accounts under an accruals based accounting policy following the Charities Statement of Recommended Practice. At 31 March 2024 the net assets of the Trust amounted to £414,674 (2023 : £356,338) including cash funds of £9,017 (£263,247 : 2023).

As discussed above the increase in the net assets balance from 2023 to 2024 relates mainly to the further funds received from the Appeal to purchase land in Bardsey which enabled the Trust to conclude this purchase in May 2023. Clearly a significant decrease in the cash balances has occurred as a result of the transfer of funds required to complete this land purchase.

The Trustees are satisfied that the Trust has adequate cash resources to enable it to continue in operation and meet its financial obligations going forward. For these purposes, the Trust aims to maintain a minimum cash balance of general unrestricted funds in the range between £5,000 and £10,000 in order to meet running expenses of the Trust going forward. When necessary, expenditure is deferred by the Trust until income sources (eg grant income from the Rural Payments Agency) are received in order to achieve this cash reserves policy.

Public Benefit statement

In carrying out the objectives and activities of the Trust, the Trustees consider that they have complied with their duty to have due regard to the guidance on public benefit published by the Charity Commission in exercising their powers and duties.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on a cash basis when receipts and payments take place through the Trust's bank and building society accounts.

Assessment of Going Concern

4. RESTRICTED FUNDS

The total restricted funds balance carried forward of £240,078 at 31 March 2023 related to the purchase of a 23 acre wildflower rich site in Bardsey. In the year ended 31 March 2024 further contributions were received of £40,313 together with a transfer of £24,686 from the accumulated reserves of the Trust. The aggregate of these amounts is equal to the purchase price of this land in Bardsey (referred to as Bardsey Fields in the statement of fixed assets), the purchase of which was completed in May 2023. As a result the restricted funds balance at 31 March 2024 is £nil.

TRUSTEES' ANNUAL REPORT

Structure and governance

East Keswick Wildlife Trust (the "Trust") is a registered charity which is set up as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO). The constitution governing the CIO is dated 6 February 2019. Up until February 2021 the Trust was governed by a constitution adopted on 4 June 1992 and amended on 15 October 1992 and 11 May 1998.

The members of the Trust or the existing charity trustees may appoint a new charity trustee at any time subject to the maximum number of charity trustees which is 12. Otherwise any appointments as charity trustees are to be confirmed by the decision of the members of the Trust at the Annual General Meeting.

Objectives and activities

The objectives of the Trust are:

- To promote the conservation, maintenance and study of places and objects of botanical, zoological, geological, ecological or scientific interest in the Parish of East Keswick and elsewhere.
- To establish, form, own and maintain sanctuaries or reserves for the conservation of flora and fauna.
- To promote the education of the public, particularly young people, in the understanding, enjoyment and conservation of natural flora and fauna.
- To promote, organise and carry out study and research in the principles and practice of nature conservation, and to publish useful results of such research.
- To co-operate with other bodies of allied interest where this may assist in attaining the aim of the Trust
- To liaise with voluntary and statutory bodies involved in local land use and development, and to advise on the management of sites.

Review of the Period

The Trustees are pleased to report they have actively pursued all the objectives of the Trust over the previous twelve months.

In November 2022, the Trust was successful in its bid to acquire the second largest land purchase in its 30 year history, a 23 acre wildflower rich site in Bardsey, saving it from an uncertain future. There has been a delay in receiving the promised funding from Leeds City Council but the Trust expects to complete this purchase early in the next financial year. It is then the Trust's plan to work with the Yorkshire Dales Rivers Trust, the Woodmeadow Trust, Bardsey Parish Council and others in realising the huge potential this site has to offer for natural flood management, wildlife restoration and education.

The Trustees are committed to apply the Trust's financial reserves to support this purchase since, after botanical surveys were carried out, it was clear that this was an important local wildlife rich site and this was a once in a lifetime opportunity to acquire it. The Trustees sincerely thank all the members of the Trust and all those other bodies who contributed to this major fundraising effort to enable the Trust to purchase this site.

The Trust owns 65 acres of land and has management agreements and leases on a further 35.5 acres. In total, it has just over 100 acres of land under its management. On these acres we have established four nature reserves with public access and the Bardsey land acquisition will eventually become a fifth nature reserve, adding to the Trust's local efforts to secure safe havens on local sites of wildlife importance, and providing public access.

It is important to recognise the Trust's successes over the past three decades, but in doing so it is critical to recognise that our wildlife is still in serious trouble and therefore it will be necessary to redouble our efforts as there are continuing declines in much of British wildlife. Looking at the bigger picture, it was disappointing that recent announcements relating to the Government's five key priorities for 2023 made no mention of our environment or any action to mitigate climate change – perhaps some of the most depressing news of 2023.

The work of the Trust depends on its army of volunteers, not only in its administration but also on the ground. Every week up to 30 volunteers work on the Trust's conservation projects, reserves management and local habitat restoration. Volunteering is also very valuable to the Trust since the volunteers provide their time for free and the Trust owes a huge thank you for all the efforts of all the volunteers throughout the year. To support the work of our volunteers the Trust does incur costs on insurance, machinery, tools and equipment which all require funding. The Trust is very grateful for every penny it receives and equally important for the continued support from our local community.

The Trust would like to take on more projects, where possible, and inspire and involve more people in nature conservation. Going forward the Trust will need to look for new sources of funding and income streams to continue with this valuable conservation work over the coming years if these goals are to be achieved.

