Orphans Trust Project

Completion Report – Phase 3 & Overall Project Summary

This year we have successfully completed Phase 3 of our orphanage development project. The completion of this phase represents the successful culmination of our mission to build a fully functional orphanage in Uganda, providing vulnerable children with a safe, stable, and nurturing environment with opportunities for growth.

The following milestones were achieved:

1. Infrastructure and Essential Facilities

- Solar panels installed for renewable energy.
- Completion of a clean water well for consistent water supply.
- Finalization of electrical and plumbing systems.

2. Educational Resources

- Furnished classrooms with desks, chairs, blackboards, and teaching aids.
- Provision of stationery and educational materials.

3. Living Space Finalization

- Interior plastering and painting completed.
- Installation of dormitory furniture, common area furnishings, and storage solutions.

Project Completion & Impact

With the conclusion of Phase 3, the orphanage is now fully operational. At present, 28 orphaned children are living in the facility, each receiving:

- Full-time education, delivered through a structured academic program
- Daily nutritious meals
- Safe and clean sleeping quarters
- A dedicated play area, ensuring a balanced environment for healthy development

The transformation brought about by this project has already begun to reflect in the children's behavior, confidence, and wellbeing. The space now functions not just as an orphanage, but as a place where children feel valued, supported, and encouraged to build a brighter future.

Financial Transparency

As a charity operating on a 100% donation policy, we ensure that every pound donated goes directly to project delivery. No donor contributions are used for administrative or overhead costs.

While Phase 3 was completed successfully, it is important to highlight that donations did not cover the full financial requirement for this final stage. To ensure the timely completion of the orphanage, we responsibly utilised a portion of the charity's reserve funds. This decision was made carefully and with full consideration of our long-term commitments. Reserves allowed us to avoid delays and ensure that the children's living conditions were not compromised.

We view this as a necessary step to deliver the project to its intended standard. Now that Phase 3 is complete, restoring the reserve fund will be a priority in our upcoming fundraising efforts.

Overall Project Reflection

This project has spanned multiple phases, each building towards a facility that now stands as a beacon of hope for some of the most vulnerable children in the region. Collectively, these accomplishments represent the dedication of our volunteers, supporters, and donors who believed in the mission from the start.

Key achievements across all phases include:

- Construction and full readiness of a modern orphanage facility
- Implementation of educational and wellbeing programs
- Establishment of long-term access to food, safety, learning, and emotional support
- Formation of a sustainable care model supported by local staff






Projects:

Outreach

Project 1 – Somali Appeal

The efforts of our annual Somali Appeal have been greatly received in the regions in which we operate. Families are now able to look forward to a steady supply of food packages, a sense of stability that has never been afforded to them, until now.

Each food packages contains:

- 12.5kg of rice and sugar
- 10kg of flour
- 3 litres of oil
- 2 kg of dates
- 1 carton of pasta containing seven packs

In hopes of raising awareness of our recipients living condition, we aim to increase our donations to suffice the families for the month of Ramadan by providing each family with higher quality food parcels and larger portions. Reinforcing the foundations of our work, we hope to cement our roots and expand our outreach to more than two hundred families.

Project 2 – Yemen Appeal

As this was the organisations' first project in Yemen, we found it best to take a similar approach to our Somali Appeal. We were able to establish an independent group of volunteers that met our vigorous checks and parameters. Having a team with great local knowledge and expertise of the community in which we are serving, we were able to provide sixty families, who were in the most need with food packs.

Each food pack contains:

- 5kg of flour
- 5kg of rice
- 5kg or sugar
- 4L of oil

Project 3 – Orphans Trust

The long-term goal of this project is to create a global support system in which we are able to create orphanages in areas that are most deprived. While our priority is to provide, shelter, food, and an education for the children, unlike other systems we aim to uphold the development of young minds. We want to ensure they are able to be children and enjoy the throes of childhood, to do so, recreational activities and hobbies will be a strong constant in their day-to-day life. Our first orphanage was set to be built in Uganda.

To fully execute this plan, we began fundraising in 2020, unfortunately we were set back by the Covid-19 pandemic.

Despite a global shut down, our organisation was able to work remotely and this year we were able to start the construction. With our estimates we had hoped to house a hundred orphans, however, due to the drastic change in the financial climate after the pandemic - we found it more effective to implement the project on a smaller scale.

By creating an environment that accommodates twenty to the thirty children we are aiming to create a trust within the community and soon continue to build on a much larger scale.

Online Islamic Education

At Ribaah Ashatiri we believe our foundation is built of upholding Islamic knowledge and providing a method in which it is accessible to everyone. It has been a goal of the organisation to have a full-time salaried teacher because at present the sole teacher is on voluntary basis, but this has proven to be difficult as our funding is dependent on donations. Despite having interest in the role, having no marketing team has further limited the general public's awareness of the services provided by the organisation.

As an organisation we are immersed within our community and have a great awareness that many people are interested in the courses we aim to provide. As mentioned previously, without a marketing team, we are unable to increase our access to our target audience and in turn have a reduced number of students enrolling.

Hopefully in the next coming years we aim to provide consistent rolling courses, the key components of this goal includes a full-time salaried teacher and a marketing team. Securing these key components; the organisation will be able to provide the much-needed provision that the community are depending on us to provide.

Projects:

Outreach

As part of our humanitarian aid objectives, last year we started three campaigns to help those in need in three different countries: Somalia, Yemen, and Uganda.

