When discussing the events, the group have been requested to assist with, the Trustees ensure that the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit is kept in mind.

Unfortunately, 2022 started with Covid-19 still very much on people's minds. One thing that was definitely not being considered was the weather issues in February which caused the Avon & Somerset LRF to activate the group with a view to assisting with communications support. The initial telephone call from the LRF Deputy Lead at 15.00 Thursday resulted links being set up between A&S Police HQ in Portishead and Bristol CC main control room in Temple Meads. This link was manned by members of the group from Friday 05.00 until 15.00 when the worst of the storms were considered as past and we were stood down.

The main activities covered during this period were to provide event and safety communications for the following Charitable Organisations.

Cheddar Running Clubs Annual Big Cheese 20th March.

This event is a sponsored run raising money for the Air Ambulance Service which takes place along the Mendip Way around Cheddar Gorge, our services are used to provide resilient and reliable radio communications due to mobile phones not working over the terrain to ensure runners safety.

Channel Events – Mendip Murmuration 11th June.

This event is a mountain bike race covering 35 miles of the Mendip Hills AONB, our services are used to provide resilient and reliable radio communications due to mobile phones not working over the terrain to ensure rider safety.

Relish Running Races – Cheddar Gorge Challenge 12th June.

This event is a series of cross-country running races over the Mendip Hills AONB covering various distances up to and including a half marathon. Our services are again required to provide resilient and reliable event and safety radio communications due to mobile phones not working over the terrain.

Woodspring Wings – International Model Air Show 9th & 10th July.

This event takes place between Bristol and Weston-super-Mare and is one of the largest model air shows in Europe. Our role here was to control the radio network and to run the control room to ensure clear lines of communications were maintained at all times.

Relish Running Races – Cheddar 10k Road Race 17th September.

This event is a closed road sponsored ran through the stunning Cheddar Gorge where our services are again required to provide resilient and reliable event and safety radio communications due to mobile phones not working over the terrain.

Parkinsons Walk for Life – 30th October.

This event is held around the Ashton Court Estate and comprises of a 1.5-mile and a 5-mile leisurely family walk around the estate to raise monies for Parkinsons. The Groups involvement is to assist with event and safety communications via radio communications

The Group are very experienced in setting up and running communications facilities over challenging terrain and many of our members are long serving. We have worked with several of the organisations listed above for many years now through several staff changes and our experience is always valued and appreciated when planning the events.

Cash at bank as of 5th April 2022 was £7835.87 in unrestricted funds. These funds are sufficient to cover the Groups registration renewal fees to the National Organisation in January 2023 of approximately £180 and to pursue investment in updating our repeater and radios. No other outlays are expected at this time. No specific fund reserves are set at this time as no expenditure is expected.