The Trust hopes that all of its supporters will continue to donate and help the Trust to achieve the aims and objectives of the Trust so that, with this support, the local environment will have more butterflies, birds, bees and quality green space that our children and future generations can enjoy.

Financial Accounts

In summary, the activities for the year resulted in a surplus of receipts over payments of £9,216 (2022 : £4,981). In addition during this year the substantial sum of £240,863 has been contributed to the Trust in response to the Appeal for funds to help the Trust purchase the land in Bardsey, which has been referred to above. Further funds have been pledged to the Trust in respect of this Appeal which will be reflected in the accounts for the following financial year at the same time as the completion of this purchase will be reported in the Trust's accounts.

For the first time the Trustees have utilised the option available to a charity to prepare the year end accounts on a cash accounting basis (receipts and payments) instead of preparing the accounts on an accruals based accounting policy following the Charities Statement of Recommended Practice. At 31 March 2023 the net assets of the Trust amounted to £356,338 (2022 : £107,044) including cash funds of £263,247 (2022 : £13,953). As discussed above the significant increase in these balances from 2022 to 2023 relates mainly to the funds received from the Appeal in 2023.

The Trustees are satisfied that the Trust has adequate cash resources to enable it to continue in operation and meet its financial obligations going forward.

Public Benefit statement

In carrying out the objectives and activities of the Trust, the Trustees consider that they have complied with their duty to have due regard to the guidance on public benefit published by the Charity Commission in exercising their powers and duties.

Trustees' responsibilities

Law applicable to charities in England and Wales requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the Charity's financial activities during the year and of its financial position at the end of the year. In preparing those financial statements, the trustees are required to:

- Select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- Make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- State whether applicable accounting standards and statements of recommended practice have been followed subject to any departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- Prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue its operations.



The Trustees are pleased to report that the Trust has continued to flourish and has been active throughout the past 12 months. While Covid restrictions have curtailed educational visits by local schools to the Trust's nature reserves most other activities eg conservation work parties, natural history survey work, etc) have been unaffected.

Sincere thanks go to all the Trust's Friday volunteers who form the work force that enables the Trust to achieve so much conservation work every year, not only on Trust reserves but also on sites under Trust management agreements. Without such support the Trust would not be able to achieve many of its successes and its continuing promotion of the objectives of this wildlife trust.

In additions thanks are also given to everyone who contributes to the goals of the Trust, especially our membership whose membership fees enable so much more conservation work to be carried out and the Trust hopes to continue to count on members support for the years ahead.

Financial Accounts

In summary, the activities for the year resulted in a surplus of income over expenditure of £5,132 (for 2021 there was an excess of expenditure over income of £1,209). This mainly arose as a result of overdue grants being paid by the Rural Payments Agency in this year. At 31 March 2022 the net assets of the Trust amounted to £104,421 (2021 : £99,289) including cash funds of £13,953 (2021 : £8,973). The Charity Trustees are satisfied that the Trust has adequate cash resources to enable it to continue in operation going forward.

On 11 February 2021 the funds held by EKWT (reg charity no 1013950) were transferred to EKWT (reg charity no 11882308) a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO) with the same charitable objectives and aims of the former EKWT. EKWT (reg charity no 1013950) ceased to exist from 11 February 2021 and it was removed from the register held by the Charity Commission at that date. The accounts prepared for the year ended 31 March 2021, which are shown as comparative figures in the copy of the accounts attached to this report, reflect the activities of both these Trusts combined for this previous year.

- To promote the conservation, maintenance and study of places and objects of botanical, zoological, geological, ecological or scientific interest in the Parish of East Keswick and elsewhere.
- To establish, form, own and maintain sanctuaries or reserves for the conservation of flora and fauna.
- To promote the education of the public, particularly young people, in the understanding, enjoyment and conservation of natural flora and fauna.
- To promote, organise and carry out study and research in the principles and practice of nature conservation, and to publish useful results of such research.

- To co-operate with other bodies of allied interest where this may assist in attaining the aim of the Trust
- To liaise with voluntary and statutory bodies involved in local land use and development, and to advise on the management of sites.

During the year, the Trust ran many work conservation parties, worked with local primary schools and uniformed groups, and undertook natural history survey work. The Trust's weekly volunteer work party groups continued to be interrupted by Covid-19 restrictions and resulted in some being cancelled. However the Trust is continuing with its conservation activities as much as possible has been completing many of its projects and achieving its objectives despite the lock downs. Estate management work is a continuous process on the land that the Trust currently manages and owns.

Financial Accounts

On 11 February 2021 the funds held by EKWT (reg charity no 1013950) were transferred to EKWT (reg charity no 11882308) a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO) with the same charitable objectives and aims of the former EKWT. EKWT (reg charity no 1013950) ceased to exist from 11 February 2021 and it was removed from the register held by the Charity Commission at that date. The accounts prepared for the year ended 31 March 2021, which are attached to this report, reflect the activities of both these Trusts combined for this year.

In summary, the activities for the year resulted in an excess of expenditure over income of £1,209. At 31 March 2021 the net assets of EKWT amounted to £99,289, including cash funds of £8,973. The Charity Trustees are satisfied that EKWT has adequate cash resources to enable it to continue in operation going forward