This year, our Somalia Ramadan 2021 appeal proved to be successful again. We raised enough funds to distributed 160 food packages to poor families, one food package per family. Similarly to last year, each food package consisted of 12.5kg of rice and sugar, 10kg of flour, 3 litres of oil, 2 kg of dates and a carton of pasta consisting of seven packs. Compared to last year, we were able to feed an additional dozen families. Our aim was to give each family good quality food parcels. Next year, we aim to help even more families.

However, the other two campaigns, Yemen Appeal and Orphans Trust in Uganda, did not turn out how we planned. Despite restrictions for covid-19 pandemic being lifted, we were not able to complete both projects. We faced problems on ground where we lost our volunteers in the local area, we were raising funds for and operating in, due to covid. For this reason, we stopped raising funds and collecting donations until we were able to find new volunteers who passed our rigorous checks and proved to be reliable to carry out our objectives. When we were unable to find such individuals, we then agreed to work in partnership with a reliable UK charity so we could carry on with the projects and continue raising funds. However, we did not find a charity that was operating in the areas we were raising funds for. As a charity, agreed to stop raising funds and hold onto what we have raised until we are able to either execute both projects ourselves or find a charity operating in those specific areas.

Online Islamic Education

This is our third year providing free online live Islamic learning that students in the UK and abroad benefit from. Our courses and programmes have remained the same and students have progressed from foundation level to intermediate level. We still have the same students enrolled from the beginning of the academy as well as new students whom have enrolled. We currently still have one teacher who is offering their service voluntarily thus still offering courses once a week. The online academy is completely dependent on donations and once we get more funding, we aim to employ more teachers so we can run multiple courses at the same time and offer courses more than once a week.

Financial review

Statement on reserves

Our current reserves limit is £3500. This means any amount of unrestricted funds up to and including £3500 may be reserved by the charity, for the reasons outlined in reserves policy. We aim to only have an amount of reserves that is proportionate to what is required to continue our existing operations and respond to any urgent operational needs that may arise, in the face of unexpected financial implications. Income from any sources are principally used to further our charitable purposes and benefit those whom we work with. Our reserve limit will be adjusted accordingly as our work progresses, which will be reflected in our Reserves Policy.

Projects:

Winter Relief Campaign (2020)

This year we continued with the winter project for the homeless that we started last winter. We aimed to help more homeless individuals to get through this year especially with the Covid-19 crises and spread our work to different areas of London. To do this, we teamed up with Muslim Hands who supported our cause and offered us 250 covid-19 health kits and 100 winter survival kits.

The covid-19 health kit consisted of: five face masks, six alcohol wipes, a 90-gram soap, five vinyl gloves and a 100 ml Hand Sanitizer. The survival pack consisted of Sleeping bags, Survival bag, Socks, Gloves and Hat.

We have distributed the health kits and winter survival packs in the following areas of London; Leyton, Leytonstone, Walthamstow, Mile End, Bank and in the London borough of Newham.

Somalia Ramadan Appeal 2020

In Ramadan 2020, we launched a new project where we wanted to support poor and vulnerable families in Somalia by providing them with essential food which they can use to feed families and to break their fast with. This was our first international project. We targeted this country because Somalia was facing a severe drought that has affected more than 2 million people with food resources being scarce affecting many families. We wanted to support and help these families in such dire and critical time. In total we have helped and provided food packages to 150 vulnerable families.

Each food package contained

12.5 kg of Rice

12.5 kg of Sugar

10 kg of Flour

3 litres of Oil

2 kg of Dates

1 box of Pasta that contained 7 packs

Online Islamic Academy

We launched an online academy that provides Islamic education to enlighten others about the Islamic faith through the means of live courses that are structured and designed for progression in Islamic knowledge. The courses are provided free of charge as teachers have offered their services on voluntary basis. Providing the courses online has allowed us to benefit students across the UK as well as students from around the world. We currently have students registered from UK, USA, Canada, South Africa, Australia, Malaysia and Singapore

Yemen Relief Campaign

Yemen is a country that has been affected by war, poverty and famine and the people of Yemen are currently experiencing the world's worst humanitarian crisis and are in urgent need of help to ensure their health and safety. This year, our team has set out to help the people of Yemen, especially vulnerable families who find it difficult to provide for themselves due to poverty or difficulty in attaining food by handing out food packages, similar to our project in Somalia. We have volunteers working on the ground in one of the most affected areas in Yemen to ensure the civilians seeking help are being taken care of and receive our food packages.

Each food package contains:

5Kg Flour

5Kg Rice

5Kg Sugar

4L of Oil.

However, unfortunately, due to the unforeseen circumstance of covid-19 pandemic, this project has been put on hold until restrictions are lifted and we deem it fit and safe to operate on the grounds.

Orphans Trust Project

The orphans trust project is an initiative to build orphanages that provide food, shelter, education with workshops, social stability and health care so that young vulnerable orphans can grow to become confident and self-sufficient adults, giving them a positive start in life. The project is aimed to start supporting orphans in poverty-stricken countries and grow to operate globally.

The objective is to build a self-sufficient orphanage that has facilities like education centre, health services, centre for prayer and spirituality, dormitories and an outdoor sports and play area. A portion of land will also be allocated towards agriculture and farming to grow our own food.

Our goal is to equip young children with lifelong skills including communication, team work, problem solving, leadership, social skills and many more whilst also building on their self-esteem.

Our first project was set to build an orphanage in Uganda where we raised money to carry out phase 1 of the project; which is to excavate the land the orphanage was set to be built on in order to prepare the land for the laying of the foundation of the orphanage.

Just like the Yemen relief campaign, this project has also been put on hold due to the covid-19 pandemic until restrictions are lifted and it is once again safe to operate
